Dear Members of the Pennsylvania General Assembly:

June 30, 2001, marks the sixth anniversary of the enactment of the Pennsylvania Voter Registration Act (PVRA). The Pennsylvania Department of State continues to work diligently to implement, administer and enhance the procedures for carrying out the requirements of this Act. To that end, I am pleased to submit this report for the year 2000 on behalf of the Department of State and the 67 county elections and voter registration commissions, who share the responsibility of administering this Act.

During 2000, Pennsylvania counties accepted over one million applications for voter registration, which brought the Commonwealth's total voter registration population to a record of 7.8 million registered voters. Along with enhancing the procedures necessary for carrying out this Act, the Department of State continues its efforts to target voter registration and participation among younger voters and to encourage greater participation among all voters. This report outlines some of our outreach efforts.

The Ridge Administration has been working closely with the General Assembly as well as county officials to seek the best solution to improve the accuracy and integrity of the voter registration records across the Commonwealth. We are confident that an integrated voter registration system will make it easier to track voter registrations statewide, eliminate duplicates, reduce the potential for fraud and enable the 67 counties to more easily share and transfer information. The Department looks forward to continuing to work with the General Assembly to ensure the best possible system for Pennsylvania.

The November 2000 election shined an important light on elections across the nation. We commend the General Assembly for its leadership in convening the Joint Select Committee to Examine Election Issues and look forward to continuing to work with the Committee to assess and enhance the electoral process. We also look forward to sharing Governor Ridge's Voting Modernization Task Force recommendations in the fall of 2001. The Task Force, created by Executive Order 2001-3, is assessing the merits of the various voting systems.

We hope you find this Annual Report informative and useful as you review the progress that continues to be made administering this Act. We are proud of our accomplishments in providing voter registration to the citizens of Pennsylvania, and look forward to the challenges that lie ahead.

## **2000 Report to the General Assembly on the Pennsylvania Voter Registration Act**

June 30, 2001, marks the sixth anniversary of the signing of the Pennsylvania Voter Registration Act (PVRA). This important event brings with it a six-year legacy of improving the voter registration process through implementation and administration of the Act. The Department of State has worked diligently with the 67 county election offices, Commonwealth agencies designated with voter registration responsibilities, the public and the affected state and local agencies, to fulfill the requirements of the PVRA. In 2000, the number of registered voters in Pennsylvania increased to 7,781,997 and with that, an increase in our responsibilities of ensuring effective and efficient administration of the PVRA. To that end, the following represents a summary of several important aspects of PVRA.

### **Department of Transportation**

The Department of State continues to work closely with the Department of Transportation (PENNDOT) in the administration of the motor voter requirements of the PVRA. The PVRA provides the opportunity for citizens of the Commonwealth to complete an application and register to vote while receiving or renewing their photo license. Through this convenient process, nearly 400,000 Pennsylvania citizens chose to make application to register to vote at the Commonwealth's photo licensing centers during calendar year 2000.

### **New Voter Registration/Photo License Contract**

In addition to our combined efforts to offer voter registration opportunities to the citizens of Pennsylvania, the Departments of State and Transportation partnered in a joint Request For Proposal to contract for the operation of the photo license and voter registration programs. To that end, the Commonwealth selected Viisage Technologies to offer the latest in photo license and voter registration technological services. The Departments of State and Transportation expect full implementation of the new system by the fall of 2001.

While our Departments changed the contracted motor voter vendor this year, we took the opportunity to update the PENNDOT voter registration application process as well. Both Departments spent several months analyzing and reviewing options to make the motor voter process more user-friendly while addressing concerns regarding a citizen's right to make application to register to vote.

Among the most significant screen changes will be the affirmation of an individual's qualifications to make application to register to vote. The procedure for the last five years asked individuals to affirm their qualifications to make application to register to vote at the end of the motor voter process. In order to expedite the process and decrease the potential for duplicate voter registrations, individuals will now be asked at

the beginning of the process to declare themselves either registered or unregistered voters in Pennsylvania. If the individual declares himself or herself as unregistered, and they accept the opportunity to make application to register to vote, they will immediately be asked to affirm their qualifications to make application to register to vote, including declaring that they are a citizen of the United States, a resident of Pennsylvania and their election district for at least 30 days. PENNDOT's system automatically screens for citizens who will be at least 18 years of age on or before the next election.

If the citizen answers no to any of the qualifications, they will not be permitted to make application to register to vote. This change should reduce the potential for duplicate voter registrations, as well as maintain a higher degree of oversight of potentially fraudulent applications.

In addition to the affirmation screen, both Departments have made the remaining screens in the process are more user-friendly and informative. All of these changes will assist the counties in maintaining more accurate voter registration rolls while decreasing the incidence of fraud.

The Departments of State and Transportation are in continual communication to update and enhance all motor voter related brochures, Change of Address phone centers, and web-based information to further ensure the reliability and accuracy of the voter registration rolls in Pennsylvania. The most significant of these are the changes made to the receipt given to the applicant at the end of the motor voter process.

The motor voter receipt was initiated in 1997 to provide proof of a citizen's application to register to vote at one of the 98 photo license centers in the Commonwealth. While this receipt made for easier research and decision-making regarding a citizen's voter registration status, the new receipt will include additional language that should greatly improve the motor voter process, including where to find county voter registration contact numbers and a reminder to keep the receipt as proof of having made application to register to vote. Examples of the previous and new receipts may be found at the end of this report.

In 2000, the Departments of State and Transportation continued to provide a brochure to assist consumers in their understanding of the voter registration process at the photo license centers. The brochure was distributed to members of the legislature, county voter registration offices and other offices responsible for voter registration. The illustrated brochure is a systematic guide of the motor voter process.

### **Making Application to Register to Vote at the Photo License Centers**

The following procedures are followed when applying to register to vote at PENNDOT:

- PENNDOT customers arrive at a photo license center with a driver's license application card that contains a printed two-dimensional bar code. The bar code is scanned and the computer evaluates the age of the customer. PENNDOT's computer

system determines which customers will be at least eighteen years old by the date of the next election and asks whether they wish to register to vote. Customers who choose to apply for registration are asked to confirm their county of residence, indicate a party preference (if they have one) and type their telephone number and race, both of which are optional. The applicant is advised of the penalty for furnishing false information and is asked to sign, on an electronic keypad, a declaration that the information is true and correct to the best of the applicant's knowledge. Applicants receive a receipt indicating pertinent information about their application to register to vote. This receipt serves as a direct link to the Department of Transportation in the event of a voter registration application problem. Citizens and county election officials continue to report the usefulness of this receipt in tracking down data to complete the voter registration application process.

- The PENNDOT computer system stores the completed voter registration applications and transmits the data to the contracted vendor where the applications are electronically sorted by county, printed and mailed to the appropriate county voter registration office.

In 2000, nearly 400,000 motor voter applications were forwarded to county voter registration officials. In addition to these applications, PENNDOT provides change of address information to the Department of State, which is then forwarded to the appropriate county voter registration office. In 2000, the Department of State transmitted nearly one million changes of addresses to county voter registration officials.

### **Agency Registration**

The Department of State continued to work with the state-operated public assistance agencies and disability agencies who provided voter registration opportunities to their clients, throughout 2000. These agencies include:

County Assistance Offices, Clerk of Orphan's Court and Marriage License Bureaus, Armed Forces Recruitment Centers, Women, Infants & Children nutrition clinics, District Offices of the Office of Vocational Rehabilitation, District Offices of the Bureau of Blindness & Visual Services, State Mental Hospitals and State Mental Retardation Centers, the Area Agencies on Aging, Contractors for the Bureau of Blindness & Visual Services, Centers for Independent Living, County Mental Health and Mental Retardation Offices, Student Disability Services Offices of the State System of Higher Education, the Offices of Special Education and Complementary Paratransit offices.

To assist these agencies, the Department of State continues to offer a guide which details the responsibilities and duties of mandated voter registration agencies. In addition to the guide, the Department of State furnishes each agency with voter registration mail application forms, posters encouraging voter registration and brochures describing the voter registration process for distribution to their clients. The Department of State conducted training sessions and provided technical assistance to agencies. These

agencies provide for over 1,500 additional sites where Pennsylvania citizens may make application to register to vote.

### **Agency Recognition**

In 2000, the Department of State continued its efforts to recognize those agencies that implement the requirements of voter registration. *The Agency Recognition Program* acknowledges the services provided by Commonwealth voter registration agencies and their employees. The first step of the program requires each agency site which offers voter registration opportunities to complete a self-assessment checklist and return it to the Department of State. The Secretary of the Commonwealth then presents the office with a Voter Registration Achievement Certificate for participating in the *Agency Recognition Program*.

### **Litigation Update**

#### **National Voter Registration Act Cases Concluded in Federal District Court**

On August 23, 2000, the Department of State signed the final stipulation agreement with the United States Justice Department and the private plaintiffs in the cases of *Association of Community Organizations for Reform Now (ACORN) v. Ridge*, Civil Action No. 94-CV-7671 (E.D. Pa. 2000) and *United States v. Commonwealth*, Civil Action No. 95-CV-381 (E.D. Pa. 2000). On January 14, 2000, Judge Buckwalter ruled that the Commonwealth had violated the National Voter Registration Act (NVRA) by failing to designate state-funded ADA Complementary paratransit authorities as voter registration agencies and ordered the Commonwealth to designate the authorities as voter registration agencies so as to require them to provide voter registration opportunities to persons with disabilities who are served through the authorities. The stipulation agreement implemented the court's ruling by requiring the paratransit authorities to make Voter Registration Mail Application Forms available to applicants for paratransit services. The stipulation agreement also required the distribution of voter registration information to paratransit riders throughout the Commonwealth prior to the October 7, 2000, deadline to register to vote before the November 7, 2000, general election.

As a cost-saving measure, the stipulation agreement permitted the distribution of generic voter registration information, posters and brochures at regional training sessions conducted by the Departments of State and Transportation rather than mailing this information to the 37 paratransit providers located throughout the Commonwealth. The final opinion and stipulation agreement conclude the outstanding issues remaining from this litigation, thus closing this case.

#### **Felony Conviction Cases Resolved**

On December 26, 2000, Judge Doyle of the Commonwealth Court entered an order in the case of *Mixon v. Commonwealth*, 384 M.D. 1999 (Pa. Cmwlth. 2000) providing for a permanent injunction on the felony conviction prohibition on registering to vote, as contained in the PVRA. Under the order, the court enjoined the following

provisions of the PVRA: sections 501(a), 525(b)(4) and 527(a)(4)(iii) and (b)(1)(iv), at 25 P.S. §§ 916.501(a), 961.525(b)(4) and 961.527(a)(4)(iii) and (b)(1)(iv). As a result of the court's permanent injunction order, convicted felons were allowed to make application to register to vote with the appropriate county registration commission once they have been released from prison.

Furthermore, to save taxpayer funds, the Department was able to use the current Voter Registration Mail Application (VRMA) forms by allowing convicted felons to sign a VRMA form and strike out the language found at Section 9(2) on the VRMA form until new VRMA forms are printed. Due to the depletion of its supply of VRMA forms, the Department of State has ordered new VRMA forms that omit the previous language regarding the felony conviction prohibition. As required by the court order, the Department of State immediately sent the 67 county boards of elections a copy of the court's order and informed them that they could now accept VRMA forms from convicted felons in the manner described above.

The Department of State also promptly placed a notice of the court's order on its website as well as in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* on January 27, 2001. In addition, the Department of Transportation will change its voter registration screens at photo license centers by September 1, 2001, to implement the court's order.

On September 29, 2000, the Commonwealth Court had issued a preliminary injunction, which was similar in nature to the permanent injunction. That injunction allowed convicted felons to register to vote for the November 7, 2000, general election. Both of the injunctions were issued as a result of the Commonwealth Court issuing an opinion in this case, published at 759 A.2d 442, in which the Court ruled that the previous method in the PVRA of prohibiting convicted felons from registering to vote for five years was unconstitutional.

### **Voter Registration Records Case Issued**

On May 15, 2000, in the case of *Hessley v. Campbell*, 1375 C.D. 1999 (Pa. Cmwlth. 2000), the Commonwealth Court held that "where a county maintains a computerized 'street list,' the county is obligated to distribute that 'street list' to a political entity, on diskettes when so requested, at no charge." Sections 307, 703 and 704 of the PVRA, at 25 P.S. §§ 961.307, 961.703 and 961.704, address making voter registration records available to the public, candidates and political committees.

### **Legislative Initiatives**

The Department of State continues to work closely with the General Assembly regarding the administration of the Act. We continue to support legislation which would allow for the cancellation of registered deceased voters from information obtained from newspaper obituaries; notification from relatives; knowledge by voter registration staff of a death; and other sources. Currently, the PVRA only allows for the cancellation of a deceased voter whose name appears on a list provided by the Pennsylvania Department of Health. If this legislation is passed by the General Assembly and signed by the

Governor, it would provide a tremendous opportunity for county election staff to update their voter registration lists.

Throughout 2000, we continued to keep an open dialogue between our Department and members of the General Assembly and legislative staff, regarding the administration of this Act. After several meetings with county election officials and attendance at their 2000 conferences by Department of State staff, we have compiled the following suggestions for consideration by the General Assembly. These changes will make enforcement of the PVRA, and other related election laws, easier and more efficient in serving the citizens of the Commonwealth. (At the time of this report some provisions were included in pending legislation.)

#### **Suggested Amendments to the PVRA:**

- Clarify that voters who move may use the "fail-safe" provisions only one time.
- Clarify that the "ten-day" rule does not apply to those voters who circulate or sign nomination petitions or papers.
- Include a deadline for changes of address received by the Department of Transportation to be effective for the next election.
- Eliminate the requirement that the Secretary of the Commonwealth set fees for public lists, which are prepared and distributed by the counties.
- Change the requirement that counties provide for computer inquiries about registered voters into an option.

#### **Voter Outreach Efforts**

In our ongoing efforts to provide easier and more widely available voter registration opportunities to the citizens of Pennsylvania, the Department of State now provides an approved Voter Registration Application (VRA) available for downloading on our web site ([www.dos.state.pa.us](http://www.dos.state.pa.us)). Now, a citizen can download, print, complete, sign and send the form to the county voter registration office of their residence. In the first two months of making the VRA available on line, nearly 4,000 citizens downloaded the form.

#### **September Voter Participation and Awareness Month**

The Department of State again celebrated the voter registration and electoral processes as Governor Ridge proclaimed September 2000 Voter Participation and Awareness Month. During the month of September, the Department of State sponsored programs like "Vote with a Vet" at schools across the Commonwealth.

#### **State System of Higher Education**

The Department of State and the 14 State System of Higher Education universities partnered in September 2000 to conduct a voter registration drive on each of the campuses. The month-long drive to sign up student voters was highlighted by various



activities held on the campuses during the week of September 16-23, which the State System's Board of Student Government Presidents (BSGP) designated as Voter Registration Week. The successful campaign has registered over 5500 new Pennsylvania voters, who were eligible to cast ballots in the November 7 General Election.

### **Vote With a Vet Program**

The Department of State has worked diligently to encourage citizens to participate in the electoral process, particularly the young. To that end, the Department, under Governor Ridge's direction, created a unique voter registration program. The *Vote With a Vet . . . Register & Vote Program* in its second year of operation gathers detailed biographies of Pennsylvania veterans. These biographies, along with a voter registration form, are sent to participating *Vote With a Vet* Pennsylvania schools. Last year, the Department of State, in cooperation with the Departments of Education and Military and Veterans Affairs, sent over 10,000 voter registration forms and biographies to age-eligible students. *Vote With a Vet* is the latest effort of the administration to reverse the trend of voter apathy, especially among those 18 to 35 years of age.

Through *Vote With a Vet*, students not only learn an important history lesson from the veterans who served, they also learn about the connection between their right to vote and the sacrifice of Pennsylvania's veterans.

### **Student Mock Election**

In 2000, the Department of State and the Department of Education, sponsored the 2000 Student Mock Election. Over 400,000 students from more than 1,300 schools across Pennsylvania signed up for the program. Most of the participating schools chose to submit their vote totals via the Department's Mock Election web site. The Departments provided a Teacher's Manual to assist educators in administering the 2000 Student Mock Election.

### **Take Your Kids to Vote**

The Department of State also participated in the national "Take your Kids to Vote" campaign, which urges parents, grandparents and guardians to involve children in the electoral process by talking to them about the issues and the candidates and by taking them to the polls on Tuesday, Nov. 7, General Election Day. Sponsored by the Council for Excellence in Government, "Take Your Kids to Vote" addresses the findings of a 1999 survey by the National Association of Secretaries of State (NASS). The survey found that, in the 1996 presidential election, young people aged 18 to 24 whose parents voted regularly were twice as likely to vote as their peers.

### **PA Voter Hall of Fame**

Administered by the Department of State, the Pennsylvania Voter Hall of Fame program was established to generate increased awareness and encourage Pennsylvanians to exercise their right to vote.

This program publicly honors Pennsylvanians who have voted in every November election for 50 consecutive years or more, and invites them to share their stories. In turn, the men and women of the Voter Hall of Fame become ambassadors for voter participation, encouraging others to participate in the democratic process.

In September of 1997, the Department of State and the Pennsylvania Historical and Museum Commission dedicated the Pennsylvania Voter Exhibit and Voter Hall of Fame. Located within the main offices of the Department of State in Harrisburg, the exhibit documents the state's political heritage. The names of those Pennsylvanians inducted into the Voter Hall of Fame are added to a book, which is part of the permanent exhibit.

The Department also maintains a database of inductees, which can be found on its website at [www.dos.state.pa.us](http://www.dos.state.pa.us). Since 1995, ceremonies have been conducted in 32 counties.

- Appendix I contains voter registration figures by county and political party as of December 31, 2000.
- Appendix II contains a comparison of voter registration totals from 1998 - 2000 as of the close of registration prior to each November Election. REP: Republican Party, DEM: Democratic Party, INC: Increase in party registration, DEC: Decrease in party registration.
- Appendix III contains data for the various voter registration methods. Total applications include new registrations, changes of address, changes of name or party regardless of whether the application was valid, rejected or a duplicate. Valid applications include only new registration applications which were accepted by the county voter registration commissions. This appendix includes a column chart depicting various methods of application from 1998- 2000.

- Appendix IV contains data relative to list maintenance activities in the counties for the period covered by this report. These activities include the number of changes of address received from PENNDOT and processed, the number of address verification notices mailed in accordance with Section 1901 (d)(2) of the PVRA, the number of five year notices mailed and the number of responses to these notices, the number of registration files marked inactive at the end of 2000, and the number of active and inactive voter

registrations which were canceled. (The “ motor voter” litigation settlement agreement permits the counties to send out five year notices in accordance with Section 1901 (b)(3) of the PVRA.) In some instances the five year notices were mailed in the prior calendar year and the responses to the notice received in 2000.

- Appendix V contains data for “motor voter” applications broken down by political party. This information is provided directly from DataCard Corporation, the contracted vendor who processes the applications for the Departments of State and Transportation. These statistics relate to the number of individuals who applied to register to vote at a photo license center. Because it is a centralized computer process, statistics can be provided by political party. Also, the total number of applications as provided by DataCard may differ from the counties’ total applications received from PENNDOT for a variety of reasons, including not having been received by the counties until the next reporting period.
- Appendix VI contains the number of changes of address received by PENNDOT which were forwarded to the county voter registration commissions. These numbers differ from the numbers the counties report (Appendix IV) because they include all changes reported to PENNDOT regardless of whether or not the individual was registered.
- Appendix VII depicts a pie chart listing the distribution of the voter registration mail application.

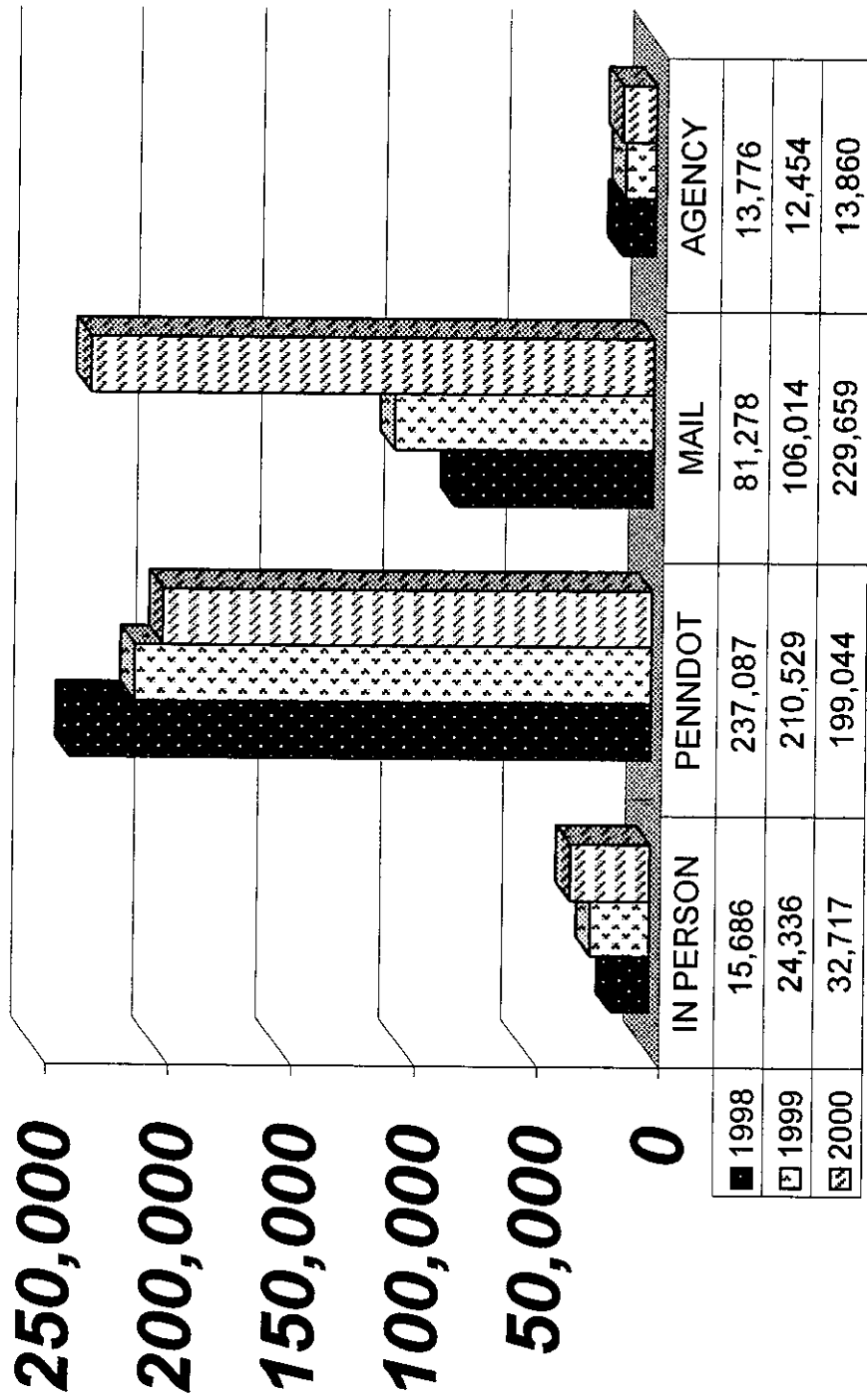

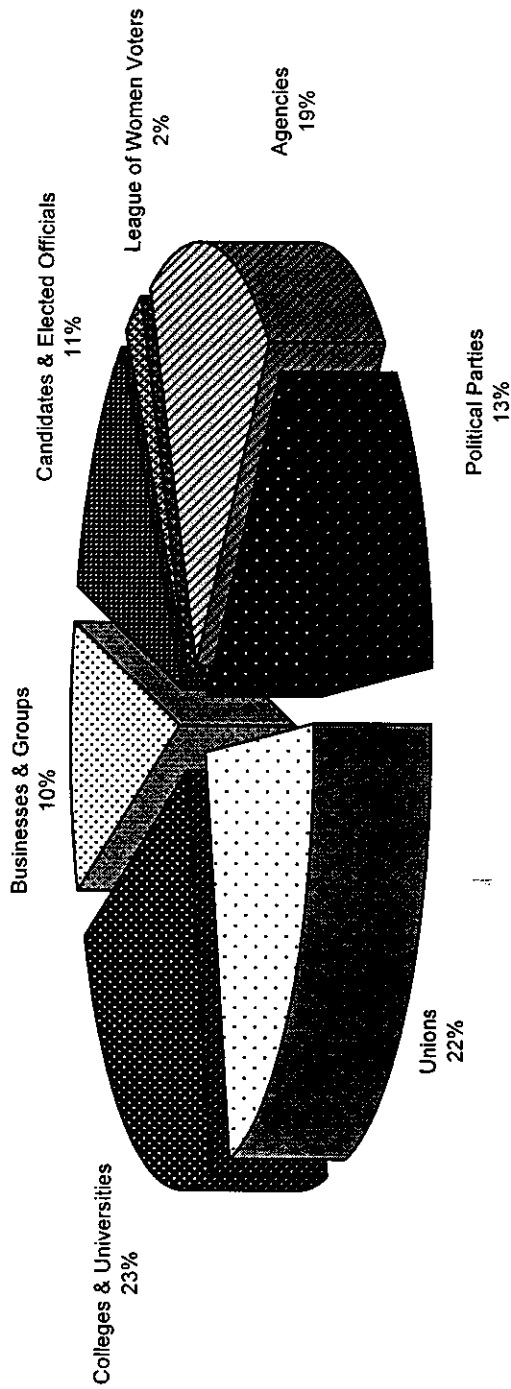
