Dear Members of the General Assembly:

As Acting Secretary of the Commonwealth, I am pleased to report to you on the administration of voter registration in Pennsylvania for calendar year 2009. I trust you will find the content of this report useful.

Throughout 2009 the Department of State (Department) maintained its ongoing partnership with the Commonwealth's sixty-seven county election boards and voter registration commissions. The Department has continued to collaborate with the Commonwealth agencies designated with responsibilities under the National Voter Registration Act of 1993 (NVRA) to administer voter registration programs. The Department supports the agencies in terms of providing needed supplies as well as conducting training sessions and informational meetings.

In accordance with Act 3 of 2002, the Department implemented improvements to the Statewide Uniform Registry of Electors (SURE) system and related county and public portals. Enhancements to the system have benefited the public as well as county and state election officials. SURE is and will continue to be integral to the success of Pennsylvania's electoral process well into the 21st Century.

The Department remains committed to fulfilling its responsibilities under the Help America Vote Act of 2002. Staff will maintain efforts to promote voter registration awareness and outreach activities across the Commonwealth.

The Administration of Voter Registration in Pennsylvania
2009 Report to the General Assembly**

The Department of State (Department) continues to work closely with many entities on the administration of voter registration activity. These entities include: the sixty-seven county voter registration offices, all Commonwealth agencies designated with voter registration responsibilities (state operated public assistance offices & agencies that serve people with disabilities), voter registration advocacy groups and the public. This report is a summary of all initiatives and statistics, as they relate to the administration of voter registration throughout Pennsylvania, in the calendar year of 2009.

Department of Transportation

Since 1995, the Pennsylvania Department of Transportation (PennDOT) has played an integral role in the voter registration process throughout the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania. PennDOT provides Commonwealth citizens with an opportunity to apply to register to vote while renewing or applying for a new driver's license at one of its photo license centers. In 2009, more than 221,000 individuals applied to register to vote using PennDOT.

Application Process to Register to Vote at a Photo License Center

- PennDOT customers visit a photo license center with a driver's license application card provided by PennDOT. The application card contains a printed two-dimensional bar code. The bar code is scanned, and the computer system determines the customer's age. It then determines which customers will be at least eighteen years old by the date of the next election and asks if the customer wishes to apply to register to vote;
- The program is designed to ask customers if they are currently registered to vote. If not, they are provided the opportunity to apply to register;
- Customers must view the qualifications a Pennsylvania citizen must meet to continue with the application;
- Customers who choose to apply for voter registration are asked to confirm their county of residence and indicate a party preference. The customer is asked for optional information (telephone number and race);
- Customers are advised of the penalty for furnishing false information and are asked to sign a declaration that the information they have provided is true and correct to the best of their knowledge;
- Customers are provided a receipt indicating pertinent information about their voter registration application, which includes the date on which they applied at the photo license center. The receipt instructs customers to contact their county voter registration office if they do not receive a voter identification card within two weeks.

The PennDOT computer system stores the completed voter registration applications and then transmits the data to the contracted vendor. The vendor sorts the applications by county and transmits them electronically to the appropriate county voter registration office. In 2009, the vendor forwarded 221,499 “motor voter” applications to county voter registration officials.

PennDOT also provides address change information to the Department. The Department forwards the information to the appropriate county voter registration office. In 2009, a total of 760,764 change of address applications were forwarded from the Department to county election officials.

Agency Registration

The 1993 National Voter Registration Act (NVRA) requires that “(1) Each state shall designate agencies for the registration of voters in elections for Federal offices. (2) Each state shall designate as voter registration agencies – (A) all offices of the state that provide public assistance; and (B) all offices in the State that provide State-funded programs primarily engaged in providing services to persons with disabilities.” In light of this Federal mandate, the Department continues to work with the required agencies to ensure that the requirements of the NVRA are being met.

As a means of ensuring that the required agencies are offering voter registration opportunities, the Department has printed pre-coded forms. The pre-coded forms were introduced in early 2009 and are being distributed, upon request, to the required agencies and their affiliates. All codes are kept confidential to protect the privacy of those individuals registering to vote through one of the required agencies. All county election directors have been instructed to have their staffs enter the agency-based code, which can be found on the left side of the form. With the pre-coded forms now in distribution, it is the Department’s goal that the agency based voter registration numbers will continue to increase. A summary of the activities for each required agency is illustrated in Appendix III.

In addition to the newly implemented pre-coded forms, the Department has continued the work it began in January 2008 to increase the reporting of statewide voter registration agency totals. The following activities have been accomplished as a means of complying with the NVRA. Due to the nature of the activities, no continued attention is needed:

- Redesigned the Voter Registration Mail Application form to enhance reporting by both agency and county voter registration offices by using forms that are pre-coded for each agency;
- Updated and re-designed the *Pennsylvania Guide To Agency-Based Voter Registration*;
- Contacted agency Secretaries across the Commonwealth and requested their assistance to see that every site has a coordinator and that the responsibility is

written into the appropriate position description. The Department pursued this in an effort to achieve ongoing continuity of service at all required sites.

The Department continues to pursue the following goals in order to comply with the NVRA:

- Provide ongoing training for agency coordinators;
- Meet with site coordinators, on an ongoing basis, from agencies for training purposes;
- Supply agencies with voter registration applications (pre-coded), informational pamphlets and posters;
- Contact other agency officials to designate additional employees to monitor and coordinate reporting of agency voter registration totals;
- Communicate with county voter registration officials, on an ongoing basis, about entering agency codes as they register new voters or update voter information;
- Communicate with the designated Agency Coordinators.

In 2009, the Department continued to work with state-operated public assistance agencies as well as agencies that serve people with disabilities to provide registration opportunities to clients. The following agencies participated:

- County Assistance Offices
- Area Agencies on Aging
- Clerk of Orphans' Court and Marriage License Bureaus
- Contractors for the Bureau of Blindness & Visual Services
- Armed Forces Recruitment Centers
- Centers for Independent Living
- Women, Infants and Children Nutrition Clinics
- County Mental Health & Mental Retardation Offices
- District Offices of the Office of Vocational Rehabilitation
- Student Disability Services Offices of the State System of Higher Education
- District Offices of the Bureau of Blindness & Visual Services
- Office of Special Education
- State Mental Health Hospitals & State Mental Retardation Centers
- Americans with Disabilities Act Complementary Para-transit Offices

To assist these agencies, the Department continues to provide each with a copy of the *Pennsylvania Guide to Agency-Based Voter Registration*. This publication details the responsibilities of a mandated voter registration agency. In addition to this guide, the Department provides each agency with Voter Registration Mail Applications, posters

encouraging voter registration and brochures, including the *Pennsylvania Voting Guide*, which describes the voter registration process.

The Department also conducts training sessions and provides technical assistance to agencies when needed. These agencies provide approximately 1,500 additional sites where individuals are offered the opportunity to apply to register to vote.

The Help America Vote Act (HAVA): Act 150 of 2002 and Act 97 of 2004

President George W. Bush signed the Help America Vote Act (HAVA) of 2002 into law on October 29, 2002. HAVA's main objective is uniform and non-discriminatory election administration. The Act contains several provisions related to voter registration, poll worker training and accessibility requirements. Such requirements extend to language and physical accessibility.

Pennsylvania enacted Act 150 of 2002 to incorporate many HAVA requirements into the Pennsylvania Election Code. Act 97 of 2004 made additional amendments to procedures applicable to provisional ballots, as noted below.

Distribution of HAVA Interest Grants

The Department, through its Division of HAVA, allocated \$14,728,816 from the Title I, Section 101 and Section 102 and Title II, Section 251. These funds were distributed to the 67 counties in the same percentages as the original HAVA funds as specified by the Pennsylvania State Plan. Although most of the funds were used for the payment of voting systems and maintenance agreements for the voting systems, these funds could be used for HAVA qualified expenditures such as:

- Complying with Title III
- Improving Administration of Federal Elections
- Educating Voters
- Staff and Volunteers
- Training Election Officials
- Improving Voting Systems
- Polling Place Accessibility
- Alternative Language Assistance, and
- Establishing a Toll-Free Hotline for Voters

HAVA Grants Training

The Department, through its Division of HAVA, attended the Election Officials Annual Conference in Monroe County in 2009. At the conference, the Department provided training to the election officials regarding the HAVA grants. The training was conducted in two parts: in-group where the general uses of grant funds were discussed and in one-on-one appointments. The Department created and distributed a handbook for all

attendees as a point of reference when completing their quarterly reports. In addition, the handbook was posted on a portion of our website accessible to only the Department personnel and county election officials.

Poll Worker/Election Official Training

To date the Department has created and distributed, to each of the sixty-seven counties, two original DVD's aimed at providing uniformed poll worker training. In 2009 the Department updated the original DVD to include content on emergency paper ballots and Spanish subtitles.

Polling Place Accessibility

Each of the sixty-seven counties are required to certify, annually, the accessibility status of their polling places. After receiving completed surveys from each of the sixty-seven the counties, the Department created and maintained a survey results database. The database allows the Department to allocate and distribute all Title II, Section 261 funds, in accordance to the needs of the individual counties. The Division of HAVA has started working with the Division of The Statewide Uniform Registry of Electors (SURE) to utilize the information that the counties enter into the SURE Portal (the SURE Portal will be explained in a later section). By working through the Division of SURE, the Division of HAVA will be able to obtain up-to-date information on the accessibility status of each county and subsequently reduce the workload of the counties. It is our hope that this combined effort will yield more accurate information, thus saving both time and money.

The Department applied for federal assistance and received \$443,387 in Title II, Section 261 funding for fiscal year 2009. The funds were disbursed in the following percentage: 97% for polling place accessibility, 1% for compliant voting systems, 1% for training election staff and 1% for voter information programs.

For fiscal years 2003 through 2009 the Commonwealth allocated a total of \$2,951,932 in Title II, Section 261 grants as follows:

- \$1,660,406 for making polling places accessible to individuals with the full range of disabilities. This includes the path of travel, entrances, exits and voting areas of each polling facility;
- \$454,390 for providing equal opportunity access and participation (including privacy and independence) to individuals with the full range of disabilities as for other voters;
- \$189,572 for training election officials, poll workers and election volunteers on how best to promote access for individuals with the full range of disabilities in elections for federal offices;

- \$189,562 for providing individuals with the full range of disabilities with information about polling place accessibility.

Alternative Language Assistance

Pursuant to Section 301 of HAVA, since 2005, the Department continues to translate all relevant voter materials into alternative languages. The VotesPA.com website is completely translated into Spanish, but also has key documents translated into Chinese, French, Korean, Khmer, Russian and Vietnamese.

The Statewide Uniform Registry of Electors (SURE); Act 3 of 2002

SURE is the centralized voter registration and election management system. The program assures the accuracy and integrity of the Commonwealth's voter registration records maintained by the election authorities of Pennsylvania's 67 counties. The SURE platform supports the critical functions of the Commonwealth's elections—from determining voter eligibility to assigning precincts to producing poll books. A centralized, uniform registry that is accessible to all county offices greatly enhances the overall accuracy and integrity of the voter registration rolls and the resulting quality of voter services.

Pennsylvania began development of its centralized voter registration system with the enactment of Act 2002-3 (Act 3). Act 3 set forth the requirements for the system, specifying that SURE must be a “single, uniform integrated computer system. All [voter registration] commissions shall be connected electronically to the SURE system and shall maintain their registration records in the system.” Act 3 also made a number of amendments to the voter registration act that make voter registration processes more amenable to electronic processing.

HAVA contains numerous requirements for improving the conduct of elections across the United States. One of these requirements is the establishment of a statewide voter registration system in each state, which must be a “single, uniform, official, centralized, interactive computerized statewide voter registration list defined, maintained, and administered at the State level that contains the name and registration information of every legally registered voter in the State and assigns a unique identifier to each legally registered voter in the State...” (See § 303(a)(1)(A), 42 U.S.C. § 15483(a)(1)(A)). The SURE system went “live” in all Pennsylvania counties prior to the January 1, 2006, HAVA deadline.

Following the completion of a Gap Analysis on the project in January 2007 to assess future needs, the Department decided to re-host the SURE system program. The primary objective of the SURE Re-hosting Project was to migrate the SURE system application from its outdated Microsoft Access platform to a more state-of-the-art technology based on the Microsoft .NET platform. The Re-hosted SURE system was deployed to production in December 2008, and improvements continued to be made to the system throughout 2009, enhancing the functionality and performance. The Commonwealth now

owns and maintains the SURE system programming code. This enables the Department to make enhancements to the system in the years ahead based on the needs of users and of the Commonwealth.

SURE Portal

It became apparent that as the SURE project developed and expanded over the past several years that there were many areas of voter registration and election management that could be addressed and improved outside of the SURE system. The Department embarked on the SURE Portal project in 2005 in order to pursue these opportunities, while taking advantage of the progress that has been made in the Commonwealth with the SURE system.

The overall goals of the SURE Portal are:

- To make use of SURE information to support an expanded array of services and functionality for county, agency, and public users;
- To move some critical county processes outside of the SURE environment, optimizing performance for the official registration system;
- To make SURE information more readily available for county, agency and public use and reference;
- To provide streamlined, electronic processes to county offices to support voter registration and elections;
- To make voter registration and election information available to the public via the Internet.

Three separate functional areas make up the SURE Portal: the Public Portal, the County Portal and the Agency Portal.

On the SURE Public Portal (available at www.pavoterservices.state.pa.us), voters may:

- Search for and view their own registration and polling place information, including directions to their polling place;
- Print a voter registration application and absentee ballot request form;
- Access valuable information regarding the elections process in their own counties, including information on voting systems and county-specific office information, polling place information, news, FAQs, events and links;
- Search for the status of their absentee ballot requests;
- Search for the status of their provisional ballots;
- Participate in a threaded online discussion;
- Search for a *Voter Hall of Fame* inductee.

Many of the Public Portal functions have been integrated into the Department's online voting information and resource center, available at www.votespa.com.

The SURE County Portal was developed with the intent of expanding the range of voter registration and election management functions that can be performed by county users outside of the SURE system proper. Users of the County Portal do not necessarily have to be users of the SURE system. This makes it possible to allow temporary workers, for example, to perform many election-related duties without accessing the SURE system. This ability allows counties to expand their data entry capacities to successfully handle the large number of voter registration applications that is typically received during federal election years. The County Portal provides the following functions to county users:

- Voter search capability;
- Scanning and data entry of voter registration applications (entered into the Portal and imported into SURE via the Dynamic Import Process);
- Posting of county-specific office information, polling place information, news, FAQs, events and links to the SURE Public Portal;
- Entry, processing, and certification of provisional ballots;
- Voter registration statistics certification;
- Report generation and printing;
- Verification of voting system software;
- Upload of election returns to the Department;
- Electronic completion of Department surveys.

The Public Kiosk was developed so that county election offices may, if they choose, provide a public computer terminal to customers so that they can access many features of the SURE Portal in the county office. Public users of the Kiosk have the ability to perform the following functions:

- Search for and view voter registration information for any voter in the county (after completing an affirmation and showing identification to an election official);
- Change their voter registration information or complete a new application electronically (application is submitted directly to SURE for processing by the county);
- Access valuable information regarding the elections process in their own counties, including information on voting systems and county-specific news, FAQs and links;
- Search for the status of their provisional ballots.

The functionality provided to Department users by the SURE Agency Portal includes the ability to:

- Research registered voters through the lookup capability as requests are received;
- Accept voter registration statistics and election returns from county voter registration offices electronically via the SURE Portal;
- Post statewide news, links, FAQs and voting system information to the SURE Public Portal;

- Send to Portal users ad hoc surveys that can be completed and returned electronically.

The SURE Agency Portal also provides the ability for the Department to deploy Public Kiosks for customer use.

In September 2009, the SURE Portal Team deployed version 7.0 of the SURE Portal application, which implemented enhancements to existing functionality as well as new features within the application, including:

- Improvements to navigation and menu options to enhance and simplify the user experience;
- Enhancements to data entry, provisional ballot processing, voter search functionality, voter registration statistics generation, and reports and exports;
- Implementation of Election Event Calendar to allow the Department to create a calendar that publishes selected election-related dates to the public website;
- Implementation of a survey feature to allow the Department to send surveys via the Portal to users;
- Addition of absentee ballot status to the list of personalized information available to voters logged into the Public Portal;
- Deployment of a stand-alone Public Kiosk application, which allows any Portal user to log in and access the Kiosk for public use.

In addition to the online public component, the following users have been granted access and are utilizing their respective areas of the Portal:

- Agency Users: The Department's BCEL and the Pennsylvania State Police;
- County Users: Only three counties remain to be deployed to the SURE Portal (Delaware, Sullivan, and Philadelphia). Users in all other counties utilize the SURE Portal for various functions.

The Department continues to explore ways in which SURE and the SURE Portal may be improved and enhanced to allow citizens, as well as county and state officials, to participate more fully in the election process. SURE will inevitably continue to play an important role in the future of the Commonwealth's system of elections.

Election Assistance Commission (EAC) Election Data Collection Grant

In April of 2008, the Department applied for one of five \$2 million grant awards from the U.S. EAC. The grant's purpose was to report precinct-level voter registration and election data for the 2008 November Election, and additionally to develop a system to enhance the collection of such voter registration and election data into the future. On May 28, 2008, the Department was notified that it was awarded one of the five available \$2 million Election Data Collection grants.

As outlined in its grant proposal, the Department began work on the following three-phase project plan in June 2008 to meet the objectives of the grant program:

Phase 1 Enhancements:

- a) Merge precinct-level data collection into the SURE Portal for registered voters; absentee balloting; UOCAVA balloting; and provisional balloting to enable data to be collected and compiled electronically (Election Day Survey Repository).
- b) Build a “dynamic reporting environment” to more efficiently gather and report data from the various databases.

Phase 2 Enhancements:

- a) Identify and develop enhancements to SURE user interfaces (SURE and the SURE Portal) to promote more efficient tracking and reporting of election data.
- b) Further augment the reporting structure built during Phase 1 of the project to make submission of EAC data an “almost automatic” process.

Phase 3 Enhancements:

- a) Enhance the SURE Portal to include all functionality that exists in the AS400-based internal Elections Management System currently used by the Department to track primarily candidate and election return data.
- b) Successfully migrate all remaining election management processes into the SURE Portal.
- c) Eliminate the internal Elections System as the primary platform for elections processes.

Over the course of the 2009 calendar year the Department completed the bulk of the Phase 1 and Phase 2 enhancements. This work included the completion and transmittal of the Commonwealth’s precinct-level 2008 Election Day Survey response to the EAC. The Department also began development of the Phase 3 enhancements intended to integrate into the SURE Portal the Department’s elections management components. In addition, the Department began development of a data warehouse for the purposes of augmenting the Election Day Survey Repository, if necessary, and expanding the array of voter registration and elections reports the Department is able to generate and disseminate.

At the completion of the project, the Department will have built an integrated election management system within the SURE Portal that provides all of the functionality of the Department’s current internal elections system also provides enhanced voter registration and elections data collection and reporting capabilities.

Voter Outreach Efforts

Pennsylvania Voter Hall of Fame

The Department administers the Pennsylvania *Voter Hall of Fame* program. The program was established to generate awareness and encourage Pennsylvanians to exercise their right to vote. This program publicly honors Pennsylvanians who have voted in at least 50 consecutive November elections. *Voter Hall of Fame* inductees serve as ambassadors for voter participation encouraging others to emulate the inductees. The Voter Hall of Fame inductees are recognized on the Department's website through a permanent display on the third floor of the North Office Building in Harrisburg.

In 2009, the Department inducted 220 citizens from 11 counties into the *Voter Hall of Fame*. The 220 new members bring total membership to 14,640. Members of the Pennsylvania *Voter Hall of Fame* represent 64 different counties across the Commonwealth.

Community Outreach Efforts

In 2009, the Division of Voter Registration continued its history of community outreach as a means of creating awareness of the electoral process and voter registration. This included speaking at high schools, colleges, press conferences and attending local meetings to emphasize the importance of promoting voter registration.

The Department takes voter education seriously. Moreover, continuous efforts to increase voter registration awareness will be a priority for years to come.

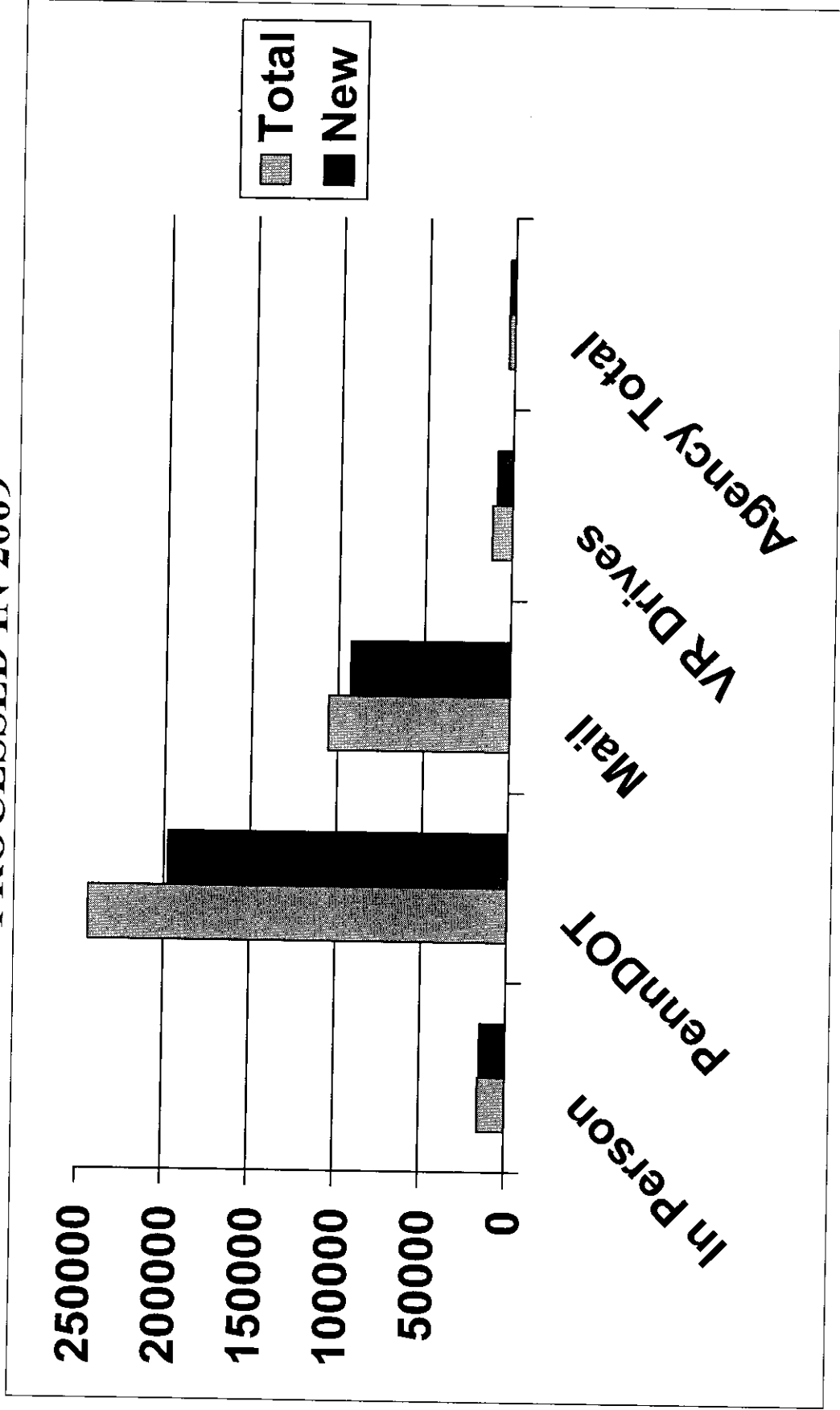

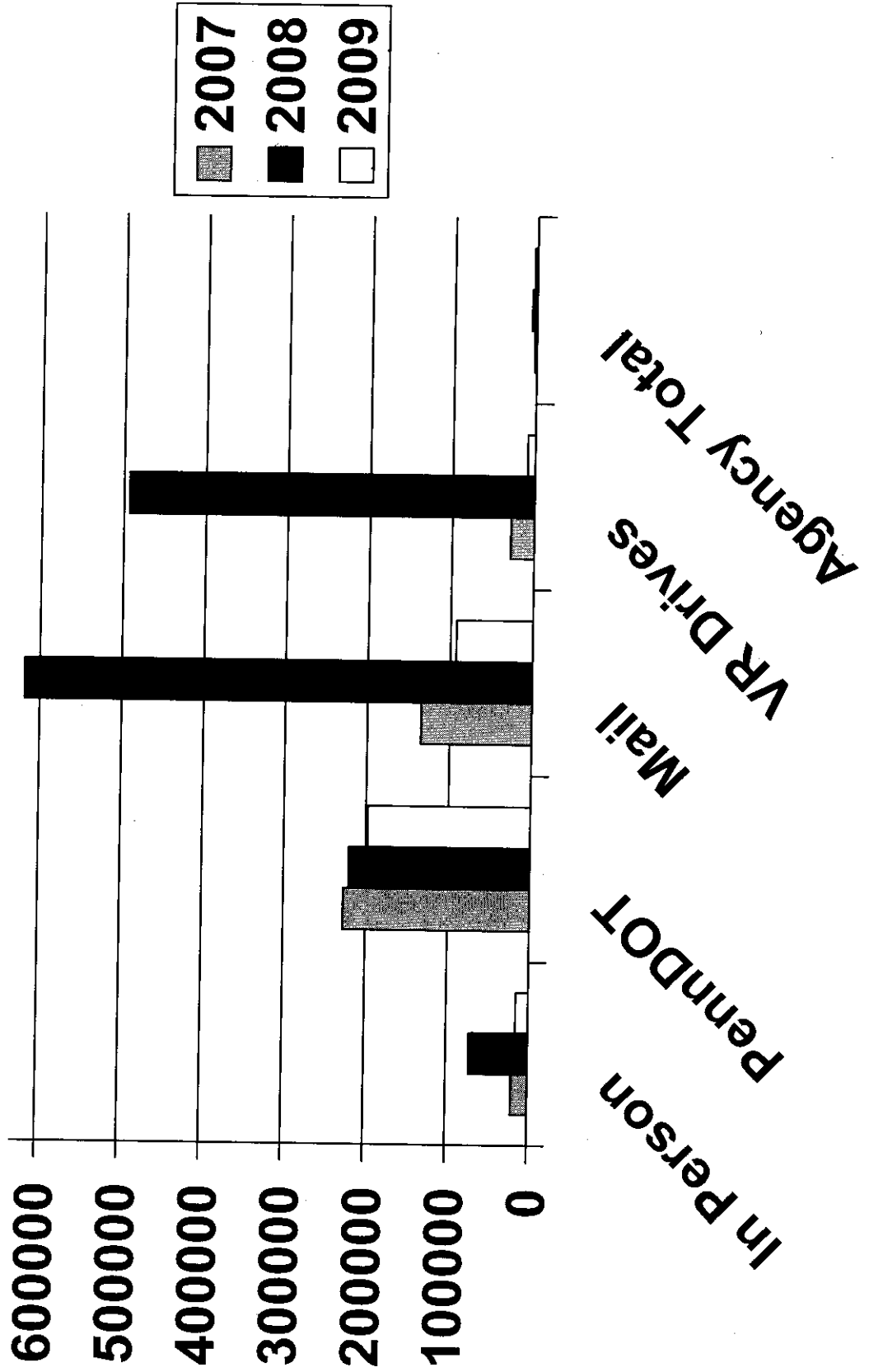
