

PREFACE

In 1991, the Department of Corrections began the most extensive building expansion in the history of the Commonwealth in an effort to address the unprecedented growth in the offender population. This expansion will add 10,000 cells to the state prison system by 1996. However, the creation of additional cell space will not eliminate the over-crowding problem. Additional legislative and judicial reforms must be made before this problem can be solved. We need to evaluate who is sent to prison and for how long they are sent.

To assist with this effort, this report is to present statistical profiles on the 1991 state offender population, including specific details on offender receptions and releases. The report offers a limited historical perspective on offender profile changes from 1981 to 1991.

We trust this annual statistical report will increase your understanding of the state correctional system, its changing inmate population, and the significant challenges which the Department and the Commonwealth are currently addressing.

RECEPTIONS

RECEPTIONS

- Court commitments accounted for 70.2% of the receptions to the Department of Corrections (DOC) in 1991, while parole violators represented 29.8% of the total receptions.
- Philadelphia, Allegheny, Erie and Berks accounted for 60% of the court commitments to the DOC in 1991.
- The Department experienced changes in the type of commitments received during the 1990 to 1991 period.


Female court commitments increased by 7% for the period.

- -The percentage of female court commitments over the age of forty increased by 2.5%.
- -Court commitments for racial minorities (eg. Black, Hispanic Asian) increased from 55.2% in 1990 to 66.1% in 1991.
- The type of offenses for which offenders were committed to the Department have also changed during the 1990 to 1991 period.
 - -Court commitments for Part One offenses increased by 6% from 1990 to 1991. While Part Two offenses decreased by 2.7%.
 - Robbery commitments increased by 17.3% for the period.
 - -Third degree murder commitments increased by 57%





POPULATION

- The incarceration rate in Pennsylvania increased by 4.2% from 1990 to 1991, while the Uniform Crime Report (UCR) only increased by 2.8% during the same period.
- The incarceration rate in the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania was characterized by varied movement for the period.
 - -The statewide incarceration rate increased by 4.1% from 1990 to 1991
 - -Philadelelphia County's incarceration rate increased from 551.3 per 100,000 civilians in 1990 to 633.4 per 100,000 civilians in 1991.
 - -Berks County's incarceration rate decreased from 196.1 per 100,000 civilians in 1990 to 187.4 per 100,000 civilians in 1991.
- The Department's percentage of capacity decreased by 7.5% from 1990 to 1991 from 155.7% to 148.2%.
- The characteristics of inmates who were serving a life sentence in the DOC has changed over the 1990 to 1991 period.
 - -The number of inmates serving life sentences increased by 7.1%. There were 2,291 inmates serving a life sentence in 1991, accounting for 9.7% of the total population.
 - -Almost 80% of the inmates serving a life sentence in 1991 were under the age of forty-four. Over half of this group was under the age of thirty-four.
- The number of inmates who were under a sentence of death increased by 15.1% from 1990 to 1991. At year-end 1991, the Department housed 137 inmates with a death sentence.

GRAPH 4: INCARCERATION RATES FOR THE TOP TEN COUNTIES, 1990 VERSUS 1991



GRAPH 5: INMATE POPULATION VERSUS CAPACITY, DECEMBER 31, 1981 to 1991






RELEASES

- The total number of releases increased by 25.2% from 1990 to 1991 from 6,852 to 8,580.
- There were differences in the type of discharges from the DOC
 - -Unconditional releases decreased from 13.9% in 1990 to 9.4% in 1991.
 - -Conditional releases increased by 29.9% from 1990 to 1991
- The average time served for all sentences increased by 25% from 1981 to 1991 from 26.7 months to 33.6 months.
- The average time served for the twenty-six lifers who had their sentences commuted and were released during 1981 to 1991 was 20 years.
- Reported escapes in 1991 (n = 49) from the DOC were at the lowest point during the ten year span from 1981-1991. This is compared to a high of 112 escapes in 1983.

GLOSSARY

GLOSSARY

CAPACITY: The maximum number of beds a facility was originally designed for, plus beds added or eliminated due to conversions or additions.

COMMUTATIONS: A change of a legal penalty or punishment to a lesser one. A commutation for a lifer is the establishment of a parole date.

CONDITIONAL RELEASE: The release of an inmate from the Department of Corrections to another supervising authority. This method of release includes the following types:

<u>State Parole:</u> When an inmate is released to the community and is supervised by the Pennsylvania Board of Probation and Parole.

<u>County Parole:</u> When an inmates is released to the community and is supervised by a county parole board.

Reparoled (State): When an inmate is released to the community and is supervised by the Pennsylvania Board of Probation and Parole, after the inmate had been previously paroled and violated the conditions of the parole.

COUNTY TRANSFERS: When an inmate who is serving a county sentence is transferred to the Department of Corrections. The reason for the transfer could be for security or medical reasons.

COURT COMMITMENTS: A commitment imposed on individuals by a court to a state correctional institution.

DETENTIONERS: An inmate who is being housed in a state correctional institution at the request of another governmental jurisdiction.

ESCAPE: The intentional act of an inmate to leave the custody of the Department of Corrections. The act of escape includes the following types:

<u>Breach:</u> When an inmate in the process of intentionally leaving the custody of the Department of Corrections compromises the security perimeter of the institution.

Others: Includes walkaways that occurs outside the wall/fence while on work detail, work and/or educational release and furlough.

INCARCERATION RATE: The number of inmates incarcerated per 100,000 Pennsylvania civilian population.

LIFER: An individual who is convicted of criminal homicide and sentenced to remain in prison for life without possibility of parole.

GLOSSARY

MINIMUM SENTENCE: The minimum amount of time imposed by the court that an inmate must serve before being eligible for release from prison.

MAXIMUM SENTENCE: The maximum amount of time imposed by the court that an inmate must serve before being released from prison.

PAROLE VIOLATORS: Persons who have been paroled from prison and have violated the terms and/or conditions of their parole. Parole violators are generally classified as technical or convicted violators. Technical violators are recommitted for failure to adhere to the requirements of their parole plan (ie., non-reporting to agent or program, drug violations, etc.), while criminal violators are found guilty of new criminal offenses.

PART I OFFENSES: Offenses identified by the Uniform Crime Report which are of a serious nature and are usually reported to law enforcement agencies. Crimes identified as Part I offenses include: criminal homicide, forcible rape, robbery, assault, burglary, larceny-theft, motor vehicle theft and arson.

PART II OFFENSES: Offenses not classified as a Part I Offense as defined above

SENTENCED: Inmates who are serving time on court imposed sentences, as compared to an inmate who serving time because of parole violations.

UCR REPORTED CRIME RATE: The number of UCR Total Index Crimes per 100,000 Pennsylvania residents.

UCR TOTAL INDEX CRIMES: Offenses which are most serious and most likely to be reported to police. These index crimes are used as a standard for comparison Index crimes include: murder and non-negligent murder, forcible rape, robbery, aggravated assault, burglary, larceny-theft, motor vehicle theft and arson. Manslaughter by negligence is not included as an index crime.

UNCONDITIONAL RELEASE: The means of release for inmates who have either served their maximum sentence or have had their sentences reduced or vacated by the court.
