8 Report of Regulatory Counsel

9 | [Marc Farrell, Esquire, Regulatory Counsel, Office of

10 Chief Counsel, Department of State, noted the

11 | Commission continues to have three open regulatory

12 matters. He stated 16A-5626 regarding broker price

13 opinions is currently with the Independent Regulatory

14 Review Commission (IRRC) and was published for

15 comment.

Mr. Farrell noted they received one supportive

17 comment from the Pennsylvania Association of Realtors

18 (PAR). He mentioned that the Independent Regulatory

19 Review Commission's comments are due July 17, 2024,

20 and will be discussed at a future meeting. He

21 reported no change or advancement to Act 41 licensure

22 by endorsement because they have been focused on the

23 general revisions package.

24 Mr. Farrell informed Commission members that

25 there are three main components to any rulemaking or

2.0

regulatory package. He explained that the annex is the regulatory language that they are changing interspersed with additions and deletions. He noted the preamble is the narrative that explains what the changes are and why they are making the changes. also noted the Regulatory Analysis Form (RAF) is a long and very technical document IRRC requires for every regulation.

Mr. Farrell explained that boards and commissions only have to approve the annex and the preamble. He noted an annex and preamble for the general revisions were prepared but not ready to be put on the meeting agenda. He mentioned the Commission has never been presented with or approved a preamble. He noted the Board did approve an exposure draft of an annex in June 2021.

Mr. Farrell informed Commission members that he incorporated all of the changes they have been working on, along with the comments they received, mostly from PAR. He mentioned there were a number of areas where the wishes of the Commission was not clear from either the minutes or prior counsel documentation.

Mr. Farrell offered to send the annex and preamble next week for Commission members to review

for the August 20 meeting, along with a list of
things that are unclear. He explained the annex from
a formatting standpoint, where new language is
underlined in blue and that cross outs in red
brackets will be deleted.

- Mr. Farrell noted the Commission could prepare for discussion and a possible vote on the annex and preamble at the August 20 meeting. He explained that they are at the beginning of the formal process and that every regulation goes through two phases.
- Mr. Farrell further explained that it starts out as proposed, where they get comments from the public, IRRC, and legislature, and then goes through the final rulemaking statement, which is basically doing it all over again.
- Mr. Farrell stated certain things kick in once they get the regulation into the system and send it to the Governor' Office of the Budget, Office of Policy and Planning, and Office of General Counsel.
- Ms. Rubin asked whether there was an opportunity in the process for the Commission to tweak or change anything because the regulations were started around six years ago and need revised again.
- Mr. Farrell explained that it is up to the Commission to decide and mentioned they could do

another regulation package in the future.

Ms. Rubin commented that some of the new Commissioners have not seen what they have done and asked whether everything being proposed could be placed in a format for all of the Commissioners.

Mr. Farrell mentioned that the annex will present that information and that there are five members who approved the exposure draft in June 2021 who are still members of the Commission. He explained that the annex, in combination with the preamble, will sort of tell the story of what the Commission is trying to do.]

- 9 Acting Commissioner Claggett informed everyone
- 10 that the October meeting will be held at Temple
- 11 University in a hybrid format and that the final

- 14 Public Comment
- 15 [Michael McGee, CAE, Chief Executive Officer,
- 16 | Pennsylvania Association of Realtors, informed
- 17 | Commission members that Senate Bill 1173 passed the
- 18 House and Senate and was signed by Governor Shapiro.
- 19 He explained that Senate Bill 1173 amends the Real
- 20 Estate Licensing Registration Act to define wholesale
- 21 transaction and requires those who conduct
- 22 transactions to obtain a real estate salesperson's
- 23 license.
- 24 Mr. McGee further explained that the legislation
- 25 also requires specific disclosures in wholesale

transactions and that the new law will ensure that those engaging in residential wholesale complete prelicensing education requirements and be associated with a broker who will provide oversight and bear the responsibility for their actions.

Mr. McGee stated the deadlines regarding the National Association of Realtors Settlement Agreement are fast approaching. He reported the new National Association of Realtors (NAR) Multiple Listing Service (MLS) policy changes need to be implemented by August 17, which will eliminate and prohibit any requirement of offers of compensation through the MLS between listing brokers or sellers to buyer brokers or other buyer representatives.

Mr. McGee noted that the Pennsylvania Association of Realtors Standard Forms Committee and appointed task force have made recommended changes to around 25 of their standard forms to reflect those industry changes. He mentioned that the draft revised forms are posted on their website and that PAR has also hosted a broker webinar to explain how the new rules might affect brokerages and what they need to consider navigating those changes.

Mr. McGee also mentioned that PAR has a number of salesperson training sessions planned over the next

1 several months. He noted the main changes have added

- 2 some additional flexibility and clarity regarding
- 3 fees for real estate transactions, which is going to
- 4 | mean some changes in how listing and buyer agency
- 5 fees are explained. He also noted some updates to
- 6 how seller assist, now referred to as seller
- 7 | concessions, would be explained to the parties and
- 8 negotiated between them.
- 9 Mr. McGee asked whether the Commission has any
- 10 data on the number of licensees who renewed as part
- 11 of the last renewal cycle and how long it takes for
- 12 reactivation when a licensee did not renew at the
- 13 deadline. He also asked whether they have any
- 14 information on when they will begin the audit process
- 15 for testing on the continuing education (CE). He
- 16 commented that it is helpful for PAR to be prepared
- 17 because they often receive calls from their members
- 18 when the Bureau begins the audits.]
