Walter, Esquire, 9 Senior Board Counsel, for the purpose of conducting 10 quasi-judicial deliberations on the matters on the agenda and to receive advice of Board Counsel. 11 The 12 Board returned to open session at 10:30 a.m.] 13 * * * 14 The regularly scheduled meeting of the State 15 Board of Examiners in Speech-Language Pathology and 16 Audiology was held on Friday, March 8, 2024. Lisa A. 17 Butler, M.A., CCC-SLP, Chairperson, called the 18 meeting to order at 10:39 a.m. 19 Chair Butler reminded everyone that the meeting 20 was being recorded, and voluntary participation 21 constituted consent to be recorded. * * * 22 23 Roll Call of Board Members/Introduction of Attendees 24 [Shakeena L. Chappelle, Board Administrator, provided 25 a roll call of Board members and an introduction of

4 1 attendees.] * * * 2 3 Approval of minutes of the December 8, 2023 meeting 4 CHAIR BUTLER: 5 Do I have a motion to approve the draft 6 minutes for the December 8, 2023 7 meeting? 8 DR. MURPHY: 9 I approve. 10 CHAIR BUTLER: 11 Do I have a second? ACTING COMMISSIONER CLAGGETT: 12 13 Second. 14 CHAIR BUTLER: 15 Any discussion? Shakeena, please do a 16 roll call vote. 17 18 Lisa Butler, yes; Commissioner 19 Claggett, aye; Dr. Murphy, aye; Sarah 20 Delano, abstain. 21 [The motion carried. Sarah Delano abstained from 22 voting on the motion.] 23 * * * 24 Report of Prosecutorial Division 25 [Amber Lee Czerniakowski, Esquire, Board Prosecution

1 Liaison, presented the Consent Agreement for Case No. 23-68-006908.1 2 3 MS. WALTER: I believe the Board would entertain a 4 5 motion to approve the Consent Agreement 6 at item 2 on the agenda at Case No. 23-7 68-006908. 8 CHAIR BUTLER: 9 Do I have a motion? 10 DR. MURPHY: 11 I move. CHAIR BUTLER: 12 13 Do I have a second? 14 MS. DELANO: 15 I second. CHAIR BUTLER: 16 Any discussion? Shakeena, would you 17 18 please do a roll call vote? 19 20 Lisa Butler, aye; Commissioner 21 Claggett, aye; Dr. Murphy, nay; Sarah 22 Delano, aye. 23 [The motion carried. 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1 [Amber Lee Czerniakowski, Esquire, Board Prosecution Liaison, presented the Consent Agreement for Case No. 2 3 22-68-013918.] 4 MS. WALTER: 5 Is there a motion to approve the Consent Agreement at agenda item 3 at 6 7 Case No. 22-68-013918? 8 CHAIR BUTLER: 9 Do I have a motion? 10 DR. MURPHY: 11 I'll move. CHAIR BUTLER: 12 13 Do I have a second? 14 MS. DELANO: 15 I second. CHAIR BUTLER: 16 17 Any discussion? Shakeena, can you 18 please do a roll call vote? 19 20 Lisa Butler, aye; Commissioner 21 Claggett, aye; Dr. Patrick Murphy, aye; 22 Sarah Delano, aye. 23 [The motion carried unanimously. The Respondent's 24 name is Mark Luckey Gustina.] * * * 25

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7 1 Report of Board Counsel - Annual Sunshine Act and 2 Recusal Guidelines Review 3 [Shana M. Walter, Esquire, Senior Board Counsel, 4 reminded everyone that the Board entered into 5 Executive Session this morning to conduct quasi-6 judicial deliberations and to receive the advice of 7 counsel. Ms. Walter provided a Sunshine Act PowerPoint 8 9 presentation. She explained that the purpose of the 10 Sunshine Act is the right of the public to be present 11 at all meetings to witness deliberations, policy 12 formulation, and decision-making for proper 13 functioning of the democratic process. 14 Ms. Walter noted the basics of the Sunshine Act 15 is that meetings where deliberations and official 16 action occurs must be open to the public and 17 addressed official action taken by the Board. 18 Ms. Walter stated an agency is required to give 19 public notice of its first regular meeting of each 20 calendar year, not less than three days in advance of 21 the meeting. She noted the Board is not required to 22 issue public notice for an emergency meeting. She 23 stated the rule for a regular meeting is 72 hours and 24 a special meeting is 24 hours with the goal being a 25 minimum of one week.

1 Ms. Walter addressed public notice, including 2 newspapers, place of business, and email. She 3 reported changes to public notice in 2021 regarding 4 agendas, which are to be posted on a public-5 accessible website no less than 24 hours in advance 6 of the meeting, posted on the door of Board meeting 7 room, along with paper copies available for those who 8 attend in person.

9 Ms. Walter addressed the recording of votes and 10 requirement of minutes for all open meetings. She 11 noted the Board enters into executive session at each 12 public session to receive the advice of counsel and 13 to conduct quasi-judicial deliberations. She stated 14 agency business does not occur during conferences or 15 executive session.

Ms. Walter stated executive session can also be used to discuss personnel issues in addition to quasi-judicial deliberations. She noted one of the options when the Board does not follow the Sunshine Act is that a legal challenge can be filed within 30 days from the meeting or within 30 days of the discovery of any action which occurred.

Ms. Walter stated all Board business, deliberations, and official actions should be conducted in an open meeting, and Board members

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should not discuss agency business, especially
executive session matters, outside of an official
Board meeting.

Ms. Walter noted committee meetings for the purpose of performing administrative functions, like reviewing applications or performing prosecutorial functions, are not subject to open meeting requirements.

9 Ms. Walter stated recusals are mandatory if the 10 Board member had a prosecutorial role in the matter 11 or a direct personal financial interest in the 12 outcome of the matter.

13 Ms. Walter noted it is strongly suggested to 14 recuse if a Board member has a personal affection for 15 someone directly involved, but knowing a person or 16 knowing of a person is not necessarily enough to 17 warrant recusal. She also noted recusal is strongly 18 suggested when a Board member has knowledge from 19 outside of a case and cannot set it aside in order to 20 make a fair and unbiased determination based solely 21 on the record.

Ms. Walter stated recusal is discretionary when a Board member cannot hear or participate in a decision on the subject fairly or without prejudice. She encouraged Board members to discuss matters with

1 Board Counsel if they are uncertain whether or not to 2 recuse.

Ms. Walter discussed abstention versus recusal. Ms. Walter discussed abstention versus recusal. She explained that abstention is when a Board member withholds their vote and does not affect quorum, but recusal is when an individual is unable to vote and can affect the quorum.

8 Ms. Walter addressed conflicts of interest, 9 noting that professional Board members shall not at 10 the same time be an officer or agent at any statewide 11 association or organization representing the 12 profession or occupation subject to Board action.

13 Ms. Walter stated public Board members of a 14 licensing board or commission representing the public shall be a private citizen and cannot be a member of 15 16 any profession or occupation registered or licensed 17 by the Board or be related to or part of an immediate family of a member of a profession or occupation. 18 19 Ms. Walter also stated public Board members 20 cannot be affiliated in any way with the profession 21 or occupation with any other appointed or elective

22 public office or position within the Commonwealth or 23 another state or the United States government during 24 the appointed term. She mentioned that any person 25 not meeting the standards for Board membership shall

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1	be ineligible.]
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3	Appointment - Annual Prosecution Division
4	Presentation
5	[Carlton Smith, Esquire, Deputy Chief Counsel,
6	Prosecution Division, informed Board members that he
7	assumed his role in March 2023 when Carolyn
8	DeLaurentis was promoted to the Executive Deputy
9	Chief Counsel position and provided a brief summary
10	of his professional background.
11	Mr. Smith reported a decrease in the number of
12	Bureau of Professional and Occupational Affairs
13	(BPOA) complaints across all boards from around
14	22,000 in 2022 to roughly 19,000 in 2023.
15	Mr. Smith presented the Prosecution Division's
16	Annual Report for the State Board of Examiners in
17	Speech-Language Pathology. He reported a little over
18	11,000 active licensees in 2023. He noted 21 cases
19	were opened in 2023. He also noted 18 cases open as
20	of the beginning of 2024 and 51 closed cases. He
21	informed Board members that prosecution's standard is
22	to be able to dispose of a case within a year across
23	all boards, noting the Board is at the 365-day mark.
24	Mr. Smith addressed discipline cases in 2023,
25	noting 1 fine and a few mandatory continuing

education (CE) reprimands and suspensions. 1 2 Mr. Smith addressed prosecution not warranted and 3 warning letters. He explained that warning letters 4 are issued after prosecution considered the seriousness of the allegations, licensee disciplinary 5 6 history, and strength of the evidence. 7 Mr. Smith reported 19 prosecution not warranted 8 cases, noting prosecution again considers the 9 seriousness of the allegations and disciplinary 10 history but also considers an expert opinion as to whether there was some deviation of standard of 11 12 care.] 13 * * * 14 Regulatory Report 15 [Shana M. Walter, Esquire, Senior Board Counsel, 16 informed Board members that 16A-6805 regarding child 17 abuse reporting requirements was published as final 18 on January 27, 2024.] * * * 19 20 Regulatory Report - Status of Regulations 21 [Shana M. Walter, Esquire, Senior Board Counsel, 22 addressed the status of regulations, noting the Act 23 53 final-form rulemaking was delivered to the 24 Independent Regulatory Review Commission (IRRC) and 25 the standing committees of the House and Senate on

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1 February 14, 2024. She reported that everyone who 2 commented were notified of the delivery and the 3 availability of final-form rulemaking. 4 Ms. Walter mentioned that it is posted on the 5 Independent Regulatory Review Commission's (IRRC) 6 website and expected to be on IRRC's agenda for the 7 public meeting on March 21, 2024. She also reported 8 regulatory counsel is working on the Act 41 9 rulemaking package.] 10 * * * 11 Report of Board Chairperson - PSHA Conference Update 12 [Lisa A. Butler, M.A., CCC-SLP, Chairperson, informed 13 Board members that she will be attending the 14 Pennsylvania Speech-Language-Hearing Association 15 (PSHA) Conference, along with Ms. Goldman and a Board 16 prosecutor, in Pittsburgh, April 10-13, 2024.] * * * 17 18 Report of Board Chairperson - Assistants in Schools Licensed/Non-licensed Discussion 19 20 [Lisa A. Butler, M.A., CCC-SLP, Chairperson, reported 21 currently having 51 assistants and noted the 22 importance of licensed speech-language pathologists 23 and audiologists knowing that they are responsible 24 under their license for the assistant. 25 Chair Butler stated they must register themselves

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once they are in charge of supervising the assistant, 1 2 must hold a Pennsylvania license, cannot have more 3 than three assistants in the state of Pennsylvania if 4 supervising, 25% has to be onsite supervision of each 5 clinical session, and must have 20 hours of each practical training for each duty. She mentioned that 6 7 the requirement is on their website and suggested 8 everyone review the requirements.] 9 10 Report of Board Chairperson - Review of Active 11 Licensees 12 [Shana M. Walter, Esquire, Senior Board Counsel, 13 referred to a question raised at the last meeting 14 regarding the number of licensees. She reported 51 15 assistants, 1,134 audiologists, 384 provisional speech-language pathologists, and 9,645 speech-16 17 language pathologists. She noted an increase of 18 several hundred over the past few years.] * * * 19 20 Report of Board Chairperson - Call for Public Members 21 [Arion R. Claggett, Acting Commissioner, Bureau of 22 Professional and Occupational Affairs, informed Board 23 members that the Governor's Office is aware of the 24 need for public members and are working to address 25 that issue.

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Chair Butler thanked Acting Commissioner 1 2 Claggett, noting the Board looked forward to having 3 more public members on its Board.] * * * 4 5 Report of Acting Commissioner - No Report * * * 6 7 Report from Other Board Member 8 [Lisa A. Butler, M.A., CCC-SLP, Chairperson, 9 mentioned that the Board can move forward with the 10 email blast of continuing education in ethics of true 11 and false questions. She explained that it would be 12 just an educational reminder for licensees.] 13 * * * 14 Report of Board Administrator - Proposed 2025 Board 15 Meeting Dates 16 [Shakeena L. Chappelle, Board Administrator, 17 requested Board approval for 2025 Board meeting dates 18 to include March 7, June 20, September 12, and December 12.] 19 20 CHAIR BUTLER: 21 Do I have a motion to approve the 2025 22 proposed meeting dates? 23 DR.
