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Report of Regulatory Counsel - Status of Regulations
[Thomas M. Davis, Esquire, Board Regulatory Counsel,
provided a Status of Regulations Report for the
Board's review and an update on 16A-6522 regarding
early exam and continuing education (CE) for clinical
education.

Mr. Davis informed Board members that they have three active regulations at the moment and a possible fourth. He reported that the only one that has seen movement since the last meeting is 16A-6522 regarding early exam and CE for clinical education. He again noted it was published as proposed on January 27, 2024, in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*, which kicked off a 30-day comment period.

Mr. Davis stated the Board received one comment in support of the regulation and awaited any comments from the Independent Regulatory Review Commission (IRRC). He noted IRRC has until March 27, 2024, to provide any comments, and the Board will review any comments in detail at the next meeting. He mentioned

that any comments received have to be fleshed out in
the final preamble and then the preamble itself has
to be approved by the Board. He will provide a
better timeframe once all of the comments, if any,
are received.

Chair Potter asked whether there would need to be redrafting if they do not receive any comments.

Mr. Davis explained that it would require minimal redrafting if no comments are received but would have to redraft the preamble into a final draft that he could turn around almost immediately.

Chair Potter asked Mr. Davis to review the whole regulatory process.

Mr. Davis explained that two things need to happen with regulations when it comes to the published as proposed phase and the published as final-form rulemaking phase. He reported being past the published as proposed phase, but to get there, it must go through the policy offices, fiscal offices, Office of General Counsel, Office of Attorney General, and IRRC before it actually can be published as proposed. He also noted it has to go through the Legislative Reference Bureau (LRB), etc., and each of those groups take roughly 30 days.

Mr. Davis addressed a regulation that has nothing

to review or does not have any comments when it comes
to the final phase, where they can just look back,
and if it was fine for the proposed phase, the
regulation can move forward. He explained that a
regulation that took a while in the proposed phase
should not take much time in the final phase, but it
still has to go through all of those offices one more
time for comments.

Mr. Davis noted the Office of Attorney General (OAG) and Office of General Counsel (OGC) will most likely take 30 days, and then the Governor's Policy Office, and again would depend on how many comments were received from IRRC.

Ms. Grzybek asked whether the regulation takes effect when it is published in the *Pennsylvania*Bulletin as final or does it take effect in 30 days.

Mr. Davis stated it will take effect the day it is published as final-form rulemaking.

Mr. Davis informed Board members that licensure by endorsement under Act 41 at 16A-6523 is still in the proposed stage but is under final internal review and will most likely be published in the next few months.

Mr. Davis referred to the student in education program, noting it started as a statement of policy

and then became a regulation, and he would need more time look into that one.

Mr. Davis informed Board members of a correction when he mentioned four active regulations, because there are only three. The fourth one on the list is adopting the Compact Commission Rules but did not believe the Board would need a regulation for that one. He believed the Board could just reference that on the Board website and continue to work on that, and they are actively working on the early exam.

Mr. Davis addressed licensure by endorsement under Act 41. He mentioned that the Board is already utilizing Act 41 for licensure by endorsement purposes, where anyone who applies under Act 41 is being licensed as long as an applicant can be licensed under 41 regardless of whether or not the regulation is in place.

Dr. Campbell requested an update regarding the Compact Commission regulations and Physical Therapy Compact concerning the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI) background check.

Mr. Davis had nothing new to offer concerning the FBI background check.

Mr. Barrett also had nothing new to report but did mention work being done to implement it with the

1 Pennsylvania Licensing System (PALS) as soon as that 2 is fixed.]

4 Report of Board Chairperson

5 [Cynthia L. Potter, PT, DPT, Chairperson, informed
6 Board members that the Federation of State Boards of
7 Physical Therapy (FSBPT) redesigned their website to
8 make it more use-friendly, along with providing a a
9 number of new resources. She mentioned that not all
10 of the information for Pennsylvania was accurate on
11 the FSBPT website and noted a correction needed to be

made regarding the exam early, where there is still a waiver in place for COVID.

Chair Potter recommended having a system of their own or periodically checking to make sure all information related to their jurisdiction is accurate and to alert FSBPT staff of inaccuracies, because people do look at that licensure reference guide.

Ms. Grzybek agreed that it is everyone's responsibility and suggested alerting Ms. Roberts of any corrections, so one individual can communicate with FSBPT versus several Board members.

Chair Potter commented that it would be reasonable to have one point of contact to avoid any confusion.]

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[Arion R. Claggett, Acting Commissioner, Bureau of Professional and Occupational Affairs, provided an update regarding the Pennsylvania Licensing System (PALS). He reported nothing has changed since the last meeting, and they continue to review and score vendors.

Ms. Grzybek noted appreciation for Acting
Commissioner Claggett's efforts and Dr. Campbell's
periodic inquiries but commented that it is a long
process and can be discouraging.]

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Report of Committees - Education Committee

reported two individuals were approved for a third
attempt at the National Physical Therapy Examination
(NPTE). She noted two more were approved after the
agenda was posted that will be listed on the next
