22 | Counseling Compact enabling legislation.

23 Chair Santiago asked what enabling means for

24 House Bill 1841 and House Bill 2300.

25 Mr. Barrett explained that each state has to pass

legislation that puts the state into the compact,
where the legislation lets them join the compact and
set up a framework for the compact within their
state.

Chair Santiago also asked who is making this happen for the Social Work Compact and the Counseling Compact.

Mr. Barrett explained that a bill can be introduced by one or two representatives but does not mean there is broad support behind it. He stated the bills were introduced by a member of the House and then is introduced to committee and considered within the committee.

Mr. Barrett further explained that after the House passes the bill that it would need a similar resolution from the Senate and then the governor would also have to sign off on the bill for it to become law. He mentioned that they typically get requests from the governor for a bill analysis, which means the bill may be moving. He believed the Social Work Compact was introduced in November and the Counseling Compact to be a more recent introduction.]

3 Regulatory Report - Act 4 of 2024 - PA General

4 Assembly

5 | [Sean C. Barrett, Esquire, Board Counsel, informed

6 Board members that he met with Ms. Wolfgang to

7 discuss the Act 4 regulation. He stated Act 4 gave

the Board the ability to require continuing education

9 (CE) as a condition of license renewal for the

10 associate license, but the Board had a question as to

11 | whether CE was appropriate because no CE is required

12 | for anyone undergoing supervised experience.

13 Mr. Barrett mentioned that Ms. Wolfgang suggested

the Board have the child abuse CE and suicide

15 prevention CE.

14

16 Mr. DeCriscio commented that a licensed associate

17 | counselor (LAC) should be required to meet the same

18 | CE requirements as a licensed professional counselor

19 (LPC) biennially.

20 Mr. Barrett noted that an LAC is always

21 undergoing continuing education training by being

22 | supervised and pointed out that it could be a number

23 of hours tacked on to the existing licensed counselor

24 requirements but did not know the practical effect of

25 someone being supervised and whether that is going to

dilute their ability to accomplish those hours in a more efficient manner or what sort of burden that would add.

Mr. DeCriscio did not believe it would be any more burdensome to them than LPCs in terms of continuing education and maybe could be after three years of earning their LAC to complete a certain amount of acquired continuing education units (CEUs).

Mr. Barrett explained that the easiest way may be to tack the LAC license onto their continuing education regulations, so it is not a separate CE for just the LACs or family therapists and would discuss it with Ms. Wolfgang.

Mr. Barrett referred to the statutory fees, noting the Budget Office usually determines the appropriate fee and may have an update in the upcoming months.

Mr. Barrett mentioned that the focus of Act 4 is the supervision plan, including a detailed job description and location where client contact and supervision will occur. He noted that could be defined in the regulations as to what the Board would like to include in the supervision plan.

Chair Santiago commented that the detailed job description is for the person who is the LAC.

Mr. Barrett explained that it is the detailed job description of what they will be doing at the supervised location, as well as the location where client contact under supervision will occur, and not the supervisor's job description.

Chair Santiago asked whether it would be important to add original paperwork when someone is a supervisor to folks applying for an LAC so LACs understand it is 1500 hours with an LPC and 1500 hours with a related field. She believed that should also be part of the supervision plan, so people do not think someone could supervise them when they cannot.

Mr. Barrett commented that there will probably be some sort of form at the end of it once the regulations are hashed out. He referred to another section in Act 4 that says an associate, marriage and family therapist, and counselor at the related section, where it is under the supervision of a licensed supervisor acceptable to the Board and in accordance with the Board's regulation.

Mr. Barrett mentioned that they might have to flush that out or may be done through their current regulations by modifying them a little bit to read cleaner with the LAC and the licensed associate

marriage and family therapist (LAMFT) license to make it fit. He mentioned that they are currently using the regulatory framework for supervisors.

Ms. McNeill stated applicants who have only identified as currently having a clinical social worker supervisor provide a statement that they understand they must have 1500 hours under a licensed professional counselor as defined in § 49.31.

Mr. Barrett asked whether there is anything they need to specifically include other than what is statutorily listed. He mentioned that telling people whether or not they need different supervision for the last half is good and was not sure whether they can put that anywhere at this point other than correctly letting them know when they apply.

Chair Santiago commented that both supervisors and supervisees have rights and asked what penalties they would be facing if a supervisee happens to get themselves in trouble as an LAC.

Mr. Barrett believed the penalties would be the same as an LPC but would take a look at that as to whether those currently apply. He asked whether there is a contract between the supervisor and the supervisee.

Chair Santiago explained that it depends on where

a person works. She mentioned she supervises and has a supervision contract with supervisees. She mentioned that some people work at agencies who get a supervisor who is not an LPC but is still considered a clinical supervisor.

Mr. Barrett noted that he did not want to add something that was not standard.

Mr. DeCriscio commented that it is best practices to have that supervision contract in place, and folks who supervise privately are encouraged to have that in place. He mentioned that agencies develop supervision contracts and is in favor of having a supervision contract.

Mr. Barrett noted the Board would have to define what is in a supervision contract to provide guidance to people who may not be entering into contracts.

Mr. DeCriscio suggested providing a template or sample online for supervisors and supervisees for their reference.

Dr. Behun mentioned that some of those answers can be found through the approved clinical supervisor because they need to fill out that application. He noted over a dozen states recognize that credential and believed they outline it better than anyone else as far as best practice for counselors.

4.3

Mr. Barrett stated the supervision plan and and then the supervisor acceptable to the Board in terms of Act 4 could be molded to fit the LAC license framework.

Mr. DeCriscio referred to the qualifying exam for the LAC and reported that most states are requiring the National Counselor Examination (NCE). He noted that people step up to do the LPC are required to take the Certified Clinical Mental Health Counselor Examination and believed they should follow those same guidelines.

Mr. Barrett explained that Act 4 does not write in any additional exam requirement and believed they could not do that in terms of the LAC. He noted there is no language providing for an examination for it and believe the intent from the General Assembly was to turn their current supervision scheme into a licensed practice.

Mr. Barrett further explained that there is no ticket to entry other than the degree, and then once they get the degree, they could apply for the LAC, which allows them to start their supervised experience. He noted that other states may have that framework but did not think the General Assembly wrote Act 4 in a way that allows that sort of

regulation.

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Mr. Barrett noted the two baseline questions were addressed, including whether there were any other things in the supervision plan the Board wanted to see outside of what is detailed in Act 4 and how the Board felt about CE, which sounds like the Board will

7 be putting CE in there.]

Ms. Santamaria Garcia expressed concern with the LMFT application because the regulations say that the hours have to be done in not less than 1.5 years but no more than 6 years. She asked whether that means she already completed her hours for the LMFT. She noted being concerned that she started her LMFT hours in 2019 and is going to be 6 years in 2025. She asked whether she has to do the hours within 6 years or that there cannot be more than 6 years passed that she did her hours since the application.

Mr. Barrett explained that the hours have to be earned within 6 years, so it is not within 6 years like the application. He stated the details will be laid out in the letter. he noted the final order for the LPC application will be going out.

Ms. Santamaria Garcia asked whether the LPC is a final order or a provisional denial because she believed them both to be provisional denials.

Mr. Barrett explained that old application limits expired and is the one the order is going out on, which is why there is a provisional denial for the new one, where they have to address each application

1 individually. He offered to answer any questions 2 once she receives the letters and documentation.

Ms. Santamaria Garcia mentioned that there has been a long wait time to receive answers and expressed concern as to whether she could appeal the decision on the provisional denials.

Mr. Barrett explained that the letters will detail the next steps she could take. He noted she could appeal to the Board with provisional denials and appeal to the Commonwealth Court for final orders.

Ms. Santamaria Garcia requested clarification as to whether the hours she completed do not expire even if it has been more than 6 years.

Mr. Barrett explained that he cannot give a finite answer because he is not looking at her documents. He noted that generally under the regulations that it is the time within the hours have to be earned, not related to when the application is submitted.

Ms. Santamaria Garcia asked whether the Board could share the decisions with her at this time.

Mr. Barrett explained that it will all be spelled out in the correspondence, which goes into more detail than he could do in public session. He

1 apologized for her wait and offered to answer any 2 questions going forward.

Ms. Santamaria Garcia referred to the associate license that just started and asked whether she could apply for the associate license because she does not fully have an LPC or LMFT.

Mr. Barrett explained that he cannot prejudge an application but stated she needs the same educational requirements as an LPC for the associate, where if the hang up is on an educational requirement, it is probably going to be the same result for the associate.

Ms. Santamaria Garcia asked whether going through this process precludes her from going through the other process in parallel.

Mr. Barrett noted that it does not preclude her from going through the other process.]
