3 * * * 1 2 State Board of Psychology 3 June 3, 2024 * * * 4 5 [Pursuant to Section 708(a)(5) of the Sunshine Act, at 9:30 a.m. the Board entered into Executive Session 6 7 with Jared Hinsey, Esquire, Board Counsel, for the 8 purpose of conducting quasi-judicial deliberations on 9 a number of matters that are currently pending before 10 the Board and to receive the advice of counsel. The Board returned to open session at 10:30 a.m.] 11 * * * 12 13 The regularly scheduled meeting of the State 14 Board of Psychology was held on Monday, June 3, 2024. 15 Steven K. Erickson, Ph.D., Chair, called the meeting 16 to order at 10:31 a.m. * * * 17 18 Introduction of Board Members/Attendees 19 [Thomas Leech II, Board Administrator, provided an 20 introduction of Board members and attendees. А 21 quorum of Board members was present.] 22 * * * 23 [Jared Hinsey, Esquire, Board Counsel, noted the 24 meeting was being recorded, and those who continued 25 to participate were giving their consent to be

recorded. 1 2 Mr. Hinsey also noted the Board entered into 3 Executive Session with Board Counsel to have 4 attorney-client consultations and for the purpose of 5 conducting quasi-judicial deliberations.] * * * 6 7 Approval of minutes of the April 8, 2024 meeting 8 CHAIR ERICKSON: 9 The first item on the agenda is the 10 approval of the minutes. 11 MR. HINSEY: I believe, at this time, the Board 12 13 Chair would entertain a motion to 14 approve the minutes of the April 8, 15 2024 Board meeting. DR. BRADLEY: 16 I'll motion. 17 18 ACTING COMMISSIONER CLAGGETT: Second. 19 20 MR. LEECH: 21 Dr. Erickson, aye; Commissioner 22 Claggett, aye; Dr. McAleer, aye; Dr. 23 Bradley, aye; Ms. Harrison, aye. 24 [The motion carried unanimously.] * * * 25

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1	Report of Board Counsel - Legislative Update			
2	[Jared Hinsey, Esquire, Board Counsel, informed Board			
3	members that House Bill 2178 has been introduced. He			
4	noted the proposed legislation would add the			
5	requirement to applicants and licensees of health-			
6	related boards to complete training regarding			
7	implicit bias and cultural competence in accordance			
8	with the continuing education requirements of the			
9	health-related boards. He noted House Bill 2178 was			
10	referred to the House Professional Licensure			
11	Committee on April 3, 2024.]

13	Report of Board Prosecution - No Report			
14	[Adam J. Williams, Esquire, Board Prosecution			
15	Liaison, had no consent agreements to present.			
16	Mr. Williams introduced new prosecuting			
17	attorneys; Patrick Greene, Berk Demiral, C.J.			
18	Restemayer, and Adrianne McClendon.]			
19	* * *			
20	Report of Regulatory Counsel - Status of Regulations			
21	[Jacqueline A. Wolfgang, Esquire, Regulatory Counsel,			
22	provided an update on the status of regulations. She			
23	referred to the continuing education regulation and			
24	noted the Board received two comments after the			
25	exposure draft was sent out on April 16, 2024. She			

1 hoped to move the regulation forward as proposed 2 after further Board discussion later during the 3 meeting.

4 Ms. Wolfgang addressed the Psychological Clinical 5 Science Accreditation System (PCSAS) parity 6 regulation. She noted preparing the Regulatory 7 Analysis Form and submitting the regulation to the Office of General Counsel, Office of the Budget, and 8 9 Office of Policy and Planning for review and 10 approval. She explained that the Office of Attorney General would then have 30 days to review the 11 12 regulation and then would be publish as proposed.

Ms. Wolfgang referred to the Conversion Therapy Statement of Policy, noting it would be published on June 8, 2024, so all of the Conversion Therapy Statement of Policies could be published on the same day.

Ms. Wolfgang addressed one comment from the Pennsylvania Psychological Association (PSA) for 16A-6317 regarding continuing education, noting they commended the board for mandating the 3 continuing education credits in diversity training for each biennium.

24 Ms. Wolfgang noted PSA expressed concern with the 25 Board's proposal to allow licensees to obtain 100% of

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continuing education through asynchronous distance 1 2 education and suggested requiring at least 10 hours 3 of synchronous distance education or in-person 4 continuing education. She informed Board members 5 that PSA supports the Board's decision to maintain 6 the carryover provision, which allows the licensee to 7 carry over to 10 credits per biennium and supports 8 the Board's decision to allow presenters to get a 9 total credit for their workshops.

10 Chair Erickson commented that he remains strongly 11 in favor of the proposed regulation and is not aware 12 of any research that indicates in-person continuing 13 education provides any benefit over distance or 14 asynchronous education. He noted it is his opinion 15 not to place a burden on people if there is no data 16 to support it and also mentioned that there is 17 nothing to stop a psychologist from getting 100% of 18 their credits in person.

Dr. McAleer agreed with Chair Erickson and believed it has to do with the licensed professionals accepting responsibility for their own education and ethical professional practice. He mentioned that any issues related to isolation needs to be recognized, along with taking some steps in further remediating that through engagement. He believed the regulation

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as proposed makes sense for the diverse population of
 psychologists in Pennsylvania.

Ms. Wolfgang commented that the regulation can move forward. She stated the Board is proposing the continuing education, but if House Bill 2178 goes through, the Board would have to incorporate that at a different time because it is a little different than what the Board is proposing.

9 Ms. Wolfgang addressed a comment received from 10 Salvatore Cullari, a previous board member and board 11 chair, expressing support of the changes and believed the confusion associated with the current regulations 12 13 could be reduced. He indicated the Board's 14 regulations have been a source of confusion for 15 licensed psychologists and even some Board members 16 for many years and commended the Board for proposing the changes.] 17

18 MS. WOLFGANG:

19If the Board is happy with the20regulation, I would ask for a vote to21adopt the proposed regulation and22instruct regulatory counsel to move the23proposed regulation through the24regulatory process.25CHAIR ERICKSON:

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9 1 We need a motion. 2 DR. BRADLEY: 3 I'll make a motion to vote on the 4 proposed regulation. 5 ACTING COMMISSIONER CLAGGETT: Second. 6 7 MR. Wolfgang, Esquire, Regulatory Counsel, 15 informed Board members that the Psychological 16 Clinical Science Accreditation System website was 17 showing the state of Pennsylvania already adopted 18 PCSAS as an accreditation. She noted reaching out to 19 PCSAS and clarifying that the Board is still in the 20 regulatory process.] 21 * * * 22 Report of Board Chairperson 23 [Steven K. Erickson, Ph.D., Chair, announced Dr. 24 McAleer will be presenting at the Annual Pennsylvania 25 Psychological Association Conference on Thursday,

1 June 13. He noted looking forward to presenting and 2 engaging with the public and colleagues.] 3 * * * 4 Report of Acting Commissioner 5 [Arion R. Claggett, Acting Commissioner, Bureau of 6 Professional and Occupational Affairs, informed Board members that e-licensure was enabled in the 7 8 Pennsylvania Licensing System (PALS) on May 31 for 9 licensees to be able to print their own license.] * * * 10 11 Report of Board Administrator - Application to 12 Request Approval to Sit for the Psychology 13 Licensing Examinations 14 MR. HINSEY: 15 Based on Executive Session 16 deliberations, I believe the Board 17 Chair would entertain a motion to 18 provisionally deny the Application to 19 Sit for the Psychology Licensing 20 Examinations at agenda item 5, Robin 21 Maria Alvarez, Ph.D. 22 DR. HINSEY: Based on Executive Session 6 7 deliberations, I believe the Board Chair would entertain a motion to 8 9 approve the Supervised Experience and 10 Application to Sit for the Psychology 11 Licensing Examinations at agenda item 12 7, Rabia Malik-Mian, Ph.D. 13 DR. BRADLEY: 14 I'll make a motion. 15 ACTING COMMISSIONER CLAGGETT: 16 Second. MR. LEECH: 17 18 Dr. Erickson, aye; Commissioner 19 Claggett, aye; Dr. McAleer, aye; Dr. 20 Bradley, aye; Ms. Harrison, aye. 21 [The motion carried unanimously.] 22 * * * 23 Report of Board Administrator - Application for 24 Approval of Corporate or Fictitious Names 25 MR. HINSEY:

Based on Executive Session 1 2 deliberations, I believe the Board 3 Chair would entertain a motion to 4 provisionally deny the Corporate or 5 Fictitious Name at agenda item 8, 6 Philly Somatic Therapy PLLC. 7 DR. BRADLEY: 8 I'll make a motion. MS. HARRISON: 9 10 I'll second. MR. LEECH: 11 12 Dr. Erickson, aye; Commissioner 13 Claggett, nay; Dr. McAleer, aye; Dr. 14 Bradley, aye; Ms. Harrison, aye. 15 [The motion carried. Arion Claggett opposed the 16 motion.] * * * 17 18 Report of Board Members - No Report * * * 19 20 Discussion Items - CE Instruction/Teaching 21 [Jared Hinsey, Esquire, Board Counsel, noted the 22 Board received a question asking which biennium 23 period to count continuing education (CE) credits 24 obtained by instruction or teaching between biennium 25 periods.

Mr. Hinsey referred to § 41.59(f)(1) of the 1 2 regulations, which allows psychologists to accrue up 3 to 15 of the required contact hours of continuing 4 education by offering either (i) a course in 5 psychology for regionally accredited college or 6 university if the course generates a semester/quarter 7 hour credit or (ii) a workshop for an approved 8 sponsor.

9 Mr. Hinsey noted the question specifically asked 10 which biennium would the board like to count the CE 11 credits for if that course or workshop falls between 12 biennia, keeping in mind the credits could be split 13 between each biennium.

14 Chair Erickson commented that it could be an 15 either/or in the sense that it could be counted for 16 one period or the other since the regulations are silent in regards to which one it would have to be. 17 18 Dr. Bradley expressed concern with difficulty tracking for the Board administrator. 19 She mentioned that an individual would receive a certificate of 20 21 completion on the last day of the workshop upon 22 completion of a workshop that overlaps the biennium 23 and noted the same might apply to teaching, where the 24 actual completion date is the date of completion of 25 the course.

Dr. Bradly also noted it would provide
 clarification to where it should fall and might ease
 recordkeeping for the Board administrator.

Dr. McAleer commented that the regulations are not exactly clear, and he is sensitive to the burden of the Board administrator having to track CEs because the previous Board administrator had to go back six or seven bienniums to track CEs. He noted being in favor of simplifying the process without violating the regulation.

Chair Erickson commented that the licensees are 11 12 expected to follow the regulations, and the burden 13 should not be placed on them if the regulations are 14 not clear. He also mentioned that the burden on the 15 Board administrator was an issue in the past, but 16 believed the Board would have to amend the regulation 17 if they wanted to have it in one period versus the 18 other.

Mr. Hinsey asked whether the declarative would be that the licensee can choose which biennia to keep that credit in.

22 Chair Erickson noted that to be correct.
23 Dr. Bradley asked whether the date of completion
24 would circumvent the ambiguity from the regulations,
25 so if the Board is defining the date of completion of

1 the continuing education or, in this case, teaching a 2 course, does that provide clarity in the absence of 3 clarity in the regulations.

4 Chair Erickson stated it does not because it is5 the regulation that needs to set the rule.

6 Mr. Hinsey explained that the regulation states 7 that a psychologist may accrue up to 15 of the 8 required contact hours by offering the course or the 9 workshop. He noted it does not say completing and 10 does not say in which biennia that must count.

11 Mr. Hinsey believed the ambiguity there would 12 possibly help in the future by some regulatory work, 13 but as it stands right now, if the Board is leaning 14 toward deference to the licensee, then he believed 15 the licensee would be able to choose.

Dr. Bradley clarified that an individual can earn up to 15 hours by teaching courses, but it is not that a course grants 15 CEU hours.

Mr. Hinsey explained that a licensee would provide the information to the Board administrator regarding the program they are offering at a university that year. He stated the Board would ask for credit based upon § 41.59(f)(1), where an individual would like that to fall under the next biennium when the course is completed or fall under

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1	this biennium when an individual starts the course.
2	Mr. Leech commented that the Board cannot
3	preapprove it either and would not ask to see the CEs
4	unless they were audited and would be when he would
5	see the proof and count it for whatever biennium.
6	Mr. Hinsey noted Mr. Leech would see it after the
7	courses were completed and then the licensee could
8	say they started it in that biennium and would like
9	it to count for that and then do something for this
10	biennium.
11	Mr. Leech explained that if the Board would split
12	it, he would probably have to see the CEs for the
13	previous biennium to make sure an individual actually
14	had enough.
15	Dr. Bradley commented that the regulations also
16	specify that an individual can only get credit for
17	the same course once every so many and asked whether
18	they would be able to split it because she did not
19	believe it could be split the way the regulations are
20	currently written.
21	Mr. Hinsey referred to § 41.59(f)(2), where a
22	clock hour of instruction equals 1 contact hour. An
23	individual course or workshop may be credited to the
24	instructor only once every 4 years. The hours of
25	continuing education granted to a psychologist who

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participates as a workshop instructor will be 1 2 determined by dividing the number of continuing 3 education hours granted for the workshop by the 4 number of instructors participating in the workshop. 5 Mr. Hinsey noted that is where the question then 6 occurs, if someone is teaching a whole course and 7 gets 10 hours of CE by teaching that course between 8 biennia.

9 Molly Cowan, Psy.D., Director of Professional 10 Affairs, Pennsylvania Psychological Association, noted the question came in as to where it could be 11 12 counted and referred to Dr. Bradley's point about the 13 completion date, where that might be December 5 and 14 so they have proctored a final in the new biennium 15 but did the bulk of the actual teaching in the 16 earlier biennium.

Mr. Hinsey stated he would not interpret the 17 18 split of a singular course as double counting the course but would consider teaching the same course 19 20 every year to then getting into the individual course 21 being accredited more than once per 4 years. Не 22 believed that splitting it would not run afoul of the 23 regulations because the individual course is being 24 credited only one time.

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Chair Erickson commented that the interpretation

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1 sounds sensible and is in favor of giving licensees 2 flexibility to fulfill the continued education. He 3 mentioned that the purpose of continuing education is 4 to help people maintain their confidence and the 5 Board should facilitate that as long as it is not 6 contravening their regulations.

7 Ms. Cowan asked the Board to summarize what was8 just concluded in terms of the continuing education.

9 Mr. Hinsey explained that the licensee would be 10 able to choose which biennia those credits would go to and noted the Board also provides flexibility to 11 12 split the credits. He stated the course would only 13 be counted once every 4 years, and they would have to 14 wait 4 years from the last biennia that the course 15 has been credited for before they can ask for credit 16 again.]

He mentioned that the Board 2 3 administrator may be interested in attending the 4 meeting. 5 Chair Erickson also mentioned there is a vote in 6 the Senate for a new Board member and suggested 7 keeping that slot open for the new Board member.] 8 CHAIR ERICKSON: 9 I make a motion that the Board approve 10 to send two people to the ASPPB Annual Meeting on October 30, 2024. 11 12 Is there going to be a second? 13 ACTING COMMISSIONER CLAGGETT: 14 Second. 15 MR. He noted the staff fellow stated the FDA 1 2 cannot investigate this further because they do not 3 regulate therapies and only regulate drugs and 4 devices for psychiatric conditions. 5 Mr. Hinsey stated Ms. Dear continues her letter 6 by expressing concern with minors being forced into 7 overnight reunification therapy camps and is requesting that the Board to investigate these 8 9 practices and issue a warning letter to the camps 10 regarding certain unethical and harmful practices. 11 Mr. Hinsey noted Ms. Dear urged the Board to take 12 steps in addressing these overnight camps by 13 investigating them, providing them resources, 14 collaborating with them, and issuing warning letters, 15 but did not provide any examples or specifics of 16 where and when these camps are occurring.] * * * 17 18 Correspondence 19 MR.
