Report of Board Counsel - Regulatory Status Report - 16A-5336 Licensure Requirements - Final Preamble and Annex

[Jacqueline A. Wolfgang, Esquire, Regulatory Counsel, provided a draft of the final rulemaking for 16A-5336 regarding licensure requirements and licensure by endorsement. She noted the amendments are necessary to reflect the merger of the postgraduate training bodies for osteopathic medical school graduates and allopathic medical school graduates into a single accreditation system.

Ms. Wolfgang stated the amendments also remove the practical clinical skills examination licensure requirement because the practical exam component has been discontinued by the national exam provider. She noted the rulemaking also implements Act 41, which provides for licensure by endorsement.

Ms. Wolfgang informed Board members that the proposed regulations were published on May 18, 2024, and the Board received one comment from the Pennsylvania Osteopathic Medical Association during the 30-day public comment period in support of the proposed regulation.

Ms. Wolfgang stated the Independent Regulatory
Review Commission reviewed the regulation and had no
objections, comments, or recommendations. She
mentioned that the final-form regulation will be
deemed approved if the Board does not make any
revisions and the legislative committees do not act.]
MS. WOLFGANG:

I would ask the Chair to entertain a motion to approve the final regulation and direct regulatory counsel to move this final form through the regulatory process.

What that means is basically we will put this package together, and it is all drafted. I have a Regulatory Analysis Form ready to go, so within about a week after this meeting, we would deliver it, and it would get onto IRRC's agenda and hopefully it will be deemed approved.

My hope is if we can get the vote today that we can get this published before the end of the year.

Report of Board Counsel - FYI - Act 38 of 2024

[Ashley B. Goshert, Esquire, Board Counsel, informed Board members that House Bill 1490 was written into law as Act 38 of 2024 and would amend the Acupuncture Licensure Act to provide for title protection of acupuncturists and practitioners of oriental medicine.

Ms. Goshert explained that the law allows licensed acupuncturists from other jurisdictions to practice in Pennsylvania for the purposes of attending continuing education courses. She also explained that the law contains an emergency clause, which would allow acupuncturists from other jurisdictions to practice in Pennsylvania in declared states of emergency.

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        Ms. Goshert noted the law also requires

   acupuncturists to attend and complete 30 hours of

   mandatory CE during each two-year renewal cycle,

   where an acupuncturist who is licensed as a physician

   would do 9 hours as part of their 100-hour

   requirement for physicians. She also reported that

   first biennial renewal cycle and will require some

She explained that the Board cannot provide any legal opinions or legal advice related to this or

any other matter or any specific set of facts.

Ms. Turek addressed the current waiver request process. She explained that the Medical Practice Act requires good cause to be shown, which can include a statement of explanation from the supervising physician detailing the information, along with the amount of additional physician assistants that the supervising physician is requesting to be added, the

reasoning behind the request to add the additional physician assistants, and the additional written

22 | agreements.

Ms. Turek stated the requests are reviewed by the Board on a case-by-case basis, and the supervising physician will be notified by the Board once the

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decision is made regarding the next steps for
initiating any additional written agreements. She
noted requests can be emailed to their resource
account at st-osteopathic@pa.gov.
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Ms. Snyder requested confirmation that the requests could only be considered when they have a Board meeting every two months, because it is pulled out of the regular approval process and needs to be reviewed independently on a case-by-case basis by the Board. She mentioned that it may be a barrier to those providers.
