16 6805 regarding the child abuse reporting requirement  
17 for the Board's information. She reported no  
18 comments were received on the rulemaking, noting the  
19 regulation was approved on December 6, 2023, and  
20 would be published as final in a few weeks.]

21

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22 Miscellaneous - Creation of an Application Committee

23 [Dana M. Wucinski, Esquire, Board Counsel, stated  
24 they want to create a committee for each Board as a  
25 way to expedite the processing of applications. She



1 explained that the Application Committee would be  
2 responsible for checking emails daily to review  
3 pending applications. She explained that the  
4 application could be processed and ratified at the  
5 next Board meeting if the Application Committee  
6 grants the application. She further explained that  
7 the Application Committee does not have the authority  
8 to deny the application and would go on the agenda  
9 for full Board to review.]

10 MS. WUCINSKI:

11 I believe the Board would entertain a

11 [Ted Mowatt, CAE, Vice President, Wanner Associates,  
12 on behalf of the Pennsylvania Academy of Audiology,  
13 welcomed Board members to attend the Pennsylvania  
14 Academy of Audiology Meeting in Gettysburg.]

15 MS. GOLDMAN:

16 I move we authorize up to two members

18 is available to attend the Gettysburg  
19 2024 meeting of the Pennsylvania  
20 Academy of Audiology, September 26-27,  
21 2024.

22 MS. BUTLER:

1 [Board members did not vote on the motion because no

6 [Dana M. Wucinski, Esquire, Board Counsel, informed  
7 Board members that the Pennsylvania Speech-Language-  
8 Hearing Association (PSHA) granted the Board a half-  
9 hour presentation and Board Counsel would be  
10 presenting on the disciplinary process.]

6 Report of Board Chairperson

7 [Patrick M. Murphy, Au.D., M.Ed., CCC-A, FAAA, Chair,  
8 thanked everybody for their service to the Board this  
9 year, especially Shakeena Chappelle.

10 Chair Murphy referred to the Vision Statement,  
11 noting they are a progressive, responsive, and  
12 equitable leader for the professions in Pennsylvania.  
13 He encouraged everyone to inform the Board of any  
14 issues or concerns within the realm of speech  
15 pathology or audiology.]

16 \*\*\*

17 Report of Acting Commissioner

18 [Arion R. Claggett, Acting Commissioner, Bureau of  
19 Professional and Occupational Affairs, informed Board  
20 members that the request for proposal (RFP) for the  
21 Pennsylvania Licensing System (PALS) replacement was  
22 issued on September 28, 2023. He noted the RFP  
23 closed on November 30, 2023. He mentioned they are  
24 currently reviewing bids and offered to provide an  
25 additional update at the next meeting.

1 Ms. Goldman requested an update on telemedicine  
2 legislation.

3 Ms. Wucinski had nothing new to report since the  
4 last Board meeting.

5 Ms. Goldman noted that Medicare would stop  
6 routinely funding telemedicine in July 2024.]

7 \*\*\*

8 Report of Board Administrator - No Report

9 \*\*\*

10 Report from Other Board Member

11 [Lisa A. Butler, M.A., CCC-SLP, Vice Chairperson,  
12 addressed CE requirements for supervision and  
13 cultural competency and ethics. She mentioned  
14 looking into adding a CE requirement for supervision  
15 and cultural competency, but the American Speech-  
16 Language-Hearing Association (ASHA) already has this  
17 in their CE requirements and may cause confusion,  
18 where someone may have to do two times the ethics  
19 course and two times the supervision course because  
20 it would not line up with the three years and the two  
21 years.

22 Ms. Goldman mentioned that the issue leads into  
23 item five, noting she submitted text for an email  
24 blast on ethics but was not sure what happened with  
25 that submission.



1 Ms. Butler asked Acting Commissioner Claggett  
2 whether the Board could send an email blast reminder  
3 to licensees in June for the July 2024 renewal of all  
4 required continuing education units (CEUs).

5 Ms. Goldman explained that the reminder would  
6 include true or false questions and where to find the  
7 answers within Title 49, Chapter 15 in § 45.102 Code  
8 of Ethics and § 45.103. She offered to resubmit it  
9 for the March meeting for review.

10 Ms. Butler agreed, noting it could be sent out in  
11 June 2024.

12 Dr. McCall noted the issue is recurring and the  
13 ASHA rollover requirements of every three years and  
14 the Board every two years causes confusion for  
15 practitioners in the state. He asked whether it is a  
16 problem for Pennsylvania or also happening in other  
17 states. He agreed with Ms. Goldman and keeping  
18 people educated on state requirements.

19 Ms. Goldman explained that every state has  
20 different CE requirements and schedules, where some  
21 of them go on a calendar year and some of them on a  
22 state fiscal year. She mentioned that instead of  
23 another CE requirement that would require changes in  
24 their regulation that it may be more expeditious to  
25 provide the educational correspondence.

1 Ms. Butler thanked Ms. Goldman for providing the  
2 email blast, noting the importance of licensees  
3 looking at ethics right before they complete their  
4 license for the state of Pennsylvania.

5 Acting Commissioner Claggett asked Ms. Goldman to  
6 resend the email to the Board for review.

7 Ms. Butler addressed her attendance, along with  
8 Ms. Goldman and Ms. Wucinski, at the National Council  
9 of State Boards of Examiners for Speech-Language  
10 Pathology and Audiology (NCSB) Conference. She  
11 offered to provide Board members with a copy of the  
12 different licensure requirements in all of the  
13 states.

14 Ms. Butler provided an update regarding the  
15 compact, noting they are selecting an executive  
16 director and data system that will complete overall  
17 funding, along with looking for funding and possibly  
18 grants. She noted they are currently getting all  
19 member states connected to the data system and  
20 working out issues with the criminal background  
21 check. She also noted they are deciding where the  
22 commission will be housed and will possibly be  
23 dependent on the executive director.

24 Ms. Butler reported that the big legislation  
25 plans for 2024 are Alaska, Arizona, Connecticut,

1 Florida, Hawaii, Illinois, Massachusetts, Minnesota,  
2 New York, Oregon, Pennsylvania, Rhode Island, and  
3 Wisconsin. She provided a map of the states that  
4 have joined, states in the process, and states that  
5 continue to work on it. She noted the importance of  
6 people being able to move from state to state and  
7 have a license, especially those in the military.

8 Ms. Butler commented that one of the biggest  
9 topics was social media issues, including things  
10 licensees put on Facebook and believed it is time to  
11 take a step back and think about what licensees are  
12 posting in social media. She provided an example of  
13 a speech-language pathologist who posted personal  
14 information through pictures and lost their license.

15 Ms. Butler addressed content sharing on social  
16 media, where individuals must comply with the Health  
17 Insurance Portability Accountability Act (HIPAA),  
18 must not include misrepresentation, and must be  
19 professional. She noted the importance of licensees  
20 thinking about what is being put on social media and  
21 websites and to ask themselves if they would want  
22 their posting on the front page of a newspaper.

23 Ms. Butler reported 7,525 speech-language  
24 pathologists in Pennsylvania in 2020 and 9,426 in  
25 2023, noting an increase of 1,901. She also reported

1 906 audiologists in 2020 and 1,114 in 2023, noting an  
2 increase of 208 audiologists.

3 Ms. Butler addressed the importance of  
4 registering assistants in Pennsylvania, where anyone  
5 who has an assistant and is a licensee must register  
6 that assistant under their name. She reported having  
7 only 4 registered assistants in the state of  
8 Pennsylvania. She stated there are regulations for  
9 assistants and would like a discussion at the next  
10 meeting to go over the process, noting information  
11 could be found on their website.

12 Ms. Butler also mentioned there were a lot of  
13 things for audiologists at the meeting, including  
14 hearing aids. She mentioned the Board does not deal  
15 with hearing aids and is the responsibility of the  
16 Pennsylvania Department of Health.

17 Ms. Butler informed audiologists that the  
18 American Academy of Audiology is having their  
19 2024+HearTECH Expo April 17-20, 2024, in Atlanta, GA.  
20 She also announced PSHA's Annual Convention April 10-  
21 13, 2024, at the Sheraton in Pittsburgh, PA. She  
22 mentioned there was also an article for audiologists  
23 that went over legislation about where audiologists  
24 stand and where hearing aid sales stand.

25 Ms. Butler informed everyone that all of the

1 handouts are available at the National Council of  
2 State Boards of Examiners of Speech-Language  
3 Pathologists and Audiologists for free at  
4 [www.ncsb.info](http://www.ncsb.info).

5 Ms. Butler commented that it was great partnering  
6 with other states and seeing how Pennsylvania  
7 compares with other states. She mentioned that North  
8 Carolina has a simple brochure for consumers and gave  
9 Pennsylvania permission to adopt it for audiologists  
10 and speech-language pathologists. She suggested  
11 placing it on the agenda for discussion at the next  
12 meeting.

13 Ms. Butler thanked the state for allowing them to  
14 be part of the conference and Ms. Wucinski and Ms.  
15 Goldman for also attending.

16 Ms. Goldman commented that Pennsylvania is a  
17 member state, which allows them to share the  
18 information. She encouraged anyone who is a leader  
19 in their state association or otherwise engaged in  
20 that kind of leadership in the professions to join  
21 the NCSB Facebook group and attend the meetings. She  
22 noted they would be covered under the Board's  
23 membership and would have a reduced fee. She  
24 requested an addition to the March 2024 agenda to  
25 send delegates to the 2024 NCSB Annual Conference in

1 San Antonio, TX, September 26-28.

2 Acting Commissioner Claggett referred to the  
3 brochure Ms. Butler provided and believed it to be a  
4 good idea for the Board to copy that type of brochure  
5 and add it to their web page.]

6 \*\*\*

7 Public Comment Period

8 [Amber Lee Czerniakowski, Esquire, Board Prosecution  
9 Liaison, referred to the prior discussion regarding  
10 continuing education credit confusion. She informed  
11 Board members that the prosecution division attempted  
12 outreach to students at Temple University and West  
13 Chester University to teach students about  
14 prosecution and discuss regulations regarding  
15 continuing education before they enter the  
16 profession. She noted making them aware of ASHA  
17 requirements and explained Pennsylvania regulation  
18 requirements. She mentioned that prosecution is  
19 hoping to attend more schools throughout next year.

20 Ms. Goldman thanked prosecution for their  
21 outreach and suggested they inform the Board of a  
22 scheduled event so Board members could attend.

23 Ms. Czerniakowski noted she would be reaching out  
24 to Salus University and offered to provide  
25 information once she receives confirmation regarding

1 the date.]

2

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3 [Patrick M. Murphy, Au.D., M.Ed., CCC-A, FAAA, Chair,  
4 thanked everybody for their attendance and  
5 participation. He noted 2024 Board meeting dates are  
6 March 8, June 7, September 6, and December 13.]

7
