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Ms. Wolfgang informed Board members that she and Board Counsel worked on a response for the Office of Attorney General regarding the licensure requirements and Act 41 regulation. She reported sending the response on April 4, 2024, and the regulation would be delivered as proposed as soon as a response is received from the Office of Attorney General.]

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Report of Board Counsel - 16A-5340 - Conversion

Therapy Statement of Policy Final Preamble and

Annex

[Jacqueline A. Wolfgang, Esquire, Regulatory Counsel, addressed the statement of policy for conversion therapy. She noted the statement of policy sets forth guidelines that should be considered by licensees regarding conversion therapy on minors.

Ms. Wolfgang noted the Shapiro Administration and Department of State are strongly committed to protecting the rights and well-being of lesbian, gay, bisexual, transgender, queer or questioning, intersex, asexual/aromantic/agender (LGBTQIA)

Pennsylvanians, especially young members of those

communities.

Ms. Wolfgang stated Governor Shapiro is calling on the licensing boards to adopt statements of policy clarifying that the practice of conversion therapy may constitute a disciplinable offense.

Ms. Wolfgang referred to Executive Order 2022-02, which was adopted by Governor Wolf to protect

Pennsylvanians from conversion therapy and supporting

LGBTQIA+ Pennsylvanians.

Ms. Wolfgang noted Executive Order 2022-02 specifically indicates that conversion therapy has been overwhelmingly rejected by the scientific, medical, and educational communities, and numerous professional organizations have denounced conversion therapy due to its lack of scientific validation and negative and dangerous impact on the health and wellbeing of LGBTQIA+ persons and communities, along with the specific harm it causes to the mental health of LGBTQIA+ children.

Ms. Wolfgang stated, under the Executive Order, all agencies of the Governor's jurisdictions were directed to protect Pennsylvanians, including children and youth, from conversion therapy. She noted the Executive Order specifically directs the Department of State to discourage the practice and

inform the public of mechanisms to report licensed professionals who cause harm to patients as a result of practicing conversion therapy.

Ms. Wolfgang also stated a recent report by a national research and advocacy organization found that conversion therapy is practiced by licensed professionals across the country, including Pennsylvania.

Ms. Wolfgang provided information regarding the role of a statement of policy as compared to a regulation. She explained that a statement of policy is a guidance document and basically an announcement to the public of a policy an agency intends to implement in future adjudications. She noted it also serves as a notice to licensees.

Ms. Wolfgang stated any agency applying the statement of policy in a particular situation must be prepared to support the policy as if the statement of policy had never been issued. She mentioned that a statement of policy is not a rule to be used in an adjudication or a case. She explained that a regulation establishes a standard of conduct that has a force of law, whereas a statement of policy does not create that binding norm.

Ms. Wolfgang explained that the conversion

- 5 explains that being lesbian, gay, bisexual,
- 6 transgender, queer, questioning, intersex, or asexual
- 7 is not a disease, disorder, illness, deficiency, or
- 8 | shortcoming.
- 9 Ms. Wolfgang explained that the statement of
- 10 policy also announces that a licensee who uses
- 11 | conversion therapy on a minor may be subject to
- 12 discipline by the Board.
- Dr. Zawisza commented that there are other areas
- 14 in medicine concerning what practitioners are doing
- 15 and expressed a concern for those other areas. He
- 16 believed they were isolating one specific issue and
- 17 did not support the statement of policy for
- 18 | conversion therapy.
- 19 Dr. Litman referred the original study in the
- 20 Journal of the American Medical Association (JAMA) in
- 21 2020. He believed the intent of the statement is to
- 22 take a vulnerable population and allow those
- 23 individuals the ability not to undergo any kind of
- 24 treatments before being able to responsibly make that
- 25 decision on their own. He noted being in support of

the statement, because it is preventing anyone from engaging in any medical practices of psychological or physical conversion.

Ms. Snyder noted being in support of the statement of policy and mentioned the importance of putting statements out to licensees and the public showing Pennsylvania does not support conversion therapy.

Ms. Wolfgang referred to Dr. Zawisza's comments and informed Board members that she could put forth a statement of policy for other issues the Board may want to discuss that are of a concern to the Board.

Dr. Oline asked for clarification as to whether the statement of policy would prevent any kind of conversion therapy requested by the the minor or the parents.

Ms. Wucinski explained that the statement of policy is guidance. She noted the process will remain the same as it is now for investigating any complaint. She further explained that the complaint would be reviewed by prosecution and an expert to determine whether charges would be filed if the conduct fell below the standard of care.

Ms. Wolfgang clarified that it is not a statutory or regulatory ban on conversion therapy. She

14 mentioned the importance of considering the statement 1 2 of policy as sort of an outreach to the regulated 3 community informing them of how the Board would 4 handle a case. She noted the Department of State has 5 received information on some individuals practicing 6 conversion therapy in the state and wanted to inform 7 the public of the position of the Department of State and current administration. 8 9 Chair Bulger asked whether the policy 10 materially/pragmatically changes the actions of the 11 Board yesterday versus tomorrow, and Ms. Wucinski noted that it does not.] 12 13 MS.
