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        Mr. Smith reported a decrease in the number of
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   Bureau of Professional and Occupational Affairs
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   (BPOA) complaints for all boards and commissions from
   around 22,000 in 2022 to about 19,000 in 2023.
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        Mr. Smith presented the Prosecution Division's
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   Annual Report for the State Board of Crane Operators.
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   He reported over 3,000 licensees with 56 opened cases
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   in 2023. He also reported 55 open cases and 48 cases
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   closed. He informed Board members that prosecution's
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Mr. Smith addressed closed cases that result from discipline and reported 2 suspensions, 1 reprimand,

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and 1 fine. He noted the numbers are fairly close to 1 2 2022. He addressed cases where there is no 3 discipline imposed, including prosecution not 4 warranted and warning letters.

Mr. Smith stated warning letters are the most appropriate course of action when cases are fairly mundane, where the person does not have a significant discipline history or there may be problems from an evidentiary standpoint. He noted prosecution not warranted may involve whether prosecution can prove a violation and the strength of the evidence.]
