SUMMARY: HB 1092 adds a section to the Mitigation of disqualification for life section to allow reinstatement of commercial driver's licenses (CDL) that were disqualified for life. Individuals would need to complete a rehabilitation program, a driver's course, pay fees, and meet all requirements to hold a CDL with no specified convictions.

ANALYSIS: HB 1092 would establish a CDL reinstatement program for individuals who have served at least ten years of a lifetime ban. There are certain offenses that would make individuals ineligible for this program. There are additional provisions to revoke reinstatements if an individual commits another offense that would lead to a lifetime ban.

FISCAL IMPACT: For implementation of HB 1092, the Department of Transportation would require 3 additional positions at an annual cost of \$168,600. IT system changes would cost \$210,000. The costs to create the application, fact sheets, information modules, and updates to website would be minimal and would be absorbed. In total, HB 1092 would cost \$378,600 in the first year and \$168,600 annually thereafter.
