who were creating a device that was a low-speed on-road device. He stated Board Counsel determined the low-speed on-road vehicles to be under the Act and could be granted licenses. He noted the vehicle type is not yet available in the Pennsylvania Licensing System (PALS) but will be inserted at some point as a low-speed on-road vehicle, NEV, which stands for neighborhood electric vehicle (NEV), modified golf cart, etc.

Mr. Kushlan noted the vehicles have a maximum of 25 mph and conform to the federal transportation definition of low-speed vehicle (LSV). He further explained that Board Counsel determined that the vehicles should be licensed with all of the same requirements for manufacturers, distributors, and dealerships, along with their salespersons and representatives.

Mr. Kushlan reported Honor LSV was the first company to receive a manufacturer's license, noting they strictly manufacture low-speed electric vehicles that have a maximum of 25 mph. He mentioned that they are on-road vehicles with all of the safety features.

Mr. Kushlan mentioned working on another application for Mantis Corporation, noting the

company makes modified golf carts that are made for driving on the road and not for golf course use.

Mr. Kushlan informed Board members that Board Counsel looked at the definition of highway and other parts of the Pennsylvania code, where the definition was broad enough that it includes public roads in general. He noted the vehicles cannot go on roads that have a high posted speed limit.

Chair Davis commented that it is not a highway vehicle and is for driving on city streets.

Mr. Kushlan stated normal golf carts do not fall under this because they are not considered vehicles. He mentioned that he could not speak to the Pennsylvania Department of Transportation's (PennDOT) requirements but that they did meet the definition of vehicle according to Board Counsel.

Mr. Kushlan announced that the state implemented an e-license certificate that allows licensees to download a fully official certificate that is identical to what would be printed. He mentioned that printing is still continuing, although downloading the certificate alleviates postal delivery issues. He noted the certificate has a quick response (QR) code for instant verification and Acting Commissioner Claggett's signature.]
