   Board's recent biennial licensee count was at 40,438,

   an increase of 1,650 licensees over the first

   biannual basis. Ms. Laudenslager then presented a

   breakdown of Board licensure classes and what the

   actual fees were for those individual classes. She

   also stated that May of FY '25 would be the last

   incremental increase of fees with those fees
24
   extending out through 2031. Additionally, renewals
25
   and applications currently make up a total of 94.4
```

percent of the Board's revenue with the Board's biannual revenue for this period being 4.9 million.

She then referenced the Board's expenditures by cost category and stated to members the three ways expenses come in to the Board, including direct charges, timesheets and license population. She stated every Board picks up a portion of these expenses based on their license population.

Ms. Laudenslager further informed the Board that, on a biennial basis, there was an increase in expenses for the current fiscal year. She reviewed the prior and current years' figures, noting an increase due to a new IT system for the legal division along with a geographical move for same from the Penn Center to Thea Drive. Expenses had also increased due to the modernization of PALS.

Ms. Laudenslager concluded her presentation by advising the Board of their beginning balance and biennial revenue. She further stated there was a deficit from the Board's revenue compared to expenses and that the deficit would continue. She advised another fee increase for the Board and stated she will come back before the Board in the spring to discuss options.]
