Mr. Rouse addressed Regulation 16A-4635 regarding

Analysis Form for the anesthesia update to complete

the rulemaking package.

- Licensure by Endorsement. He noted the proposed regulatory package was submitted to the Office of General Counsel, Office of the Budget, and Office of Policy and Planning on April 11, 2024. He informed Board members that the Office of General Counsel approved the proposed regulatory package and awaited comments from the Office of the Budget and Office of Policy and Planning.
 - Mr. Rouse referred to the proposed preamble for Regulation 16A-4628 regarding General Revisions. He noted making a few minor editorial corrections.

- There was a question as to whether other dental providers were considered regarding the temporary volunteer dental license.
- Mr. Rouse explained that the regulation corresponds with the statute that allows an individual to get a temporary volunteer license for no more than 30 days. He noted an individual can get one 30-day license or up to three 10-day volunteer licenses in a calendar year.
- Dr. Funari stated the statute was passed through legislation to permit people coming to Pennsylvania for projects like MOM-n-PA. He believed it has to be changed by statute and go back to the legislature, because hygienists may be able to participate.

Mr. Rouse noted adding that type of license category would have to be statutory, because the statute already allows for this type of license for dentists.

Dr. Funari noted mentioning at several meetings to expand the language in the regulation itself for nondental school-based Commission on Dental Accreditation (CODA)-approved postgraduate training programs concerning a restricted faculty license. He noted the Board has never had a discussion or concluded on that aspect.

Mr. Rouse believed there was a question as to whether the statute allowed for the expansion, because the statute refers to dental schools.

Dr. Funari asked whether the Board could pursue that and mentioned spending a good deal of time last year with at least one request for a license.

Mr. Rouse offered to run it up the chain of command if it is an issue the Board thinks is important in terms of expanding the statute to allow nondental school-based CODA-accredited postgraduate training programs.

Dr. Funari commented that general practice residency (GPR), oral surgeon, facial pain, and temporomandibular joint (TMJ) programs are outside of

a dental school environment.

Mr. Rouse stated one of the issues in the preamble addresses the restricted faculty license. He noted the preamble does identify areas the Pennsylvania dental schools wanted to address that were statutory in nature, which were inconsistent with the current statute but required a statutory change to address those issues and why they were not being addressed in the regulation.

Dr. Jaspan commented that Pennsylvania licensees are required to learn cardiopulmonary resuscitation (CPR) to be a volunteer and believed individuals from out of state should also be required to learn CPR.

Mr. Rouse referred to § 33.118, temporary dental license, where a dentist who holds an active license to practice dentistry in this Commonwealth or in another state may apply for a temporary dental license, which will authorize the dentist to practice in the Commonwealth without remuneration.

Mr. Rouse stated someone in the Commonwealth who already has a license is required to have CPR. Since an individual is required to have a license in another state, he asked whether those states are also requiring CPR certification. He noted the individual must demonstrate that the dentist holds medical

professional liability insurance with a minimum of \$1 million per occurrence for claim and \$3 million per annual aggregate.

Mr. Rouse referred to § 33(a)(3), where they must certify that the dentist is current on all continuing education requirements, and suggested additional language to include CPR.

Dr. Casey referred to a question with one of the volunteers, where an individual works in a hospital, the hospital pays for their malpractice, and that individual is not in private practice. He noted they want to volunteer in a different state and obtained a license but are under the hospital's blanket, not an individual coverage, so they cannot get the malpractice.

Dr. Funari explained that the legal department of an organization will provide a letter either saying that the institution is self-insured or the institution has coverage for providers with a certain insurance company. He mentioned that he had to do that for MOM-n-PA, where the legal department in the hospital handled it because he is employed by the hospital.

Report of Board Counsel - Miscellaneous - FYI - U.S. Department of Education - New Eligibility Rules for Title IV and HEA Funds [Ronald K. Rouse, Esquire, Board Counsel, informed Board members that new United States Department of Education rules related to eligibility to receive Title IV and Higher Education Act (HEA) funds will go into effect July 1, 2024. He stated the new changes may impact new students who enroll in educational programs that exceed the minimum number of hours required by statute and/or the Board's regulations to

Mr. Rouse noted the Board's regulations have particular hours regarding expanded function dental assistant (EFDA) programs. He also noted in addition to schools offering educational programs to prepare students for gainful employment in a recognized occupation, including those regulated by the Board, that they will be required to provide specific information to the Department of Education about the educational program and the Board's requirements for

licensure.

Mr. Rouse stated the Board is unable to provide specific or general legal advice regarding the new rules to potential students or institutions offering these programs.

Mr. Rouse encouraged potential students to visit the Department of Education's website at www.ed.gov and speak with their school or educational institution for more information about how the new rules may affect their educational goals and ability to qualify for Title IV or Higher Education Act funds.

Mr. Rouse stated educational institutions are encouraged to visit the Department of Education website in conjunction with their legal counsel for information specific to the institution and its educational programs.]
