McNally, PG, President, welcomed new Board 16 members, John Luciani and Windsor Tracy. John Luciani and Windsor Tracy provided a brief 17 18 summary of their professional background and personal 19 history.] 20 * * * 21 Report of Board Members 22 [Lisa Peterson, PhD, PE, Professional Member,

23 addressed her attendance at the National Council of

24 Examiners for Engineering and Surveying (NCEES)

25 Northeast Region Conference. She reported 20% of

U.S. engineering graduates become licensed PEs at some point in their career. She noted NCEES provides cords for graduates to wear with their regalia at graduation who have passed the Fundamentals of Engineering (FE) exam. She mentioned that the Pennsylvania Society of Professional Engineers (PSPE) should be disseminating that information to the various chapters and will be passing that information to PSPE.

Dr. Peterson informed everyone of a \$5,000 scholarship provided by NCEES to one student in each state and Washington, D.C. She noted each state can be notified of their recipient if desired by showing interest in making any sort of communication to them.

Dr. Peterson stated NCEES is working on a Mutual Recognition Agreement (MRA) with the United Kingdom and Ireland and possibly Canada to streamline reciprocity.

Dr. Peterson discussed the foundation developed for NCEES, noting a \$7 million corpus was established with 4% spendable each year with the plan of adding another \$3 million to corpus this year. She mentioned that donations and gifts to the foundation can be spent in that year, and as the corpus grows through interest, 4% of the total corpus is available

for annual spending. She noted individual state
boards can make proposals to the NCEES Foundation for
grants, and applications will be available for
submission by the fall of 2024.

Dr. Peterson informed Board members of a motion at the Northeast Region NCEES Conference to form a committee to draft language for Engineering Technology Accreditation Commission (ETAC) degree acceptance since many states throughout the United States offer no pathway for engineering technology degree graduates to become professional engineers.

Dr. Peterson noted the motion was made by New York to form a committee and seconded by Connecticut, where it was unanimously approved. She also reported that she will be serving on that committee.

Mr. Hartman addressed his attendance at the state board administrators' breakout to hear what was being discussed. He reported a giant push for decoupling and the benefits on the administrative side to limit inquiries and phone calls. He noted states that already have decoupled are willing to talk with whoever is interested.

Mr. Hartman reported issues with licensees who are not returning calls or answering letters to state boards where they do not live and mentioned a

discussion of having their home state boards help get in touch with them. He noted a couple of states are already doing that as a way to help assist across state lines.

Mr. Hartman addressed the push to have administrators attend conferences and noted NCEES is paying for prosecuting attorneys or investigators to take part in conferences. He stated NCEES would like moving forward those spots for the state boards to have individuals taking them up on that offer. He mentioned those are two different positions that are funded separate of board members, and they would like the Board to send staff to attend conferences.

Mr. Szalankiewicz addressed his attendance at the PLS portion of NCEES, noting the colonial states managed most of that program. He stated NCEES has been trying to establish a national comity and is very difficult because most states all have their own state exam.

Mr. Szalankiewicz noted NCEES is also endorsing having different types of surveyors' licenses mapping and global positioning system (GPS) but suggested it would not fit with their Board. He mentioned the Board is independent and does not have to endorse them but can follow the recommendations.

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   Member, reentered the meeting at 11:30 a.m.]

   Appointment
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   [John Wanner, CAE, Legislative Consultant,
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Pennsylvania Society of Professional Engineers, presented to the Board to discuss how to get more candidates into the licensure track to become a licensed professional engineer. He noted many occupations and professions are struggling to find people. He commented that many people may be concerned that AI would take their jobs but assured everyone that there will always be a role for a licensed engineer to be in responsible charge of engineering work.

Mr. Wanner stated the immediate past president of PSPE is a professor at Wilkes University and brought to the board the issue of some of the obstacles of getting engineering students to take the FE exam. He noted there is the cost involved in addition to students not looking to volunteer to take another test at that point in their lives. He mentioned the importance of education and explaining why it is important to get into the licensure track at that point.

Mr. Wanner mentioned applying some years ago for an industry partnership grant from the Pennsylvania Department of Labor and Industry. He explained that the grants are specifically for industries to try to enhance workforce development, interindustry

collaboration, and reaching out and building bridges with education, etc. He thought applying for funding from the state would enhance their ability to move forward with getting more people into the licensure track.

Mr. Wanner informed Board members that PSPE applied and was awarded a grant for the maximum amount of \$250,000 in January. He explained the first part of the plan is education and informing students of the importance of being a licensed engineer, the opportunities it creates for them, and the economic benefits. He noted the industry and NCEES tries to promote it, along with PennDOT having incentives for their employees to get licensed.

Mr. Wanner noted having an advisory committee and being able to do this on a pilot project. He mentioned enrolling a number of universities throughout the Commonwealth, so educational materials could be distributed to their engineering students who would be eligible to take the exams, along with offering financial incentives.

Mr. Wanner stated one of the big hurdles is the cost of the exam and study materials, noting a good deal of grant money would be used to defray the cost to the students by offering discounts. He mentioned

that students will be reimbursed for exam fees depending on how many students enroll in the program.

Mr. Wanner noted there is a matching requirement for the grant, and PSPE is prepared to match, where they require a 25% match for what the funds are giving them, noting it is a fundraising opportunity for them as well. He explained that the funds will run through their 501(c)(3) Pennsylvania Engineering Foundation with the intention of asking the industry, engineering firms, and others that employ engineers to contribute to the program.

Mr. Wanner again mentioned it is a pilot program for a limited number of engineers, and the identifying programs are civil, mechanical, and environmental. He is hoping it is not a onetime opportunity, and the industry will support the effort and continue to reduce the cost for students to get into this licensure track. He provided samples of the brochure and a poster.

Dr. Peterson asked whether PSPE is able to go back to the NCEES Foundation to ask for one of those grants directly or whether they need the state Board to approach the NCEES Foundation.

Mr. Wanner explained there is a grant writer to submit the grant application to NCEES. He believed

any endorsement from the Board would enhance their opportunities to be successful with that particular grant application, because they are a member of NCEES.

Mr. Wanner offered to keep the Board informed of when the application is submitted, and follow up with the Board administrator as to whether or not there is a place for an endorsement letter or document to reflect the Board's opinion. He offered to provide the information immediately if there is something the Board can do in advance of the application being submitted but will otherwise just provide a time frame.

Mr. McNally thanked Mr. Wanner for the presentation.]

[Ben Brierley, Senior Policy Adviser for Politics,
Prosperity & Economic Policy, British Consulate in
New York, informed Board members that the New York
Consulate covers a region which includes the
Commonwealth of Pennsylvania and noted the importance
of an economic relationship between them and the UK,

24 while doing more to remove barriers to trade and help

25 businesses work out what is preventing the flow of

businesses.

Mr. Brierley addressed professional qualifications and looking at architects since 2000 regarding an agreement being forged by NCARB and UK's Architects Registration Board (ARB) to create a pathway for architects to have their qualifications recognized in the UK and vice-versa. He mentioned it was signed in the spring of last year, noting 44 jurisdictions, including Pennsylvania, have signed the agreement.

Mr. Brierley stated the British Prime Minister and the president of the United States signed the Atlantic Declaration. He noted the National Council of Examiners for Engineering and Surveying and the UK's Engineering Council have started negotiations on an MRA. He mentioned it is the first international agreement specifically on MRAs that the U.S. and UK have looked at together.

Mr. Brierley mentioned that part of an MRA's benefits is also sharing best practices, along with helping exchange the flow of information skills and expertise between the two countries, while safeguarding the public and the profession. He commented that this is the first-time engineers have done this and hoped the Board would be interested in

signing up when it is finalized.

Dr. Peterson requested information regarding how it was deemed to be equivalent to NCEES Model Law Engineer. She also asked when the language would be available for the Board's review.

Mr. Brierley was unable to provide those details, and NCEES or the Engineering Council UK (ECUK) would have to be brought in for those discussions. He mentioned there has been longstanding agreements on some of the educational side of things with the Washington Accord, but NCEES would have to weigh in on those things.

Mr. Brierley noted being willing to engage in some level of detail concerning the language with boards and would put the Board in touch with someone to have those conversations.

Dr. Helmke asked what he sees as a long-term time frame for actions or activities.

Mr. Brierley referred to the delegation in February, where they were trying to obtain a signed document this summer, which was mentioned in the ECUK press release. He believed it is a short timescale, and they will be engaging on that level of detail but could not commit them.

President McNally asked Mr. Brierley to forward

the press release to the Board administrator.

Dr. Peterson also requested information concerning their specific requests of the Board.

Mr. Brierley explained that he is asking boards to consider the agreement once the information is obtained, and whether there are specific items due to Pennsylvania laws or rules that would prevent the Board from signing up immediately.

Dr. Helmke commented that this Board is a licensing Board, not only of engineers but also geologists and land surveyors, and asked whether there have been conversations concerning the other disciplines.

Mr. Brierley did not believe so, noting he has been focused on architecture, engineering, legal services, and accountancy. He explained that his job is to spot opportunities and would be willing to also have those conversations.

President McNally thanked Mr. Brierley for the presentation and keeping the Board informed on this topic.]
