19 Report of Board Counsel - Regulations

20 [Ronald K. Rouse, Esquire, Board Counsel, provided a
21 Regulatory Report regarding the status of current
22 regulations. He noted drafting the Regulatory
23 Analysis Form for the anesthesia update to complete
24 the rulemaking package.

25 Mr. Rouse addressed Regulation 16A-4635 regarding

1 Licensure by Endorsement. He noted the proposed
2 regulatory package was submitted to the Office of
3 General Counsel, Office of the Budget, and Office of
4 Policy and Planning on April 11, 2024. He informed
5 Board members that the Office of General Counsel
6 approved the proposed regulatory package and awaited
7 comments from the Office of the Budget and Office of
8 Policy and Planning.

9 Mr. Rouse referred to the proposed preamble for
10 Regulation 16A-4628 regarding General Revisions. He
11 noted making a few minor editorial corrections.

12 There was a question as to whether other dental
13 providers were considered regarding the temporary
14 volunteer dental license.

15 Mr. Rouse explained that the regulation
16 corresponds with the statute that allows an
17 individual to get a temporary volunteer license for
18 no more than 30 days. He noted an individual can get
19 one 30-day license or up to three 10-day volunteer
20 licenses in a calendar year.

21 Dr. Funari stated the statute was passed through
22 legislation to permit people coming to Pennsylvania
23 for projects like MOM-n-PA. He believed it has to be
24 changed by statute and go back to the legislature,
25 because hygienists may be able to participate.

1 Mr. Rouse noted adding that type of license
2 category would have to be statutory, because the
3 statute already allows for this type of license for
4 dentists.

5 Dr. Funari noted mentioning at several meetings
6 to expand the language in the regulation itself for
7 nondental school-based Commission on Dental
8 Accreditation (CODA)-approved postgraduate training
9 programs concerning a restricted faculty license. He
10 noted the Board has never had a discussion or
11 concluded on that aspect.

12 Mr. Rouse believed there was a question as to
13 whether the statute allowed for the expansion,
14 because the statute refers to dental schools.

15 Dr. Funari asked whether the Board could pursue
16 that and mentioned spending a good deal of time last
17 year with at least one request for a license.

18 Mr. Rouse offered to run it up the chain of
19 command if it is an issue the Board thinks is
20 important in terms of expanding the statute to allow
21 nondental school-based CODA-accredited postgraduate
22 training programs.

23 Dr. Funari commented that general practice
24 residency (GPR), oral surgeon, facial pain, and
25 temporomandibular joint (TMJ) programs are outside of

1 a dental school environment.

2 Mr. Rouse stated one of the issues in the
3 preamble addresses the restricted faculty license.
4 He noted the preamble does identify areas the
5 Pennsylvania dental schools wanted to address that
6 were statutory in nature, which were inconsistent
7 with the current statute but required a statutory
8 change to address those issues and why they were not
9 being addressed in the regulation.

10 Dr. Jaspan commented that Pennsylvania licensees
11 are required to learn cardiopulmonary resuscitation
12 (CPR) to be a volunteer and believed individuals from
13 out of state should also be required to learn CPR.

14 Mr. Rouse referred to § 33.118, temporary dental
15 license, where a dentist who holds an active license
16 to practice dentistry in this Commonwealth or in
17 another state may apply for a temporary dental
18 license, which will authorize the dentist to practice
19 in the Commonwealth without remuneration.

20 Mr. Rouse stated someone in the Commonwealth who
21 already has a license is required to have CPR. Since
22 an individual is required to have a license in
23 another state, he asked whether those states are also
24 requiring CPR certification. He noted the individual
25 must demonstrate that the dentist holds medical

1 professional liability insurance with a minimum of \$1
2 million per occurrence for claim and \$3 million per
3 annual aggregate.

4 Mr. Rouse referred to § 33(a)(3), where they must
5 certify that the dentist is current on all continuing
6 education requirements, and suggested additional
7 language to include CPR.

8 Dr. Casey referred to a question with one of the
9 volunteers, where an individual works in a hospital,
10 the hospital pays for their malpractice, and that
11 individual is not in private practice. He noted they
12 want to volunteer in a different state and obtained a
13 license but are under the hospital's blanket, not an
14 individual coverage, so they cannot get the
15 malpractice.

16 Dr. Funari explained that the legal department of
17 an organization will provide a letter either saying
18 that the institution is self-insured or the
19 institution has coverage for providers with a certain
20 insurance company. He mentioned that he had to do
21 that for MOM-n-PA, where the legal department in the
22 hospital handled it because he is employed by the
23 hospital.

24 Mr. Rouse referred to § 33.118(a)(5)(i), where
25 acceptable coverage may include either personally

1 purchased medical professional liability insurance,
2 medical professional liability insurance coverage
3 provided by the dentist's employer, medical
4 professional liability insurance coverage provided by
5 the sponsor of the volunteer activity at which the
6 dentist is volunteering and self-insured.

7 Mr. Rouse informed Board members that the
8 additional language regarding the CPR will be
9 attached to the continuing education piece.]

5 Report of Board Counsel - Miscellaneous - FYI - U.S.
6 Department of Education - New Eligibility Rules for
7 Title IV and HEA Funds

8 [Ronald K. Rouse, Esquire, Board Counsel, informed
9 Board members that new United States Department of
10 Education rules related to eligibility to receive
11 Title IV and Higher Education Act (HEA) funds will go
12 into effect July 1, 2024. He stated the new changes
13 may impact new students who enroll in educational
14 programs that exceed the minimum number of hours
15 required by statute and/or the Board's regulations to
16 obtain licensure by the Board.

17 Mr. Rouse noted the Board's regulations have
18 particular hours regarding expanded function dental
19 assistant (EFDA) programs. He also noted in addition
20 to schools offering educational programs to prepare
21 students for gainful employment in a recognized
22 occupation, including those regulated by the Board,
23 that they will be required to provide specific
24 information to the Department of Education about the
25 educational program and the Board's requirements for

1 licensure.

2 Mr. Rouse stated the Board is unable to provide
3 specific or general legal advice regarding the new
4 rules to potential students or institutions offering
5 these programs.

6 Mr. Rouse encouraged potential students to visit
7 the Department of Education's website at www.ed.gov
8 and speak with their school or educational
9 institution for more information about how the new
10 rules may affect their educational goals and ability
11 to qualify for Title IV or Higher Education Act
12 funds.

13 Mr. Rouse stated educational institutions are
14 encouraged to visit the Department of Education
15 website in conjunction with their legal counsel for
16 information specific to the institution and its
17 educational programs.]

20 Bill 2178 of 2024 Training on Implicit Bias and
21 Cultural Competence

23 House Bill 2178 of 2024, which would require implicit

25 applying for a license or certificate issued by a

1 health-related board and also require the Board to
2 promulgate regulations concerning the competencies
3 required and the number of credit hours necessary for
4 training. He noted the bill was introduced and
5 referred to the House Professional Licensure
6 Committee on April 3, 2024.]
