Mr. Davis reported that 120 square feet as the minimum room size for massage therapists in the proposed regulation received some pushback, and the State Board of Cosmetology and State Board of Massage Therapy decided to roll it back to 90 square feet, which is reflected in the final-form rulemaking in § 7.150(a)(3)(ii)(A).]

   Public Comment
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[Aaron Shenck, Executive Director, Mid-Atlantic Association of Career Schools, referred to prior discussion concerning the federal rule called the Clock Hour Rule that would make many cosmetology programs potentially change their hours. He reported that the federal rule was delayed due to some court challenges and does not see as many programs changing their hours.

Debbie Eckstine-Weidner, Supervisor, DeRielle
Cosmetology Academy, referred to massage therapists
in esthetician and cosmetology salons. She noted
their law requires 60 square feet for an additional
person and asked whether someone who has a salon that
is 120 square feet and wanted to have an esthetician
or massage therapist would need 90 square feet if it
is a massage therapist.

Mr. Davis explained that the boards were concerned that with massage therapy being added to cosmetology salons that some massage therapists would be asked to provide services in a 60 square foot room because the cosmetology regulations currently say 60 square feet for each additional licensee. He stated the regulations are clarifying that if the "licensee" is a massage therapist that the room must be at least 90 square feet.

Anna Russo presented to the Board to addressed her concern with the Board not being able to resolve her issue within a reasonable amount of time. She also mentioned that she has done some networking and investigating, and it is not an isolated incident.

Ms. Russo referred to the new website and welcomed the change, noting it has not been functional over the last 15 years. She reported her case has taken over three months and has been handled improperly and unethically. The Board should not be collecting money from licensees if they cannot perform basic acceptable functions.

Ms. Russo noted asking the Board solicitor and director, along with leaving several messages, regarding how to file a complaint. She mentioned being told that the Board does not have enough resources, because they oversee so many people. She also asked whether there was a way to address concerns in a more streamlined manner or whether they should file complaints against every single Board member.

Mr. Hinsey informed Ms. Russo that her concerns about the reinstatement of her license have been addressed by the legal department of the Office of Chief Counsel for the Department of State, Bureau of

Professional and Occupational Affairs. He explained that any complaints about the process of how she was told to go about reinstating her license or a general complaint about how the Board of Cosmetology conducts its business can be addressed with Governor Shapiro's Office and through the Office of Attorney General.

Mr. Hinsey stated it could also be addressed by finding an attorney and discussing legal options for her and others similarly situated to her position.

Mr. Hinsey informed Ms. Russo that he cannot give legal advice about how to take legal action against the Board because his duty is to provide legal advice to the Board and not licensees. He also informed Ms. Russo that she could forward any other questions concerning reinstatement to the Board but suggested she speak with an attorney to discuss options if she is looking to file against the Board or any of the Board members.

Ms. Russo commented that dumping money into it was not her best option. She believed there were other ways to hold people accountable, including continuing to attend meetings and publicly express her concerns. She mentioned being told that there would be an investigation, and she reviewed the Sunshine Act, noting she provided the information

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within the time frame verified by a timestamp and whoever is monitoring the email failed to perform the duties of their job. She commented that licensees are paying into the Board and heavily regulated by the Board, noting the Board should also follow their own rules.
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Ms. Russo mentioned that the department is being handled poorly and believed it would be an ethics violation for any sitting Board member who is part of allowing the system to be handled poorly. She noted that a better way to handle it would be for the Board to voluntarily look at what is going on, recognize that it is not appropriate, and look at how to do better in the future.
