He also noted there was an auto 20 accident fraud investigation ring in Minnesota six 21 years ago, where they used runners to pick out auto 22 accident victims and bring them to the DC's office,

Chair Aukerman mentioned that some of the runners

made over \$100,000, but were prosecuted successfully and the ring ended. He cautioned everyone against receiving calls from law firms for sending patients.

Chair Aukerman noted there were discussions from many states on different regulations to make sure the regulations are tight to protect the public.

Chair Aukerman also noted there was a speaker on artificial intelligence discussing insurance and checking office notes for payments.

Chair Aukerman announced that the National Board of Chiropractic Examiners are going to build a new facility for the Practical Examination in Greeley, CO, and start testing there onsite instead of the chiropractic colleges. He stated no proctors will be needed because it is going to be computerized testing questions and practical examinations.

Chair Aukerman reported it to be the greatest technology for the tests and will no longer require an independent doctor reviewing the examinee. He believed they are going to test 230 some days a year, which will allow more access to testing for students. He also mentioned the National Board of Chiropractic Examiners shortened the written exam by 50 minutes by combining Part I and II testing.]
