The Pennsylvania Board of Medicine is presenting a free CME course on Extended-Release and Long-Acting (ER/LA) Opioid Analgesics Risk Evaluation and Mitigation Strategy (REMS). This course qualifies as FDA REMS-compliant training.

Opioid abuse is considered a national epidemic and Pennsylvania ranks in the top 10 of states experiencing overdose deaths and overdose related hospital admissions. Studies have shown that health care practitioner assessment and management of patient pain continues to be inadequate while rates of misuse and abuse resulting in addiction, drug poisoning, and overdose deaths are rising.

The Board of Medicine strongly encourages all licensees who prescribe ER/LA Opioids to attend this course. Chronic pain is a major public health problem in the United States and has been estimated to affect up to a third of Americans.
