   [Sean C. Barrett, Esquire, Board Counsel, informed
   Board members that House Bill 2200 is now Act 79 of
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16
   2024. He noted the bill was passed by the General
17
   Assembly and signed by Governor Shapiro, which will
18
   hopefully be a fix for the criminal background checks
19
   for the Physical Therapy Compact.
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        Mr. Barrett also mentioned Senate Bill 559 and
21
   Senate Bill 560 are now Act 83 of 2024 and Act 84 of
22
   2024. He stated the bills updated the definitions of
23
   duties of athletic trainers under the Medical and
24
   Osteopathic Medical Practice Acts. He mentioned that
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   they are not directly bearing on the Board, but the
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scope of activities sometimes align. He noted the bills can be found on the General Assembly's website.

Mr. Barrett also mentioned House Bill 1633
prohibits noncompete covenants entered into by
healthcare practitioners. He noted physical
therapists and physical therapy assistants are not on
the list of people defined as healthcare
practitioners and does not have any impact on the
Board or the licensees.]

Report of Regulatory Counsel - Status of Regulations
[Thomas M. Davis, Esquire, Board Regulatory Counsel,
addressed House Bill 2200, noting it is the
fingerprint background check issue that will affect
13 different boards at the Bureau of Professional and
Occupational Affairs (BPOA). He stated it will
require healthcare practitioners and PT applicants
under this bill to submit full fingerprints to the
Pennsylvania State Police.

Mr. Davis explained that the Pennsylvania State
Police will send it to the Federal Bureau of
Investigation (FBI) and then the FBI will provide the
state police with the results who will then provide
BPOA with the results. He mentioned that BPOA shall
not disseminate the criminal record history

information to any other entity, and it should fulfill requirements of the compact.

Mr. Davis stated it gives BPOA six months to put policies and procedures in place, and their Board will be getting together with the other boards to come up with a global solution. He noted the Act will take effect in 180 days.

Mr. Davis provided a Status of Regulations
Report, noting one update to 16A-6522 regarding the
PT Early Exam and CE for Clinical Education. He
reported it has received final-form rulemaking and
internal review. He explained that it could be moved
over to the Office of General Counsel (OGC) if the
Board approves and then hopefully be published as
final.

Mr. Davis reported a change between the proposed stage and this stage based one of the Independent Regulatory Review Commission comments. He referred to Section 1306(c) of the Act, where it reads, in cases of failure of the first examination, the application for licensure shall have, after the expiration of 60 days and within one year from the first failure, the privilege of a second examination.

Mr. Davis noted the same language was and is in the regulations, but when he drafted the new one to

essentially bring about the AAP and early exam, he deleted that, because it did not seem necessary based on the fact that FSBPT has a set schedule that falls within those parameters.

Mr. Davis informed Board members that IRRC said that they acknowledge that as of this date the National Physical Therapy Examination (NPTE) schedule currently fulfills the statutory 60-day waiting period, because exams are naturally separated by more than 60 days; however, if the NPTE changes the exam schedule to allow for more frequent testing opportunities, it could be possible for an applicant to take an exam prior to the expiration of the statutorily required 60 days.

Mr. Davis noted IRRC asked the Board to retain the time frame regarding the second examination from Section 1306(c) of the Act in the final regulation to ensure the test requirements from the Act are clear and easily acceptable to the regulated community.

Mr. Davis explained that the only change between the published version and the final version is that he reintroduced language that is already in the regulations and their act, so there really is not any functional change whatsoever between the proposed and the final and asked for Board approval.]

12 MR. DAVIS: 1 Based on the Board's discussions in 2 3 open session, I believe the Chair would 4 accept a motion approving the final-5 form rulemaking in 16A-6522, also known as the PT Early Exam and CE for 6 7 Clinical Instruction and AAP and directing regulatory counsel to 9 promulgate this final-form rulemaking 10 through the regulatory process. [Geraldine M. Grzybek, PT, GCS, Chairperson, asked Mr. Davis to review the next steps of the regulation.

Mr. Davis explained that it has to go through the Office of General Counsel and Independent Regulatory Review Commission. He further explained that the Independent Regulatory Review Commission reviews regulations on behalf of the legislature and will have the opportunity to ask questions, voice concerns, and then decide whether or not the regulation is in the public interest.

Mr. Davis noted the regulation, if approved, would then go to the Office of Attorney General for a final form and legality review, Legislative Reference Bureau, and then be published in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*.

Mr. Davis mentioned that the Office of Attorney General is given 30 days by statute to review the regulation and is deemed approved if they fail to review it within 30 days. He noted it may take up to

1 a few months but is hoping to have it published 2 sometime this fall.

Mr. Barrett addressed general regulations, noting the Board mentioned that they wanted to discuss future regulations or improvements at a prior Board meeting in March. He noted the Board discussed changes to the Act, but it is something that would be up to the General Assembly.

Chair Grzybek did not note anything that needed immediate attention but encouraged Board members review FSBPT's Model Practice Act and their Practice Act between now and the September 2024 meeting to see if any areas could benefit from some improvement.

Chair Grzybek noted that their professional association would probably be spearheading the legislative effort and have some very specific ideas on where to make some changes to the Practice Act.

Mr. Davis mentioned that BPOA does not discuss regulations behind closed doors or outside of meetings and asked Board members to review everything individually and have all discussions in an open forum at Board meetings.]
