Experience Requirement	<p>3 Years - If a candidate holds a National Architectural Accrediting Board (NAAB) accredited degree, they will be required to complete a minimum of three years of experience through the Architectural Experience Program (AXP) and pass all sections of the Architect Registration Exam (ARE).</p> <p>If a candidate does not hold a NAAB accredited degree, they must apply to the State Board for pre-approval to take the ARE and must have at least 3 years of experience through the AXP completed, plus an additional 6 years of experience before they can become eligible for licensure.</p>
Education Requirement	<p>Professional Degree - Candidate shall submit evidence satisfactory to the board that the candidate holds a professional degree in architecture from an accredited school and has obtained at least three years' practical experience in the employ of or under the direct supervision of a registered architect or as part of the candidate's academic training.</p> <p>*In lieu of a professional degree in architecture, the board may accept evidence of at least six years' practical experience obtained in the employ of or under the direct supervision of a registered architect which may include academic training.</p>
Examination Requirement	<p>1 Examination - A candidate must successfully pass the Architect Registration Examination</p>
Profession definition	<p>An individual registered by the state licensing board that engages in the profession of architecture. The practice of architecture involves the design and construction of a structure or group of structures which have as their principal purpose human habitation or use, and the utilization of space within and surrounding such structures. Other services include planning, providing preliminary studies, designs, drawings, specifications, and other design documents, construction management and administration of construction contracts.</p>

Licensure Requirement – Military Experience Equivalency Notes

Experience Requirement	<p>Since servicemember holds an accredited degree, they will be required to demonstrate proof of completing a minimum of three years of experience through the Architectural Experience Program (AXP) to satisfy experience requirement for licensure.</p> <p>According to the AXP program guidelines, military experience may satisfy some experience hour requirements. Candidates with this experience should follow up with the National Council of Architectural Registration Boards (NCARB) for further guidance.</p>
Education Requirement	<p>The servicemember holds a bachelor's or master's degree in architecture from accredited university.</p> <p>Satisfies education requirement for licensure.</p>
Examination Requirement	<p>A candidate for licensure must successfully pass the Architect Registration Examination (ARE) to satisfy requirement for licensure.</p> <p>Servicemember can satisfy ARE examination requirement during time of military service.</p> <p>(See Related Credentials Offered section)</p>
