6 Report of Board Counsel - Regulations

7 [Ronald K. Rouse, Esquire, Board Counsel, provided a

Regulatory Report for the Board's review. He

9 referred to the anesthesia update at 16A-4621 and

10 general revisions 16A-4628, noting the Board adopted

11 an annex in both those cases, and the next step is

12 looking at a preamble, which he submitted for both

13 | matters.

16A-4630.

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Mr. Rouse reported the statement of policy on the use of botulinum toxin products at 16A-4622 has been put on hold. He stated Regulatory Counsel is reviewing the volunteer license regulation at 16A-4629 has been put on hold. He stated Regulatory Counsel is also reviewing the Civil Penalties regulation at

Mr. Rouse informed Board members that he is working on edits from Regulatory Counsel regarding the licensure by endorsement regulation at 16A-4635.

Mr. Rouse addressed 16A-4621, noting a copy of

- 1 | the preamble was submitted to the Board for review.
- 2 He noted the preamble states all the sections of the
- 3 regulations that the Board wishes to amend, as well
- 4 as providing the statutory authority for amending
- 5 those sections and a description of those amendments.
- 6 He stated the Board wanted to update regulations to
- 7 keep them in compliance with current standards for
- 8 anesthesia.
- 9 Dr. Jaspan referred to the third line on page 2
- 10 of the preamble, where in 2005, the Board adopted
- 11 guidelines published by the American Dental
- 12 association, American Academy of Pediatric Dentistry,
- 13 and the American Association of Oral and
- 14 Maxillofacial Surgeons to establish standards. He
- 15 suggested changing general dentists and oral and
- 16 maxillofacial surgeons to dentists, because it
- 17 excludes other specialties.
- Dr. Jaspan referred to the annex for the
- 19 anesthesia update under fees for dental hygienists
- 20 for the first year, starting April 1, 2023 to April
- $21 \mid 1$, 2025, noting it is a full \$50. He explained that
- 22 they would not have a license for a period of two
- 23 years, and it should be prorated because the Board
- 24 has not finished establishing it.
- 25 Dr. Jaspan asked whether there is a mechanism in

place to notify the Board the first time a licensee uses anesthesia because of the regulation requiring the Board be notified.

Ms. Townley explained that there is a process already taking place, where the Board is notified before they have anesthesia in their office.

Dr. Jaspan referred to page 36 under Permit II and asked whether suction and high-speed vacuum is redundant.

Dr. Funari explained that suction equipment implies tubing and suction tips, and the high-speed vacuum source is the actual machinery to create the suction. He recommended leaving those separate, because of the need for a fixed unit and portable unit in an office when they get into the regulation for the inspection.

Dr. Jaspan asked whether anyone with a Restricted Permit II is now mandated to have an EKG monitor.

Dr. Funari confirmed that it is mandated and further explained that a patient can slip from moderate sedation to deep sedation, and they always need to be monitoring to the next highest level.]

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Dr. Groody referred to § 33.103(c), where the Board is adding a clinical examination for expanded function dental assistant (EFDA) candidates, and completion of the candidate's education has to be within two years of taking the exam, which she fully supported. She stated, with the changes that are proposed to have the clinical exam through CDCA-WREB-CITA (CWC), she did not understand the wording of (d), where the exam scores are accepted for dentists and dental hygienists for five years after passing the exam.

Dr. Groody mentioned that it has always been a loophole that people have gotten through, where the candidate completed EFDA education 10 years ago, but since the Board's regulations did not say that there is a time restriction, the Board had to let the candidate in to take the exam. She asked whether the Board should consider if this will change because it is different.

Dr. Groody explained that dentists and hygienists pass their exam and then apply to the Board for a license, where EFDAs apply to the Board to be eligible to sit.

Mr. Rouse noted it to be a good distinction that when an EFDA is applying, they are actually applying

to sit for the examination and do not get certified until after they have passed that examination.

Dr. Groody could ask what the Commission on Dental Competency Assessments (CDCA), Western Regional Examining Board (WREB), and Council of Interstate Testing Agencies (CITA) are considering, because when they do the clinical exam, just like dentistry and hygiene, she did not know what happens with their written exam.

Dr. Groody noted they are not doing an Objective Structured Clinical Examination (OSCE) but asked whether they are still going to do the Pearson VUE exam. She commented that it leaves it open to confusion but did not have a sound recommendation, because they are different in the order in which they apply to the Board.

Mr. Rouse referred to prior discussion concerning the annex, where the Board normally has the written exam through Pearson VUE for EFDA, but there was discussion as to whether there could be a clinical exam because CDCA does administer a clinical examination. He believed the Board was talking about a written and a clinical, but asked whether the clinical would replace the written.

Dr. Groody still likes the written, but since the

written is not CDCA's, she did not know how it would work. She offered to ask them, but also recommended just creating a couple of sentences pertaining to just EFDA functions to differentiate from dentists and hygiene.

Dr. Groody referred to § 33.103(d), where it says they will accept scores from five years of the date of passing the exam. She noted that it is not for EFDAs, because they are going to limit their's to two years of applying to sit for the exam in (c) and need a sentence to support that. She explained that they cannot apply to take the test after five years, which is what (d) sort of infers.

Ms. Townley commented that they use the five years as a basis for review of reactivations and did not think they should remove it altogether in any way, where anyone with an inactive or expired license for five years would have to retake the exam if they have not been practicing on an active license in another jurisdiction.

Dr. Groody explained she was not asking to remove it, but to clarify and differentiate the EFDA language from dentists and hygiene because it is a different order in which they sit for the exam and receive the certificate.

Mr. Rouse confirmed the section at § 33.103(d) regarding examinations, where it says "Additional requirement. The Board will recognize successful completion of the dental or dental hygiene clinical examinations or the expanded function dental assistant examination approved by the Board for up to five years from the date the candidate passed the exam.

After five years, the Board will accept passing scores on the examination only if the candidate has been engaged in postgraduate training or in the practice of dentistry as a dental hygienist or as an expanded function dental assistant in another jurisdiction during the five years preceding application for licensure by examination. Otherwise, the candidate shall sit for and achieve a passing score on the applicable examination as provided in this section."

Mr. Rouse explained that the section refers to people who may have their license and practiced and then stopped practicing in Pennsylvania for five years, noting they will have to take the exam over again. He noted anyone practicing in another jurisdiction during that period of time would not have to take the exam over again, as explained in

1 (d).

Dr. Groody commented that the point could be met with adding the clinical component of the exam in (c) and then adding the language that was missing, that within two years, because they cannot wait five years from graduating from an EFDA program to apply to sit for the exam.

Dr. Funari referred to the restricted faculty license under § 33.119 and believed language should be inserted in the regulation that allows for nondental school-based, e.g., hospitals and CODA-accredited dental specialty training programs, such as oral surgery, general practice residency (GPR), facial pain, temporomandibular joint (TMJ), and anesthesia residents to have access to faculty licensing for staffing purposes.

Dr. Funari noted it is not clear in the regulation, because it keeps referring back to dental school or a faculty member in an accredited dental school and does not allow for other programs that are not dental-school based.

Mr. Rouse offered to look into adding some language because the Dental Law seemed to tap into that but was not clear.

Dr. Funari mentioned that the letter from the

Pennsylvania dental school deans a year ago were 1 2 looking for language. He referred to 63 P.S. § 121 3 regarding a restricted faculty license and believed 4 there should be language in there not allowing 5 practice in an intramural practice. He explained 6 that an intramural practice is basically a private 7 practice for the faculty member. He noted there might be a resident in there, but it is the faculty member that books the patient and treats the patient, 10 where it is almost a private practice. He mentioned 11 that it is a loophole that he did not want to see for 12 somebody with a faculty license.

Dr. Lugo commented that it is also called a faculty practice and does not have to be necessarily on the school grounds and could be a satellite clinic. He noted they could be billing at the institutional price as if the services were performed by a fully licensed dentist and becomes revenue. He mentioned the terms used could be faculty practice or satellite clinics.

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Dr. Funari believed it would be appropriate to allow somebody with a faculty license to work in a satellite clinic if it is still a resident-driven location, noting he has five of those where he works, because it is not based in the hospital and are

- 1 primary working areas for their residents but is not 2 an intramural practice.
 - Mr. Rouse commented that those are for educational purposes as opposed to treatment of private patients.
- Dr. Lugo noted that all those satellite sites and the main institutional sites would have been listed in that accreditation document if they are CODA accredited.
 - Mr. Rouse asked whether Board members wished to bring general revisions back in May for further discussion, and Board members agreed.]
