Mr. Fritsch stated it was not necessarily activity that requires a license, but the individual in this case was licensed as a salesperson and is part of their job duties. He explained that ordering

- 1 | merchandise is sort of incorporated into the Real
- 2 Estate Law through the Cemetery and Funeral
- 3 Merchandise Trust Fund Law, which requires a certain
- 4 amounts of money for merchandise to be placed in
- 5 escrow.
- 6 Mr. Saxton asked whether this was a preneeded
- 7 | trust item or an at-need item for somebody who had
- 8 | already passed away.
- 9 Mr. Fritsch believed the item to be an at-need
- 10 | item and not something subject to that law but would
- 11 still be part of the employee's job and relates to
- 12 their function as a salesperson.
- 13 Mr. Saxton asked whether an individual who did
- 14 | not have a license and did not order the grave
- 15 markers would be fined.
- 16 Mr. Fritsch did not think the individual would be
- 17 subject to the jurisdiction of the Real Estate
- 18 Commission because they would not be engaging in
- 19 activities that require a license.
- 20 Ms. Solomon noted the employee was routinely not
- 21 ordering markers after taking consumer money and is
- 22 being held to a higher standard than a layperson
- 23 because she has that privilege and designation.]

Mr. Perry stated the Pennsylvania Association of Realtors has a sexual harassment policy in place and would be reexamining the policy and procedures to ensure necessary steps are in place to respond to any complaints. He mentioned that PAR is also committed to creating a welcoming, safe, inclusive, and respectful environment for work staff and volunteers.

Mr. Perry informed Commission members that one of the pending lawsuits addressing buyer agency compensation is headed to trial next month.

Mr. Perry mentioned that the cases allege commission rates are too high, buyer brokers are being paid too much, and the National Association of Realtors Code of Conduct and Multiple Listing Service (MLS) Handbook, along with the corporate defendant practices, lead to price fixing.

Mr. Perry stated the National Association of Realtors and the corporate defendants adamantly disagree with the claims and believe NAR rules are very intentionally pro-consumer and pro-competitive. He reported Anywhere Real Estate, formerly known as Realogy, and RE/MAX settled with the plaintiffs in September but no details have been released.

Mr. Perry noted there are ongoing discussions
