Saturday, January 4, 2025	County Deadline to Submit Voting System Malfunction Reports (2024 General)	By this date, each county board of elections must submit to the Secretary of the Commonwealth the Voting System Malfunction Report attached as Appendix A to the <i>Directive Regarding the Uniform Reporting of Voting System Malfunctions to the Department of State</i> for the November 2024 General Election.
Monday, January 6, 2025	Deadline to File Judicial Declaration of Candidacy for Retention	By this date, elected judges seeking retention in 2025 must file their declarations of candidacy for retention election in the office of the Secretary of the Commonwealth.
Friday, January 31, 2025	2024 Campaign Finance Cycle 7 Filing Deadline	2024 Campaign Finance Cycle 7 Deadline: Last day for all candidates and all political committees and lobbyists to file annual expense reports in the office of the Secretary of the Commonwealth or the county boards of elections. Such reports shall be complete as of December 31, 2024.
Monday, February 3, 2025	County Deadline to Submit Election Integrity Grant (EIG) Post-Election Report (2024 General)	Last day for the county board of elections for each county receiving an Election Integrity Grant, pursuant to the grant agreement, to report to the Department of Community & Economic Development, the chairperson and minority chairperson of the State Government Committee of the Senate and the chairperson and minority chairperson of the State Government Committee of the House of Representatives, on a form prescribed by the Department of State, how the county used the grant money received under this section for the November 2024 General Election.

Tuesday, February 18, 2025	2024 Business Entity Political Contribution Reporting Deadline	Last day for any business entity which was awarded non-bid contracts from the Commonwealth or its political subdivisions during 2024 to report to the Secretary of the Commonwealth an itemized list of all political contributions made during 2024 by (1) any officer, director, associate, partner, limited partner, individual owner or member of their immediate family when the contribution exceeded an aggregate of one thousand dollars (\$1,000) by any Individual; or (2) any employee or members of his/her immediate family when the contribution exceeded an aggregate of one thousand dollars (\$1,000).
Tuesday, February 18, 2025	County Deadline to Certify County Political Parties	Last day for each county board of elections to transmit to the Secretary of the Commonwealth a list of the organizations which qualify as political parties within the county pursuant to section 801(b) of the Pennsylvania Election Code, 25 P.S. § 2831(b).
Tuesday, February 18, 2025	Secretary's Certification of Statewide Political Parties	Last day for the Secretary of the Commonwealth to transmit to each county board of elections a list of the organizations which qualify as political parties within the State pursuant to section 801(a) of the Election Code, 25 P.S. § 2831(a).
Tuesday, February 18, 2025	Deadline for Municipalities and School Districts to Notice Offices to be Nominated at Primary	Last day for the clerks or secretaries of cities, boroughs, towns, townships and school districts to file with their respective county boards of elections a written notice of all offices to be nominated at the ensuing primary.
Tuesday, February 18, 2025	Secretary's Certification of Statewide and State-Level Offices to be Nominated at Primary	Last day for the Secretary of the Commonwealth to send to the county boards of elections a written notice designating the public offices for which candidates are to be nominated at the ensuing primary and for which nominations candidates are required to file nomination petitions in the office of the Secretary of the Commonwealth.

The Secretary of the Commonwealth shall include such office in certifications under the provisions of Section 905 of the Pennsylvania Election Code, 25 P.S. § 2865.
Wednesday, February 19, 2025	County Deadline to Prepare UMOVA Notice (Primary)	Not later than this day, the county boards of elections must prepare an election notice to be used in conjunction with the Federal Write-in Absentee Ballot (FWAB).
Tuesday, February 25, 2025	Start of Period for County Advertising of Offices to be Nominated and Elected	Not earlier than this day nor later than March 4, the county board of elections shall begin to publish in newspapers the names of all public offices for which nominations are to be made and the names of all party offices for which candidates are to be elected at the ensuing primary.
Tuesday, March 11, 2025	End of Circulation Period for and Deadline to File Nomination Petitions	Last day to circulate and file nomination petitions. Petitions must be received no later than 5:00 PM in the office of the Secretary of the Commonwealth, or no later than the ordinary closing hour of any county board of elections office, as the case may be.
Tuesday, March 11, 2025	Deadline to File Statement of Financial Interests for Candidates Filing Nomination Petitions	Last day for state level public office candidates to file "Statements of Financial Interests" with the State Ethics Commission, Room 309 Finance Building, P.O. Box 11470, Harrisburg, PA 17108-1470. A copy of the "Statement" must also be appended to the nomination petition. Last day for candidates for county or local level public office to file the "Statement" with the governing authority of the political subdivisions in which they are candidates. A copy of the "Statement" must also be appended to the nomination petition.

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Wednesday, March 12, 2025	County Deadline to Fix Date for Casting of Lots for Position on Primary Ballot	By this day, the county board of elections shall fix a date for the casting of lots for the position of names upon the primary ballot for those candidates required to file nomination petitions with the county board of elections. The county board of elections shall give at least two days' notice of said date by posting thereof in a conspicuous place in its office, and by publication once in at least two newspapers of general circulation published in the county.
Wednesday, March 12, 2025	Start of Circulation Period for Nomination Papers	First day to circulate and file nomination papers nominating independent candidates of political bodies or candidates of minor political parties.
Tuesday, March 18, 2025	Deadline to File Objections to Nomination Petitions	Last day to file and serve objections to nomination petitions.
Wednesday, March 19, 2025	Secretary's Casting of Lots for Position on Primary Ballot	Day for casting of lots in the office of the Secretary of the Commonwealth for position of names upon the primary ballot.
Friday, March 21, 2025	Deadline for Hearings on Objections to Nomination Petitions	Last day that may be fixed by the Court of Common Pleas or the Commonwealth Court for hearings on objections that have been filed to nomination petitions.
Wednesday, March 26, 2025	Deadline for Decisions on Objections to Nomination Petitions	Last day, if possible, for the Court of Common Pleas or the Commonwealth Court to render decisions in cases involving objections to nomination petitions.
Wednesday, March 26, 2025	Deadline to Withdraw - Nomination Petitions	Last day for candidates who have filed nomination petitions for the primary election to withdraw. Withdrawals must be received no later than 5:00 PM in the office of the Secretary of the Commonwealth, or no later than the ordinary closing hour of any county board of elections office, as the case may be.
Monday, March 31, 2025	Secretary's Unofficial List of Candidates for Primary Ballots	Last day for the Secretary of the Commonwealth to transmit to each county board of elections a list of all candidates who filed nomination petitions with him and who are not known to have withdrawn or been disqualified.

Such reports shall be complete as of March 31.</p> <p><i>NOTE: Postmarks are acceptable as proof of timely filing where report is postmarked by the U.S. Postal Service no later than the day prior to the filing deadline.</i></p>
Monday, April 21, 2025	Deadline to Disaffiliate Voter Registration from Political Party to Serve as Candidate for Political Body	<p>Last day for a registered voter to disaffiliate from party enrollment in order to be eligible as a candidate for a political body in an election of the same year under the Election Code.</p>

Tuesday, May 6, 2025	County Deadline to Begin Distribution of Civilian Absentee and Mail-In Ballots (Primary)	As soon as possible after ballots are printed and in no event later than this day, the county boards of elections must begin to deliver or mail all mail-in and civilian absentee ballots. <i>NOTE: As additional applications are received, ballots must be mailed within 48 hours after approval.</i>
Friday, May 9, 2025	2025 Campaign Finance Cycle 2 Deadline	2025 Campaign Finance Cycle 2 Deadline: Last day for all candidates and treasurers of political committees and lobbyists which have expended money for purpose of influencing the nomination of candidates file campaign expense reports or statements due by the Second Friday before the primary in the office of the Secretary of the Commonwealth and/or the county boards of elections, as the case may be. Such reports shall be complete as of May 5. <i>NOTE: Postmarks are acceptable as proof of timely filing where the report is postmarked by the U.S. Postal Service no later than the day prior to the filing deadline.</i>
Saturday, May 10, 2025	Beginning of Period for County to Advertise Information for Upcoming Election (Applicable Only Where Special Election or Question on Constitutional Amendment Held in Conjunction with Primary)	Not earlier than this day nor later than May 17, the county boards of elections shall publish in newspapers, notice of the date and hours of voting for any special elections, the names of offices to be elected and the names of the candidates at such special elections, the texts and explanations of Constitutional Amendments and other questions to be voted upon, and the places at which such elections are to be held in the various election districts. <i>NOTE: This provision applies only if there is a constitutional amendment or a ballot question on a primary ballot or if a special election is held in conjunction with a primary. Under those circumstances, the primary election is treated as a November election because all registered electors may vote on the constitutional amendment, the ballot question, or the special election.</i>

Monday, May 12, 2025	Deadline to Appeal Rejection of Voter Registration to County Board of Election (Primary)	<p>Last day for any person to file a petition with the county registration commission appealing rejection of a voter registration application.</p>
Tuesday, May 13, 2025	Deadline to Apply for an Absentee Ballot (Primary)	<p>Last day before the primary election on which official applications for civilian absentee ballots from certain persons listed as follows may be received by the county boards of elections, due at 5:00 PM.</p> <p><i>(The preceding includes qualified registered electors who will be absent from the Commonwealth or municipality of residence by reason of occupation, business or duties; persons unable to go to the polls because of illness or physical disability; persons observing a religious holiday; county employees with duties on election day relating to the conduct of the election; persons employed by the State or Federal government and their spouses or dependents who are within the territorial limits of the United States or the District of Columbia but absent from their municipality of residence. Provided further that any of the preceding qualified electors who become ill or are called away from home by business or duties, which fact was not known or could not reasonably be known prior to the preceding date, are entitled to execute and file an Emergency Application any time prior to 8:00 PM on the day of the primary. Tuesday, May 13, 2025	County Deadline to Post the Military, Veterans and Emergency Civilian Absentee Voters' List (Primary)	<p>From this day and until the returns are certified, the county boards of elections shall post the Military, Veterans and Emergency Civilian Absentee Voters' list.</p>

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Thursday, May 15, 2025	County Deadline to Post Sample Ballots (Primary)	Not later than this day, the county boards of elections shall make available for public inspection the forms of the ballots and ballot labels which shall be used in each election district at the primary election and shall publish on their website.
Thursday, May 15, 2025	County Deadline to Transmit Sample Ballots to Candidates Who Requested (Primary)	Not later than this day, the county boards of elections, upon request, shall furnish without charge to each candidate whose name is printed on the primary election ballot (or the candidate's authorized representative) three sample ballots for the entire district in which such candidate is to be voted for. <i>(The candidate may, at his/her own expense, have printed on different colored paper as many copies as he/she requires for conducting his/her campaign.)</i>
Thursday, May 15, 2025	County Deadline to Report Voter Registration Statistics (Primary)	Not later than this day, the county boards of elections must prepare and submit a report to the Secretary of the Commonwealth containing a statement of the total number of electors registered in each election district, together with a breakdown of registration by each political party or other designation.
Monday, May 19, 2025	Deadline to Appeal Rejection of Voter Registration to the Court of Common Pleas (Primary)	Last day for any person to file an appeal to the Court of Common Pleas for rejection of registration.
Monday, May 19, 2025	County Deadline to Deliver Supplies to Judges of Election (Primary)	Not later than this day, the county boards of elections shall deliver the necessary ballots and supplies to the judges of election.
Monday, May 19, 2025	Deadline for UMOVA Voters to Submit Absentee Ballot (Primary)	Not later than 11:59 PM this day, covered voters under UMOVA must submit their voted military-overseas ballot for mailing or other authorized means of delivery, at the place where the voter completes the ballot on the date immediately preceding the date of the election.

The county boards of elections shall provide at least 48 hours (by Sunday, May 18) notice of a pre-canvass meeting by publicly posting on its publicly accessible internet website.</p> <p><i>NOTE: Counties that received an Election Integrity Grant must begin their pre-canvass at 7:00 AM on Election Day and shall continue without interruption until each mail-in ballot and absentee ballot received by 7:00 AM on election day is pre-canvassed.</i></p> <p><i>NOTE: No person observing or attending or participating in the pre-canvass meeting may disclose the results of any portion of any pre-canvass meeting prior to the close of the polls.</i></p>
Tuesday, May 20, 2025	Deadline for Completed Civilian Absentee and Mail-In Ballots to Be Received by the County (Primary)	<p>All mail-in and absentee ballots, except those received from military and overseas electors as defined by UMOVA and sections 1301(a) to (h) of the Pennsylvania Election Code, 25 P.S. § 3146.1(a) – (h), must be received by the county boards of elections not later than 8:00 PM on this day to be counted.</p>

The county boards of elections shall provide at least 48 hours (Sunday, May 18) notice of a canvass meeting by publicly posting on its publicly accessible internet website.</p> <p><i>NOTE: Counties that received an Election Integrity Grant must begin their canvass at 8:00 PM on Election Day and shall continue without interruption until each mail-in ballot and absentee ballot is canvassed.</i></p> <p><i>NOTE: No person observing or attending or participating in the canvass meeting may disclose the results of any portion of any canvass meeting prior to the close of the polls.</i></p>
Wednesday, May 21, 2025	County Deadline to Post Unofficial Number of Mail Ballots Received (Primary) (EIG Counties Only)	<p>By 12:01 AM on this day, the county board of elections for each county receiving an Election Integrity Grant shall, pursuant to the grant agreement, announce and post on its publicly accessible Internet website an unofficial number of absentee ballots and mail-in ballots received for the election.</p>
Wednesday, May 21, 2025	Deadline for Judges of Elections to Return Election Supplies to County (Primary)	<p>By 2:00 AM on this day, the judges of election must return to the county boards of elections all envelopes; supplies, including all uncast provisional ballots; and returns, including all provisional ballots and absentee ballots cast in the election district.</p>

SIXTH TUESDAY PRE-PRIMARY or PRE-ELECTION REPORTS are required to be filed *only* by candidates for statewide office, their authorized candidate committees, and any political committee or lobbyist that has made an expenditure to influence the election of a statewide candidate. In 2025, statewide offices appearing on the ballot include the following:

JUDGE OF THE SUPERIOR COURT
JUDGE OF THE COMMONWEALTH COURT**

Political committees/lobbyists that have not made an expenditure to influence the election of a candidate for the statewide offices listed above do not need to file the Sixth Tuesday Pre Primary/Election report.

SECOND FRIDAY PRE- and THIRTY DAY POST-PRIMARY or ELECTION REPORTS are required to be filed by all candidates appearing on the ballot and all political committees and lobbyists that have made expenditures to influence the election of such candidates. In 2025, offices appearing on the ballot include:

ANNUAL REPORTS must be filed by *all* candidates, political committees and contributing lobbyists that have not filed a termination report.

****SPECIAL ELECTIONS**** - In the event of any special election, candidates and committees should contact our bureau regarding reporting requirements and filing deadlines. A separate report will need to be filed for each Special Election Cycle. Special Elections do not follow the reporting dates for Cycles 1-7. Information regarding Special Election reporting dates can be found on our [website](#).

PENALTIES - In accordance with the Campaign Finance Reporting Law, those who file required reports after the filing deadline are assessed a late filing fee of \$20 per day for the first six days that a report is late, and \$10 per day thereafter, up to a maximum penalty of \$250 for each report.

NOTARIZED COVER PAGES - The Department allows ten (10) calendar days for the notarized cover page to be received in our office before the report is marked late. In the event that the notarized cover page is not received timely, a late fee will be assessed *from the date of the report filing deadline*. The Department does not accept postmarks for the cover pages.

POLITICAL COMMITTEE TREASURERS - It is the treasurer's responsibility to file required committee reports. Keep this schedule available for reference prior to each reporting deadline. If you need a reporting form, you may print one from the Department's [website](#) or request one from the bureau. You may also file your report online. From the website, select the link to Campaign Finance and then to Online Filing for more information. Please remember that all reports must include your filer identification number on the cover page.

24 HOUR REPORTING - Section 1628 of the Campaign Expense Reporting Law, 25 P.S. § 3248, requires any candidate or political committee, authorized by a candidate and created solely for the purpose of influencing an election on behalf of that candidate, which receives any contribution or pledge of five hundred dollars (\$500) or more, or any person making an independent expenditure of five hundred dollars (\$500) or more after the final pre-election/pre-primary report has been deemed completed shall report such contribution or expenditure to the appropriate supervisor. The candidate, chairperson or treasurer of the political committee shall send the report of late contributions within twenty-four (24) hours of receipt of the contribution. The same shall apply to persons making independent expenditures. The bureau will accept the filing of *24 Hour Reports* by facsimile at 717-705-0721, via e-mail at: ra-stcampaignfinance@pa.gov or [online](#). The filing of reports by facsimile or e-mail is permitted only for *24 Hour Reports*; it is not permitted for filing other campaign finance reports. The filing of late contribution reports does not remove the obligation to also report those contributions on the appropriate post-election/post-primary expense report filing and they should also be included in a post-election report. Please contact our office for specific reporting dates for late contribution reports.
