Miscellaneous - House Bill 2178 of 2024 - Training on Implicit Bias and Cultural Competence

[Jared Hinsey, Esquire, Board Counsel, informed Board members that House Bill 2178 is proposed legislation requiring applicants complete training regarding implicit bias and cultural competence in accordance with the continuing education requirements of health-related boards.

Mr. Hinsey stated the bill defines cultural competence as the ability to understand, communicate, and effectively interact with people of different races, ethnicities, and cultures related to health and the delivery of health care. He noted House Bill 2178 was referred to the House Professional Licensure Committee in April.

Nina M. Kottcamp-Long, LMT, NCMT, Coordinator,
Massage Therapy Program/Holistic Health and Wellness,
Harrisburg Area Community College, asked whether this
will be treated like Act 31, where training would be

electronically filed with the state.

Mr. Hinsey explain that the methods would have to be done by regulation, so there would be a regulatory process set up as to how the training and certification would occur. He further explained that House Bill 2178 touches on all health-related boards and then adds that the processes are to be determined by regulation in accordance with current board regulations.

Ashley Hernandez, MPA, Government Relations

Specialist, Federation of State Massage Therapy

Boards, informed Board members that FSMTB is

currently in the process of finalizing their implicit

bias course, and it meets all the requirements of

House Bill 2178. She mentioned that it will be
