Members of the General Assembly:

As Secretary of the Commonwealth, I am pleased to report to you on the administration of voter registration in Pennsylvania for the calendar year 2004.

In 2004, our partnership with the county elections and voter registration commissions and personnel involved in agency based voter registration programs resulted in the addition of 1,004,812 voters to the voter registration rolls.

The Department continued its work in administering the agency-based voter registration programs as required under the National Voter Registration Act. Additionally, we offered training and supplies to those agencies.

The past year saw the continued implementation of Act 3 of 2002 (Statewide Uniform Registry of Electors – SURE) and the federal Help America Vote Act (HAVA). SURE establishes a statewide voter registration database and requires Pennsylvania's 67 counties to be on the system. Before January 2004, six counties were "live" on the database. Since January 2004, 50 of the remaining 61 counties went "live" for a total of 56 counties.

The Department of State is committed to fulfilling its responsibilities under HAVA. This includes promoting voter registration, awareness and outreach activities across the Commonwealth.

The Administration of Voter Registration in Pennsylvania
2004 Report to the General Assembly

In 2004, the Department of State worked closely with the 67 county voter registration offices, Commonwealth agencies designated with voter registration responsibilities, the public, voter registration advocacy groups and the affected state and local agencies to administer voter registration in Pennsylvania. This report represents a summary of initiatives and statistics that support the administration of voter registration throughout Pennsylvania.

Department of Transportation

Since 1995, the Pennsylvania Department of Transportation (PENNDOT) has played an integral role in the voter registration process. PENNDOT provides Commonwealth citizens with an opportunity to apply to register to vote while receiving or renewing their driver's license at a PENNDOT photo license center. In 2004, more than 300,000 individuals chose to apply to register to vote using this resource.

Application Process to Register to Vote at a Photo License Center

- PENNDOT customers visit a photo license center with a driver's license application card, provided by PENNDOT, that contains a printed two-dimensional bar code. The bar code is scanned, and the computer system determines the age of the customer. It then determines which customers will be at least eighteen years old by the date of the next election and asks if the customer wishes to apply to register to vote.
- The program is designed to ask a customer if he or she is already registered to vote. If not, he or she is provided the opportunity to apply to register.
- The computer screens allow a customer to view the qualifications a citizen of Pennsylvania must meet to continue with the application.
- A customer who chooses to apply for voter registration is asked to confirm his or her county of residence, indicate a party preference, and type his or her telephone number and race, both of which are optional.
- The customer is advised of the penalty for furnishing false information and is asked to sign a declaration that the information is true and correct to the best of his or her knowledge.
- The customer is provided with a receipt indicating pertinent information about his or her voter registration application, including the date on which he or she applied at the photo license center. The receipt instructs the customer to contact his or her county

voter registration office if he or she does not receive a voter identification card within two weeks.

The PENNDOT computer system stores the completed voter registration applications and transmits the data to the contracted vendor. The vendor electronically sorts the applications by county and prints and mails them to the appropriate county voter registration office. In 2004, the vendor, Viisage, forwarded 304,493 “motor voter” applications to county voter registration officials.

PENNDOT provides change of address information to the Department of State. The Department forwards the information to the appropriate county voter registration office. In 2004, the Department of State forwarded 851,578 changes of address to county voter registration officials.

Agency Registration

In 2004, the Department of State continued to work with state-operated public assistance agencies and disability agencies to provide voter registration opportunities to clients. The following agencies participated:

County Assistance Offices; Clerk of Orphans’ Court and Marriage License Bureaus; Armed Forces Recruitment Centers; Women, Infants, and Children Nutrition Clinics; District Offices of the Office of Vocational Rehabilitation; District Offices of the Bureau of Blindness and Visual Services; State Mental Health Hospitals and State Mental Retardation Centers; the Area Agencies on Aging; Contractors for the Bureau of Blindness and Visual Services; Centers for Independent Living; County Mental Health and Mental Retardation Offices; Student Disability Services Offices of the State System of Higher Education; the Offices of Special Education; and Complementary Para-transit Offices.

To assist these agencies, the Department of State continues to provide “A Guide to Agency-Based Voter Registration,” a publication that details the responsibilities of a mandated voter registration agency. In addition to the guide, the Department of State provides each agency with voter registration mail application forms, posters encouraging voter registration and a brochure, “Your Vote is Your Voice,” which describes the voter registration process.

The Department of State also conducts training sessions and provides technical assistance to agencies when needed. These agencies provide approximately 1,500 additional sites where individuals are offered the opportunity to apply to register to vote.

Agency Recognition Program

In 2004, the Department of State continued to recognize agencies that offer voter registration opportunities. The *Agency Recognition Program* was designed to acknowledge the services provided by Commonwealth voter registration agencies and their employees. The program requires each agency voter registration site to complete a self-assessment checklist and return it to the Department of State. If the checklist shows that the agency is providing all the

required voter registration services, the Secretary of the Commonwealth then presents the agency with a Voter Registration Certificate of Achievement.

Legal

Litigation

During 2004, Pennsylvania courts relied extensively on voter registration records of county voter registration commissions to confirm addresses and signatures of registered voters on nomination petitions and papers. In the notable case of *In re Nomination Paper of Nader*, 865 A.2d 8, 121, 128 & 135 (Pa. Cmwlth. Ct.), *aff'd*, 860 A.2d 1 (Pa. 2004), *cert. denied*, 125 S. Ct. 884 (2005), the Commonwealth Court of Pennsylvania not only used voter registration records to confirm addresses and signatures of registered voters who signed Mr. Nader's nomination papers, but for those counties using the SURE system, the court used the data in the SURE system as the official record of the county's voter registration records.

Likewise, in *In re Nomination Petition of Brown*, 846 A.2d 783 (Pa. Cmwlth. Ct. 2004), the Commonwealth Court also used the county's voter registration records to determine the political party, address and signature of individuals who signed nomination petitions for a candidate for the Pennsylvania Senate.

Also in 2004, the Commonwealth Court of Pennsylvania found that at least one county had not updated its voter registration records, as required by Act 3 of 2002, after implementation of "911" address changes. See *In re Nomination Petition of Roth*, No. 121 M.D. 2004 (Pa. Cmwlth. Ct. March 8, 2004). (Section 1203(k)(3) of Title 25 of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, 25 Pa.C.S. §1203(k)(3), provides that county voter registration commissions must "correct its registration records without requiring action of a registered elector . . . [i]f the mailing address of the registered elector has changed by the renaming of a street, the renumbering of a house or the changing of a post office.")

Once the *Roth* case was decided, the Bureau of Commissions, Elections and Legislation requested each county comply with this statutory requirement. To be in compliance, the county voter registration commission must update the voter registration for each registered voter whose address is affected by the renaming of a street, the renumbering of a house or the changing of a post office - even if the voter has not reported the change. Compliance with this statute is important because any discrepancy between the address an elector has placed on a nomination petition and the address that is listed on that voter's registration is sufficient to cause that signature to be stricken by a court if the signature is challenged on objection to a nomination petition or nomination paper. Because many voters likely are not aware that they should report such a change to the county voter registration commission, it is important that the registration commission institute measures to be in compliance with this statute.

On May 13, 2004, the Commonwealth Court rendered an important decision related to the concern that some county election officials describe as "convenience voting," whereby an elector continues to vote in an election district after he or she has removed residence from the election district. In *Commonwealth v. Cosentino*, 850 A.2d 58 (Pa. Cmwlth. Ct.), *appeal*

denied, 863 A.2d 1149 (Pa. 2004), the court affirmed the conviction of an individual who had voted illegally in an election district where he did not reside and in which he was not legally authorized to vote. The individual, who had moved twice after his initial registration, never notified the county board of elections of his change of address and his registration at the old address was not cancelled. In 2001, the individual voted at his old polling place and signed the affidavit in the poll book stating that he was qualified to vote in that election district and resided at the address named in the poll book. In affirming the trial court's conviction of the individual, the Commonwealth Court determined that the individual violated section 1833 of the Pennsylvania Election Code, 25 P.S. § 3533, when he voted in the election knowing that he did not possess the qualifications to vote in that election district. The Commonwealth Court's opinion should serve as a powerful deterrent to "convenience voting."

In a case brought in the United States District Court for the Eastern District of Pennsylvania, the District Court noted the decision made by the Delaware County Voter Registration Commission to deny access to its voter registration records because these records could not be used for purposes of a lawsuit regarding an auto accident. *See Camper v. Dhillon*, C.A. No. 03-05043-JF, 2004 WL 2166276 (E.D.Pa. November 9, 2004).

Legislation

Federal and State Laws on Voter Registration

On October 29, 2002, President George W. Bush signed into law the Help America Vote Act of 2002 (HAVA). The main objective of HAVA is the uniform and non-discriminatory administration of elections. HAVA contains several provisions related to voter registration, including provisional voting in section 302 (as discussed further below), and a section requiring a computerized statewide voter registration list and identification requirements for voters who register to vote by mail (section 303). *See* 42 U.S.C. §§ 15482 & 15483.

Before the enactment of HAVA, Pennsylvania had already laid the groundwork for a statewide computerized voter registration network known as the Statewide Uniform Registry of Electors (SURE) via Act 3 of 2002. Immediately after the enactment of HAVA, Act 150 of 2002 incorporated many requirements of HAVA into the Pennsylvania Election Code. Act 97 of 2004 made additional amendments to procedures applicable to provisional ballots, as noted below.

Implementation of the Help America Vote Act, Act 150 of 2002 and Act 97 of 2004

HAVA requires that "provisional voting" be permitted in federal elections for those voters whose names do not appear on the district register (poll book) list of registered voters, if a voter is unable to produce identification where required or if the election official asserts the voter is ineligible. The voted ballot or written affirmation information must be transmitted to the appropriate local election official for verification. If the information is verified, the ballot is counted. Each state is required to provide a free access system (*e.g.*, secure, confidential telephonic or Internet-based system that restricts access to information) so that the voter who voted a provisional ballot might determine her or his individual ballot status. During the November 2004 General Election, 56,558 provisional ballots were cast. Voters were able to

call a toll-free telephone number maintained by the Department or access a Department website to determine the status of their provisional ballot.

Act 97 of 2004 amended several aspects of the Pennsylvania Election Code, including provisions regarding poll watchers, provisional ballots, automatic recount procedures for statewide elections and the return of election materials to county boards of elections after the polls close. Effective October 8, 2005, changes in Act 97 regarding provisional ballots include requiring individuals who cast a provisional ballot to note the reason for casting a provisional ballot on the required affidavit; increasing from three to seven the number of days for a county to examine provisional ballots to determine if the individual is entitled to vote in the election; allowing candidate and party authorized representatives to challenge provisional ballots through specific procedures; requiring county boards of elections to determine that individuals casting provisional ballots have not cast any other ballot in that election; and clarifying the reasons for counties not counting provisional ballots.

After the 2004 General Primary, the Department contracted with an advertising agency to conduct a statewide voter education effort for the 2004 General Election. The agency integrated television, radio, and print advertisements, billboards, comprehensive voter guides, pamphlets, an instructional video, a new website, and various public events into the voter education program. According to the advertising agency, the Department's voter education message of "Ready.Set.Vote." reached over nine million Pennsylvanians prior to Election Day. This initiative was conducted both in English and Spanish. "Ready.Set.Vote." and other voter education initiatives received positive reviews from most county personnel, advocacy groups and the public.

Implementation of Act 3 of 2002: The Statewide Uniform Registry of Electors (SURE)

SURE is a centralized voter registration and election management system designed to ensure the accuracy and integrity of the Commonwealth's voter registration records maintained by the election authorities of Pennsylvania's counties.

The SURE voter registration system is a computerized system that supports the critical functions of the Commonwealth's election system - from determining voter eligibility, to assigning precincts, to producing poll books. A centralized, uniform statewide registry that is accessible to all county voter registration offices greatly enhances the overall accuracy and integrity of the voter registration rolls and the resulting quality of voter services. By placing all Pennsylvania counties on a common system:

- Duplicate registrations among county files are presented to county election officials for resolution.
- When registered voters move across county lines, their existing records and voting history are identified to election officials for transfer to the new county of residence.
- External agency transactions from PENNDOT and the Department of Health (DOH) that affect voter eligibility are centrally integrated with SURE and electronically forwarded to county officials.

- Voter registry maintenance programs operate on a consistent statewide basis to remove “deadwood,” keeping the registry up-to-date, protecting against potential voter fraud, and promoting consistency among counties in their data management practices.

Pennsylvania’s Act 3 of 2002 sets forth the requirements for the SURE system, specifying that SURE must be a “single, uniform integrated computer system. All [voter registration] commissions shall be connected electronically to the SURE system and shall maintain their registration records in the system.”

The Help America Vote Act (HAVA) contains numerous requirements for improving the conduct of elections across the United States. One of these requirements is the establishment of a statewide voter registration system in each state, which must be “single, uniform, official, centralized, interactive computerized statewide voter registration list defined, maintained, and administered at the State level that contains the name and registration information of every legally registered voter in the State and assigns a unique identifier to each legally registered voter in the State...” (See § 303(a)(1)(A), 42 U.S.C. § 15483(a)(1)(A)). Some of HAVA’s requirements have necessitated modifications to the SURE system, and several more modifications required by HAVA are currently being pursued.

During the 2004 Primary and General Elections, the SURE system was live in 56 counties of the Commonwealth. The remaining 11 counties (Chester, Clinton, Delaware, Elk, Lackawanna, Lancaster, Montgomery, Northampton, Philadelphia, Schuylkill and York) are scheduled to be “live” on the system in 2005.

PENNDOT and the Department of Health are connected to SURE and regularly send records to counties through the system. Counties are now able to transfer records electronically through SURE, ensuring that voters’ history records remain with them when they move between counties. In addition, all live counties can check statewide for duplicate registrations in order to eliminate the possibility of voter fraud.

Also during 2004, the voter identification requirements of HAVA and Pennsylvania’s Act 150 of 2002 were incorporated into the SURE system, tracking those voters required to show identification and prompting a notification on the poll book when a voter is required to show identification. In addition, during 2004, the Department of State began providing the capability for counties to participate in the National Change of Address (NCOA) program through SURE. This process compares county voter records to the U.S. Postal Service’s change of address files in order to identify voters who may have moved and not informed their county voter registration office of the move. Thirty-seven counties participated in the NCOA match in 2004. The Department will continue to provide the NCOA match service via SURE on an annual basis to counties desiring to participate.

SURE Go-Forward Strategy

The Department’s plan for the remainder of 2005 completes the county rollout of SURE and incorporates several enhancements. The plan also calls for a series of performance tests that will ensure the system has the capacity to handle an increased volume when all counties are “live” on SURE. Following the successful completion of performance testing, the following enhancements will be implemented: improvements to the data entry process and absentee

ballot processing; inclusion of a report writer; addition of a Dynamic Import Process to allow for the electronic import of voter registration applications from other sources; incorporation of additional views of certain SURE data at the county and state level; addition of an Internet-based public view of a voter's own voter registration information; and several other improvements.

In addition, the Department is in the process of implementing the HAVA-mandated verification of driver's license and partial social security numbers through SURE. Beginning in January 2006, SURE will interface with PENNDOT and the Social Security Administration for the purpose of verifying these numbers on all new voter applications.

Over the course of 2005, as HAVA requirements are implemented in SURE and the system is "live" in the remaining counties, SURE will become the basis for continued improvements and future enhancements to the Commonwealth's election system.

Voter Outreach Efforts

Student Mock Election

The Commonwealth conducts the Student Mock Election Program, initiated in 1988, every two years during the General Election as an attempt to educate school-age youth about the voting process. Students participate in a mock election in their respective schools throughout the Commonwealth and vote for offices such as President and Vice President or Governor and Lieutenant Governor. The ballot also contains several ballot questions, including school and education-related issues, to promote and encourage participation in the program.

In 2004, with assistance from the National Student/Parent Mock Election and the Department of Education, the Department of State conducted the 2004 *Pennsylvania Student Mock Election Program*. More than 350 schools involving over 100,000 students participated in this program. Each participating school received a Teachers' Manual, prepared by the Department of State and the Department of Education, to assist in administering the Mock Election. The manual included suggested classroom activities by grade level and provided guidance on how to administer the Mock Election. Participating students voted for President, United States Senate and six ballot questions. Voting took place on October 28, 2004, though the reporting deadline was extended to November 2, 2004. Most schools chose to report their election results directly to the Department's Mock Election website, though other reporting methods available included telephone and facsimile.

Voter Registration Application Mailing to High School Seniors

In late May 2004, Governor Rendell and the Department of State initiated a voter registration program aimed at graduating high school seniors. Through this initiative, voter registration applications were sent to every public and private high school in the state. High school administrators were asked to deliver the applications to graduating high school seniors either before or during graduation ceremonies. The Department distributed over 151,000 voter

registration application forms to graduating seniors to increase the number of younger registered voters, a demographic that is historically underrepresented.

New Voter Guides

In 2004, the Department published two new brochures and placed the brochures on its website (www.dos.state.pa.us). The *Basic Guide to Student Voting in Pennsylvania*, aimed at college students, describes the procedures for voter registration and voting. It also includes a section on frequently asked questions. The brochure entitled *Voting Rights of Convicted Felons, Convicted Misdemeanants and Pretrial Detainees* addressed who can and cannot register to vote, how to register to vote and voting procedures.

Voter Registration Application on the Department's Website

In the Department's ongoing effort to provide easier and more widely available voter registration opportunities to the citizens of Pennsylvania, the Department of State provides an approved Voter Registration Application on our website. The form is available in two different formats. One format allows an applicant to download the form, complete it on screen, and print it with the information already populated. Once printed, the applicant must sign the form and send it to the appropriate county voter registration office. The other format allows an applicant to simply print the form. The applicant can then complete the required information, sign the form and send it to the appropriate county voter registration office.

Citizens may also request a Voter Registration Mail Application through the Department's website, via e-mail or by phone. Individuals requested 10,573 Voter Registration Mail Applications in this manner in 2004.

Voter Participation and Awareness Month

The Department of State proclaimed and celebrated the voter registration and electoral process by declaring September 2004 as "Voter Participation and Awareness Month."

Pennsylvania Voter Hall of Fame

The Pennsylvania Voter Hall of Fame program is administered by the Department of State and was established to generate awareness and encourage Pennsylvanians to exercise their right to vote.

This program publicly honors Pennsylvanians who have voted in every November Election for 50 consecutive years or more. The men and women of the Voter Hall of Fame serve as ambassadors for voter participation, encouraging others to participate in the democratic process. The Department maintains a database of inductees on its website.

- Appendix I contains voter registration figures by county and political party as of December 31, 2004.
- Appendix II contains a comparison of voter registration totals from 2002-2004 as of the close of registration prior to each November Election. REP: Republican Party; DEM: Democratic Party; INC: Increase in party registration; DEC: Decrease in party registration.
- Appendix III contains data for the various voter registration methods. Total applications include new registrations, changes of address and changes of name or party regardless of whether the application was valid, rejected or a duplicate. Valid applications include only new registration applications that were accepted by the county voter registration commissions. This appendix includes column charts. One depicts various methods of application from 2002-2004, and the other compares the number of total and valid applications.

- Appendix IV contains data relative to list maintenance activities in the counties for the period covered by this report. In addition to confirmation mailings and the National Change of Address Program, list maintenance activities include the number of changes of address received from PENNDOT and processed, the number of address verification notices mailed in accordance with Section 1901 (d)(2) of the PVRA, the number of five-year notices mailed and the number of responses to these notices, the number of registration files marked inactive at the end of 2004, and the number of active and inactive voter registrations which were cancelled. (The “motor voter” litigation settlement agreement permits the counties to send out five-year notices in accordance with Section 1901 (b)(3) of the PVRA.) In some instances the five year notices were mailed in the prior calendar year and the responses to the notice received in 2004.
- Appendix V contains data for “motor voter” applications by political party. This information is provided directly from DataCard/VIISAGE Corporation, the contracted vendor who processes the applications for the Department of State and PENNDOT. These statistics relate to the number of individuals who applied to register to vote at a photo license center. Because it is a centralized computer process, statistics can be provided by political party. The total number of applications provided by DataCard/VIISAGE may differ from the counties’ total applications received from PENNDOT for a variety of reasons, including not having been received by the counties until the next reporting period.
- Appendix VI contains the number of changes of address received by PENNDOT that were forwarded to the county voter registration commissions. These numbers differ from the numbers the counties report (Appendix IV) because they include all changes reported to PENNDOT regardless of whether or not the individual was registered.
- Appendix VII depicts a pie chart listing the distribution of the voter registration mail applications.

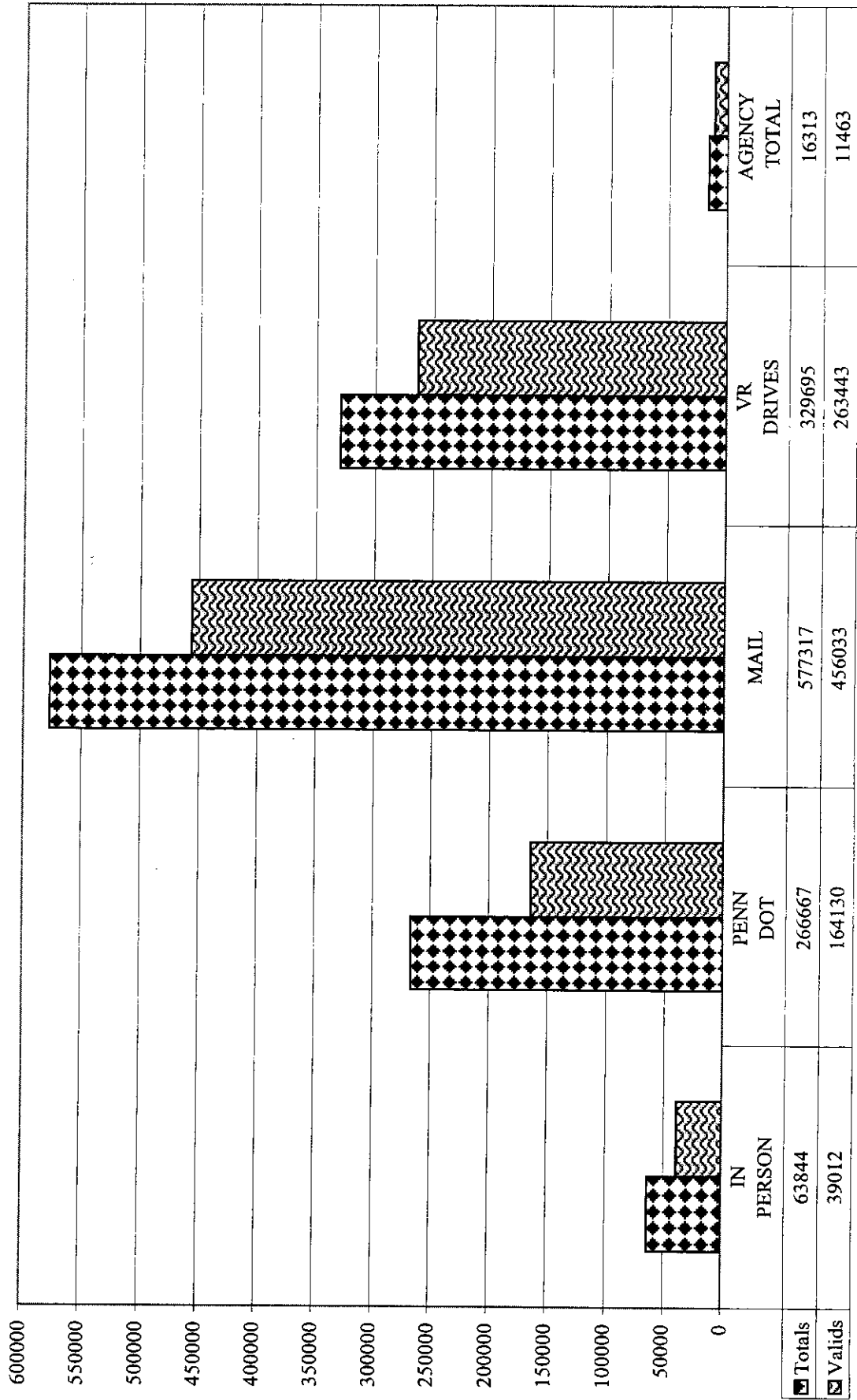

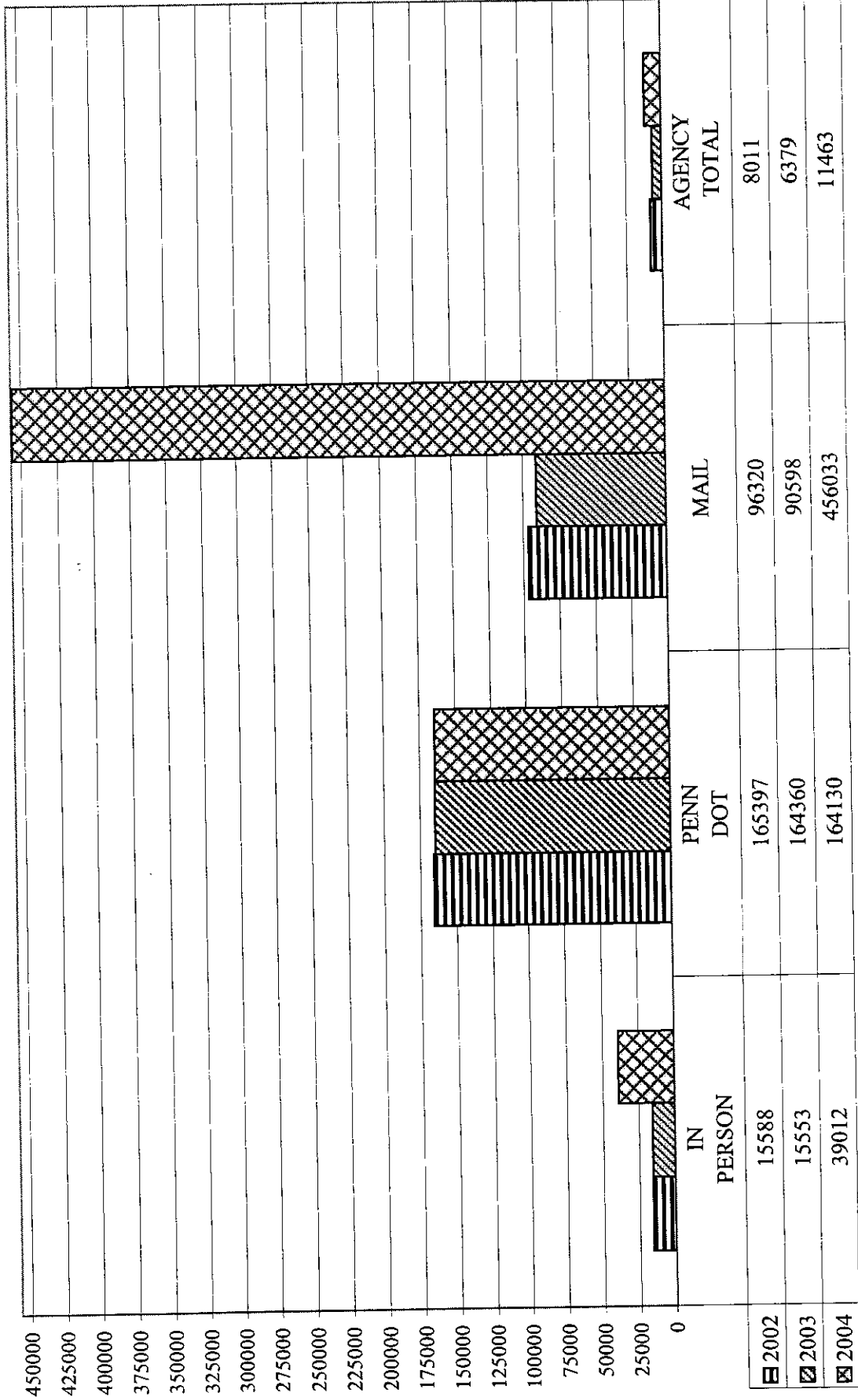
