   Regulatory Report - Regulatory Status Report
   [Thomas M. Davis, Esquire, Regulatory Counsel,

   addressed two updates to the Regulatory Status
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Report. He referred to 16A-726 regarding massage therapy in cosmetology or esthetician salons. He noted the final-form rulemaking was approved by the Board at its August 13, 2024 meeting and sent to the Office of General Counsel (OGC), Office of the Budget, and Office of Policy and Planning on August
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19, 2024.

Mr. Davis provided a further update and reported budget approval on September 6, 2024, and OGC approval on September 16, 2024. He stated, once it is approved by the policy office, it will be sent to the Legislative Reference Bureau (LRB) to put together the text for the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* and then hopefully published in the near future.

Mr. Davis mentioned that the Independent Regulatory Review Commission (IRRC) may have to look at the regulation as well but believed there is a good chance that it will be published before the end of the year 2024.

Mr. Davis addressed 16A-728, which would allow a certain percentage of initial education hours to be obtained virtually. He noted the proposed rulemaking was approved by the Board at its August 13, 2024, meeting and sent to OGC, budget, and policy on September 19, 2024. He reported approval from budget

Response Letter

[Thomas M. Davis, Esquire, Acting Board Counsel,
addressed the Veterans Affairs (VA) request for
comment and the Board's response letter. He
explained that Veterans Affairs asked for Board input
for defining the practice of massage therapy at the
federal level as it applies to individuals working

Mr. Davis informed Board members that it does not affect their licensees or any individual in the Commonwealth receiving massage therapy from a Pennsylvania licensed massage therapist. He explained that the response letter points out that the Board's definition and education requirements seem to parallel their own.

Mr. Davis mentioned that the letter had to go through the Office of General Counsel and a couple other offices, because the federal government entity is asking a Commonwealth of Pennsylvania entity to comment on federal legislation.

Mr. Davis informed Board members that the
