Experience Requirement	1,250 Hours - Student must be instructed according to PA state curriculum, 1,250 hours in a licensed barber school under a licensed barber teacher, or in a licensed barber shop under a licensed barber manager or barber teacher.
Education Requirement	A candidate is required to have an 8th grade education or equivalent.
Examination Requirement	2 Examinations - The examinations for license as barber and barber-teacher include both practical and theoretical tests. A passing grade in practical work and in the written test is required before a license will be issued.
Profession definition	An individual who is engaged in the practice of barbering, to shave or trim the beard; to cut, shape, trim or blend the hair with the proper tools or instruments.

Ship Servicemember - Barber (1737) [Enlisted]

Job Duties	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Ship's Servicemembers are responsible for managing and operating all shipboard retail and service activities. This includes the ship's barbershop. • Career Tasks: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ Provide barbering services, such as cutting, trimming, shampooing, and styling hair, trimming beards, or giving shaves. ○ Clean and sterilize scissors, combs, clippers, and other instruments. ○ Clean tools or equipment ○ Manage and operate retail and service activities ○ Maintain inventory and procurement databases and act as cash collection agents
Education/ Training	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • 7-9 weeks in boot camp at the Great Lakes Naval Training Center in Illinois. Servicemembers learn the fundamentals of serving in the Navy—conditioning, marching, weaponry and other related skills. • Additionally, servicemembers spend 26 days in A-school training in Meridian, Mississippi, to learn the ins and outs of this rating
Qualifications	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • A combined score of 96 on the verbal (VE) and arithmetic reasoning (AR) portions of the Armed Services Vocational Aptitude Battery (ASVAB) tests is required.

Licensure Requirement – Military Experience Equivalency Notes

Experience Requirement	<p>Servicemember must demonstrate 1,250 hours of training as a requirement for licensure.</p> <p>Education and training attained during time of military service may count towards experience hour requirement.</p>
Education Requirement	<p>The servicemember must have an 8th grade education or equivalent as a requirement for licensure.</p>
Examination Requirement	<p>The servicemember must pass the practical and theoretical examinations as a requirement for licensure.</p>
