He could not reveal the vendor at 11 this time, because the contract was not fully signed. 12 He reported having a timeline in place and will begin 13 conversations with the vendor after Labor Day 2024. 14 He further explained that the full transition was not expected to happen until 2025 and would have 15 16 additional information in the fall.] \* \* \* 17 18 Report of Board Administrator - Application to 19 Request Approval to Sit for the Psychology 20 Licensing Examinations 21 MR. 1 Psychology (EPPP) will be one examination with two 2 parts, EPPP-1 knowledge and EPPP-2 skills. 3 Mr. Jared stated ASPPB intends to offer the 4 examination as a single fee two-day administration 5 with the two days occurring within a 30-day period. 6 He reported that ASPPB is working on finalizing the 7 details and will have additional details by the end of September 2024. 8 9 Vice Chair McAleer commented that there continues 10 to be some concern among practitioners in 11 Pennsylvania regarding the whole concept behind the Part 2 skills-based assessment. He stated the Board 12 13 is aware and sensitive to the concerns of the 14 practicing community and general public. The Board 15 will continue to stay in communication to fully 16 understand the nature of the progress to assure an 17 easy conversion.] 18 \* \* \* 19 Correspondence VICE CHAIR MCALEER: 20 21 Item 9 is a request from Deon Allen, 22 Ph.D., who is requesting EPPP 23 Accommodations due to an underlying 24 issue. 25 I believe the Board will entertain

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1 a motion to deny his request. Do I 2 hear any discussion about this? 3 Hearing none. 4 I would entertain a motion for the 5 Board to provisionally deny the 6 request. 7 MS. HARRISON: 8 I'll make a motion. 9 DR. ZEHRUNG: 10 Second. 11 MR. LEECH: 12 Dr. McAleer, aye; Deputy Commissioner 13 Eaton, aye; Dr. Zehrung, aye; Ms. 14 Harrison, aye. 15 [The motion carried unanimously.] \* \* \* 16 17 Correspondence - ASPPB - APA D42 Survey 18 [Jared Hinsey, Esquire, Board Counsel, noted the Board received a letter from the ASPPB Division 42 19 20 Advocacy Committee seeking to understand how current 21 practitioners perceive the potential change to allow 22 the licensure for master's-level practitioners in 23 psychology to practice independently. 24 Mr. Hinsey provided the website address at 25 www.surveymonkey.com. He also informed anyone who

would like a written copy to contact the Board and 1 2 also offered to provide a copy in chat.] 3 \* \* \* 4 Correspondence - ASPPB - APA D42 Survey 5 [Jared Hinsey, Esquire, Board Counsel, also noted 6 receiving correspondence from the ASPPB concerning 7 potential regulatory implications of master's-level 8 licensure. He stated ASPPB has formed a Potential 9 Regulatory Implications of Master's Licensure (PRI-10 LM) Task Force. He mentioned that the information is 11 available for public comment at www.asppb.net under PRI-LM Task Force. 12 13 Vice Chair McAleer reported on a number of 14 comments at the Pennsylvania Psychological 15 Association's Convention regarding new master's-level 16 licensure and issues around the adequacy of training, 17 titles that would be used, and the scope of practice. 18 Vice Chair McAleer stated it is above and beyond 19 the purview of the Board to make any comments, 20 because it would require a change in the law in 21 Pennsylvania.] 22 \* \* \* 23 Correspondence - EPPP-2 - Proposed ASPPB Amendment 24 [Jared Hinsey, Esquire, Board Counsel, informed Board 25 members that there will be a vote to amend Article IV

14

of ASPPB bylaws to add Subsection (c) and (d) during 1 2 ASPPB's Annual Meeting in Dallas, TX, October 30, 2024. He explained that Subsection (c) would state 3 that no member jurisdiction shall be required, 4 5 whether as a condition of membership or otherwise, to 6 participate or utilize any services or programs 7 offered by the association. The association shall 8 not make access or availability of a service or 9 program contingent or member jurisdiction 10 participating or utilizing another service or 11 program.

12 Mr. Hinsey also noted Subsection (d) would state 13 that the association may offer multiple exams as part 14 of its examination program. At a minimum, the 15 association shall offer a knowledge-based exam 16 separate from any skill-based exam. Each exam 17 offered by the association must be administered on a 18 single occasion. For purpose of this subsection, 19 multiple consecutive days of exam administration may 20 constitute a single occasion. The association may 21 recommend, but shall not require qualifications to 22 sit for an exam, timing for administration of exam, 23 and passing scores.] \* \* \* 24 25 New Business

1 [Donald McAleer, Psy.D., Vice Chair, requested the 2 Board's presentation at the 2025 PPA Convention be 3 placed on the agenda for the October meeting.] \* \* \* 4 5 Upcoming Meeting Dates [Donald McAleer, Psy.D., Vice Chair, noted the 6 7 remaining 2024 meeting dates are October 7 and December 2. He also noted 2025 Board meeting dates 8 9 are February 10, April 14, June 16, August 18, 10 October 20, and December 15.] \* \* \* 11 12 Adjournment 13 VICE CHAIR MCALEER: 14 I entertain a motion to close the 15 meeting.
