Dear Members of the General Assembly:

As Secretary of the Commonwealth, I am pleased to report to you on the administration of voter registration in Pennsylvania for calendar year 2010. I trust you will find this report useful.

Voter registration in Pennsylvania is a joint state-county effort. During 2010 the Department of State (Department) continued its partnership with the state's sixty-seven county election boards and voter registration commissions. The Department continues to collaborate with the Commonwealth agencies designated with responsibilities under the National Voter Registration Act of 1993 (NVRA) to administer voter registration programs. The Department supports the agencies in terms of providing needed supplies as well as conducting training sessions and informational meetings.

The Statewide Uniform Registry of Electors (SURE) system, implemented in Pennsylvania through Act 3 of 2002, continues to work well to insure the uniformity and integrity of voter registration across the state. As of December 31, 2010, there were approximately 8.2 million registered voters in Pennsylvania, a number that is likely to rise as the 2012 presidential election approaches. We remain confident the SURE system will continue to be an integral part of the success of Pennsylvania's electoral process well into the 21st Century.

The Department remains committed to fulfilling its responsibilities under the Help America Vote Act of 2002. We plan to use remaining federal funds to ensure continued compliance with the requirements of this Act.

The Administration of Voter Registration in Pennsylvania
2010 Report to the General Assembly

In 2010, the Department of State (Department) worked closely with the public, each of the sixty-seven county voter registration offices, Commonwealth agencies designated with voter registration responsibilities, and voter registration advocacy groups. This report represents a summary of initiatives and statistics that support voter registration administration in Pennsylvania.

Department of Transportation

Since 1995, the Pennsylvania Department of Transportation (PennDOT) has played an integral role in the voter registration process. PennDOT provides Commonwealth citizens with an opportunity to apply to register to vote while receiving or renewing their driver's license at a PennDOT photo license center. In 2010, more than 227,000 individuals applied to register to vote using this resource.

Application Process to Register to Vote at a Photo License Center

- PennDOT customers visit a photo license center with a driver's license application card provided by PennDOT. The application card contains a printed two-dimensional bar code. The bar code is scanned and the computer system determines the customer's age. It then determines which customers will be at least eighteen years old by the date of the next election and asks if the customer wishes to apply to register to vote;
- The program is designed to ask customers if they are currently registered to vote. If not, they are provided the opportunity to apply to register;
- Customers can view the qualifications a Pennsylvania citizen must meet in order to continue with the application;
- Customers who choose to apply to register to vote are asked to confirm their county of residence and indicate a party preference. The customer is asked for optional information (telephone number and race);
- Customers are advised of the penalty for furnishing false information and are asked to sign a declaration that the information they have provided is true and correct to the best of their knowledge;
- Customers are provided a receipt indicating pertinent information about their voter registration application, including the date on which they applied at the photo license center. The receipt instructs customers to contact their county voter registration office if they do not receive a voter identification card within two weeks.

The completed applications are stored by PennDOT's contracted vendor. The vendor sorts the applications by county and transmits them electronically to each county's voter registration

office. In 2010, the vendor forwarded 227,944 "motor voter" applications to county voter registration officials.

In addition to new registrations PennDOT customers are able to update their voter registration when changing their address. All change of address related to voter registration is forwarded by PennDOT to the Department. The Department forwards the information to the appropriate county voter registration office. In 2010, a total of 759,688 change of address applications were forwarded from the Department to county election officials.

Agency Registration

The 1993 National Voter Registration Act requires that "(1) Each state shall designate agencies for the registration of voters in elections for Federal offices. (2) Each state shall designate as voter registration agencies – (A) all offices of the state that provide public assistance; and (B) all offices in the State that provide State-funded programs primarily engaged in providing services to persons with disabilities." In light of this Federal mandate, the Department of State continues to work with the mandated agencies to ensure that the requirements of the NVRA are being met. As presented in Appendix G 3,380,533 voter registration offers were made by the mandated NVRA agencies in 2010, of which 2,971,718 of those offers were declined.

The Department continues to work to ensure full compliance with the NVRA and accurate tracking of all voter registrations that result from offers made by the required public assistance agencies. In 2010 the Department took an additional step to ensure accurate tracking; bar codes were added to the agency specific voter registration applications. The bar code is in addition to the letter code, which was added in 2009. The bar code is automatically read by the SURE System (Statewide Uniform Registry of Electors) when the voter registration application is scanned to capture the voter's signature. This will ensure that all agency based registrations are captured, thus providing for a more accurate depiction of registrations resulting from the Department's efforts, and subsequently the public assistance agencies efforts to comply with the requirements of the NVRA.

In addition to implementing the bar coded agency specific forms the Department has continued many of the activities from previous years. The Department will continue to interact with the NVRA required public assistance agencies as a means of ensuring cooperation and compliance. Below are the activities that have continued from previous years:

- Provide training for agency coordinators;
- Meet with site coordinators from agencies for training;
- Supply agencies with voter registration applications (pre-coded and bar coded), informational pamphlets and posters;
- Contact other agency officials to designate additional employees to monitor and coordinate the reporting of agency voter registration totals;
- Communicate with county voter registration officials about entering agency codes as they register new voters and voters who are updating their voting information (this is needed as non-bar coded registration applications remain in circulation);

- Ongoing communication with the designated Agency Coordinators.

In 2010, the Department continued to work with state-operated public assistance agencies and agencies that serve people with disabilities to provide registration opportunities to clients. The following agencies participated:

- County Assistance Offices
- Area Agencies on Aging
- Clerk of Orphans' Court and Marriage License Bureaus
- Contractors for the Bureau of Blindness & Visual Services
- Armed Forces Recruitment Centers
- Centers for Independent Living
- Women, Infants and Children Nutrition Clinics
- County Mental Health & Mental Retardation Offices
- District Offices of the Office of Vocational Rehabilitation
- Student Disability Services Offices of the State System of Higher Education
- District Offices of the Bureau of Blindness & Visual Services
- Office of Special Education
- State Mental Health Hospitals & State Mental Retardation Centers
- Americans with Disabilities Act Complementary Para-transit Offices

To assist these agencies, the Department continues to conduct training sessions and provide technical assistance to the agencies as needed. The Department also provides the *Pennsylvania Guide to Agency-Based Voter Registration*. This publication details the responsibilities of a mandated voter registration agency. In addition to this guide, the Department provides each agency with Voter Registration Mail Applications, posters encouraging voter registration and brochures, including the *Pennsylvania Voting Guide*, which describes the voter registration process.

The Help America Vote Act (HAVA): Act 150 of 2002 and Act 97 of 2004

President George W. Bush signed the Help America Vote Act (HAVA) of 2002 into law on October 29, 2002. HAVA's main objective is uniform and non-discriminatory election administration. The Act contains several provisions related to voter registration, language and physical accessibility.

Pennsylvania enacted Act 150 of 2002 to incorporate many HAVA requirements into the Pennsylvania Election Code. Act 97 of 2004 made additional amendments to procedures applicable to provisional ballots, as noted below.

Distribution of HAVA Interest Grants

The Department of State, through the Division of HAVA, disbursed \$12,087,139.49 from Title I, Sections 101 and 102 and Title II, Sections 251 and 261. These funds were reported in the Department's annual reports to the Election Assistance Commission (EAC) and were disbursed according to the Pennsylvania State Plan. The funds were used for the HAVA allowable expenditures which include the following categories:

- Complying with Title III;
- Improving the administration of federal elections;
- Educating voters;
- Training election officials;
- Improving voting systems;
- Polling place accessibility;
- Alternative language assistance;
- Establishing a toll-free hotline for voters.

Polling Place Accessibility

Each county is required to annually certify the accessibility status of their polling places. The results are entered into a Department created database. The information is used by the Division of HAVA to allocate Title II, Section 261 monies to the individual counties. Title II, Section 261 is a reimbursement grant, therefore reimbursements are paid to the counties once the county has spent the money and has provided the appropriate documentation. In 2010, a total of \$451,559.00 was allocated for Polling Place Accessibility and ADA voting systems. This allocation also covered educating election officials, volunteers and voters on accessibility. Funds that were allocated to the counties were broken down by the following percentages – 80% for polling place accessibility, 18% for voting systems, 1% for training election staff and volunteers, and 1% for information programs.

Alternative Language Assistance

Pursuant to Section 301 of HAVA, since 2005, the Department continues to translate all relevant voter materials into alternative languages. The votespa.com website is completely translated into Spanish, but also includes key documents that have been translated into Chinese, French, Korean, Khmer, Russian and Vietnamese.

The Statewide Uniform Registry of Electors (SURE); Act 3 of 2002

SURE is the centralized voter registration and election management system designed to assure the accuracy and integrity of the Commonwealth's voter registration records maintained by the election authorities in Pennsylvania's 67 counties. The SURE system is a platform that supports the critical functions of the Commonwealth's elections—from determining voter eligibility to

assigning precincts to producing poll books. A centralized, uniform registry that is accessible to all county offices greatly enhances the overall accuracy and integrity of the voter registration rolls and the resulting quality of voter services.

Pennsylvania began development of its centralized voter registration system with the enactment of Act 2002-3 (Act 3). Act 3 set forth the requirements for the system, specifying that SURE must be a "single, uniform integrated computer system. All [voter registration] commissions shall be connected electronically to the SURE system and shall maintain their registration records in the system." Act 3 also made a number of amendments to the voter registration act that make voter registration processes more amenable to electronic processing.

HAVA contains numerous requirements for improving the conduct of elections across the United States. One of these requirements is the establishment of a statewide voter registration system in each state, which must be a "single, uniform, official, centralized, interactive computerized statewide voter registration list defined, maintained, and administered at the State level that contains the name and registration information of every legally registered voter in the State and assigns a unique identifier to each legally registered voter in the State..." (See § 303(a)(1)(A), 42 U.S.C. § 15483(a)(1)(A)). The SURE system went "live" in all Pennsylvania counties prior to the January 1, 2006, HAVA deadline.

As the SURE project developed and expanded, it became apparent that there were many areas of voter registration and election management that could be addressed and improved outside of the SURE system. The Department embarked on the SURE Portal project in 2005 in order to pursue these opportunities, while taking advantage of the progress that has been made in the Commonwealth with the SURE system.

Following the completion of a Gap Analysis on the project in January 2007 to assess future needs, the Department, in consultation with the Governor's Office of Administration, pursued a contract with a vendor later that year to re-host the SURE system program. The primary objective of the SURE Rehosting Project was to migrate the SURE system application from its outdated Microsoft Access platform to a more state-of-the-art technology based on the Microsoft .NET platform. The Rehosted SURE system was deployed to production in December 2008, and improvements continue to be made to the system to enhance functionality and performance. Because the Commonwealth now owns and maintains the SURE system programming code, the Department will be able to make enhancements to the system in the years ahead based on the needs of users and of the Commonwealth.

The overall goals of the SURE Portal are:

- To make use of SURE information to support an expanded array of services and functionality for county, agency and public users;
- To move some critical county processes outside of the SURE environment, optimizing performance for the official registration system;
- To make SURE information more readily available for county, agency and public use and reference;

- To provide streamlined, electronic processes to county offices to support voter registration and elections;
- To make voter registration and election information available to the public via the Internet.

Three separate functional areas make up the SURE Portal: the Public Portal, the County Portal and the Agency Portal.

On the SURE Public Portal (available at www.pavoterservices.state.pa.us), voters may:

- Search for and view their own registration and polling place information, including directions to their polling place;
- Print a voter registration application and absentee ballot request form;
- Access valuable information regarding the elections process in their own counties, including information on voting systems and county-specific office information, polling place information, news, FAQs, events and links;
- Search for the status of their absentee ballot requests;
- Search for the status of their provisional ballots;
- Participate in a threaded online discussion;
- Search for a *Voter Hall of Fame* inductee.

Many of the Public Portal functions have been integrated into the Department's online voting information and resource center, available at www.votespa.com.

The SURE County Portal was developed with the intent of expanding the range of voter registration and election management functions that can be performed by county users outside of the SURE system proper. Users of the County Portal do not necessarily have to be users of the SURE system. This makes it possible to allow temporary workers, for example, to perform many election-related duties without accessing the SURE system. This ability allows counties to expand their data entry capacities to successfully handle the large number of voter registration applications that is typically received during federal election years. The County Portal provides the following functions to county users:

- Voter search capability;
- Scanning and data entry of voter registration applications (entered into the Portal and imported into SURE via the Dynamic Import Process);
- Posting of county-specific office information, polling place information, news, FAQs, events and links to the SURE Public Portal;
- Poll book printing;
- Uploading official absentee balloting materials for military and overseas voters;
- Entry, processing and certification of provisional ballots;
- Voter registration statistics certification;
- Report generation and printing;
- Exporting of report data;
- Verification of voting system software;

- Upload of election returns to the Department;
- Electronic completion of Department surveys.

The Public Kiosk was developed so that county election offices may, if they choose, provide a public computer terminal to customers so that they can access many features of the SURE Portal in the county office. Public users of the Kiosk have the ability to perform the following functions:

- Search for and view voter registration information for any voter in the county (after completing an affirmation and showing identification to an election official);
- Change their voter registration information or complete a new application electronically (application is submitted directly to SURE for processing by the county);
- Access valuable information regarding the elections process in their own counties, including information on voting systems and county-specific news, FAQs and links;
- Search for the status of their provisional ballots.

The functionality provided to Department users by the SURE Agency Portal includes the ability to:

- Research registered voters through the lookup capability as requests are received;
- Accept voter registration statistics and election returns from county voter registration offices electronically via the SURE Portal;
- Post statewide news, links, FAQs and voting system information to the SURE Public Portal;
- Manage the dissemination of official absentee balloting materials uploaded by county users via the SURE County Portal for military and overseas voters;
- Send to Portal users ad hoc surveys that can be completed and returned electronically;
- Report generation and printing;
- Exporting of report data;
- Manage the election calendar.

The SURE Agency Portal also provides the ability for the Department to deploy Public Kiosks for customer use.

Changes to SURE Proper and the SURE Portals

In January 2010, SURE Operational Support deployed version 7.5 of the SURE Portal application, which implemented enhancements to existing functionality as well as new features within the application, including:

- Enhancements to the voter search functionality to enable users to easily identify "federal voters," who are qualified under Federal law to vote by absentee ballot for federal offices, but are not qualified under Pennsylvania law to be registered;
- Enhancements to Motor Voter reporting and provisional ballot processing.

In March 2010, SURE Operational Support deployed version 8.0 of SURE Proper and the SURE Portal applications, which implemented additional enhancements, including:

SURE Proper

- Enhancements to the poll book generation process;
- Addition of several exportable reports relative to voter listings and absentee ballot listings;
- Enhancements to voter correspondence.

SURE Portal

- Enhancements to voter registration statistics reports;
- Enhancements to the Public Kiosk view;
- Enhancements to both the English and Spanish versions of the Calendar of Events;
- Enhancements to the data entry scan and import process.

In August 2010, SURE Operational Support deployed version 9.0 of SURE Proper and the SURE Portal applications, which implemented enhancements necessary to bring the Commonwealth into compliance with the federal Military and Overseas Voter Empowerment Act (MOVE Act), including:

SURE Proper

- Enhancements to the absentee balloting module to accommodate the delivery of email correspondence to military and overseas civilian voters who requested electronic delivery of official absentee balloting materials;
- Enhancements to accommodate the recording of returned absentee ballots submitted in accordance with the MOVE Act requirements.

SURE Portal

- Enhancements to the Agency and County portals to accommodate uploading of official absentee balloting materials;
- Enhancements to the Public Portal to provide military and overseas voters with access to official absentee balloting materials.

The Department continues to explore ways in which SURE and the SURE Portal may be improved and enhanced to allow citizens, as well as county and state officials, to participate more fully in the election process. SURE will inevitably continue to play an important role in the future of the Commonwealth's system of elections.

Election Assistance Commission (EAC) Election Data Collection Grant

In April of 2008, the Department applied for one of five \$2 million grant awards from the U.S. EAC for the purpose of reporting precinct-level voter registration and election data for the 2008 November Election, and for the purpose of developing a system to enhance the collection of such voter registration and election data into the future. On May 28, 2008, the Department was notified that it was awarded one of the five available \$2 million Election Data Collection grants.

As outlined in its grant proposal, the Department began work on the following three- phase project plan in June 2008 to meet the objectives of the grant program:

Phase 1 Enhancements:

- a) Merge precinct-level data collection into the SURE Portal for registered voters; absentee balloting; UOCAVA balloting; and provisional balloting to enable data to be collected and compiled electronically (Election Day Survey Repository).
- b) Build a "dynamic reporting environment" to more efficiently gather and report data from the various databases.

Phase 2 Enhancements:

- a) Identify and develop enhancements to SURE user interfaces (SURE and the SURE Portal) to promote more efficient tracking and reporting of election data.
- b) Further augment the reporting structure built during Phase 1 of the project to make submission of EAC data an "almost automatic" process.

Phase 3 Enhancements:

- a) Enhance the SURE Portal to include all functionality that exists in the AS400-based internal Elections Management System currently used by the Department to track primarily candidate and election return data.
- b) Successfully migrate all remaining election management processes into the SURE Portal.
- c) Eliminate the internal Elections System as the primary platform for elections processes.

Over the course of the 2010 calendar year the Department completed the development stage of the Phase 3 enhancements, which includes the integration of the Department's elections management components into the SURE Portal. An initial round of training for this new functionality was conducted in December 2010 to prepare department personnel for the testing stages that would occur in 2011.

At the completion of the project, the Department will have an integrated election management system within the SURE Portal that provides all of the functionality of the Department's current internal elections system, and also provides enhanced voter registration and elections data collection and reporting capabilities.

Community Outreach Efforts

In 2010, the Division of Voter Registration continued its history of community outreach as a means of creating awareness of the electoral process and voter registration. This included attending Voter Hall of Fame ceremonies and facilitating the Student Mock Election.

Pennsylvania Voter Hall of Fame

The Pennsylvania Voter Hall of Fame program is administered by the Department of State, Division of Voter Registration. The program was established to promote awareness and encourage all Pennsylvanians to exercise their right to vote. The Voter Hall of Fame publically honors Pennsylvanians who have voted in at least fifty consecutive November elections. The inductees serve as ambassadors in their communities – they lead by example, hoping that others will emulate them and start a tradition of voting regularly.

In 2010, the Department inducted 1,159 citizens from nine counties into the *Pennsylvania Voter Hall of Fame*. The 1,159 new members bring total membership to 15,753, with the membership spanning 64 counties throughout the Commonwealth. As an ongoing recognition the Department maintains a display, on the third floor of the North Office Building in Harrisburg.

Student Mock Election

In 2010, with assistance from the Department of Education, the Department of State conducted the 2010 Pennsylvania Student Mock Election Program. This program, first launched in 1988, is held every two years during the General Election as an attempt to educate school-aged children and teenagers about the voting process. Students participate in a mock election in their respective schools throughout the Commonwealth and vote for offices such as President and Vice President or Governor and Lieutenant Governor. In addition to voting for specific offices, the mock ballots also include ballot questions.

The Department of State provides the participating schools with grade specific ballots, as well as a Teachers' Manual, which includes background information and can be used to help the teacher's set-up the mock election. 2010 marked the first Student Mock Election in which the entire election was conducted electronically. The ballots, as well as the teachers' manual were provided on the Student Mock Election's website and all results were updated by the individual teachers/schools directly to the results portion of the website.

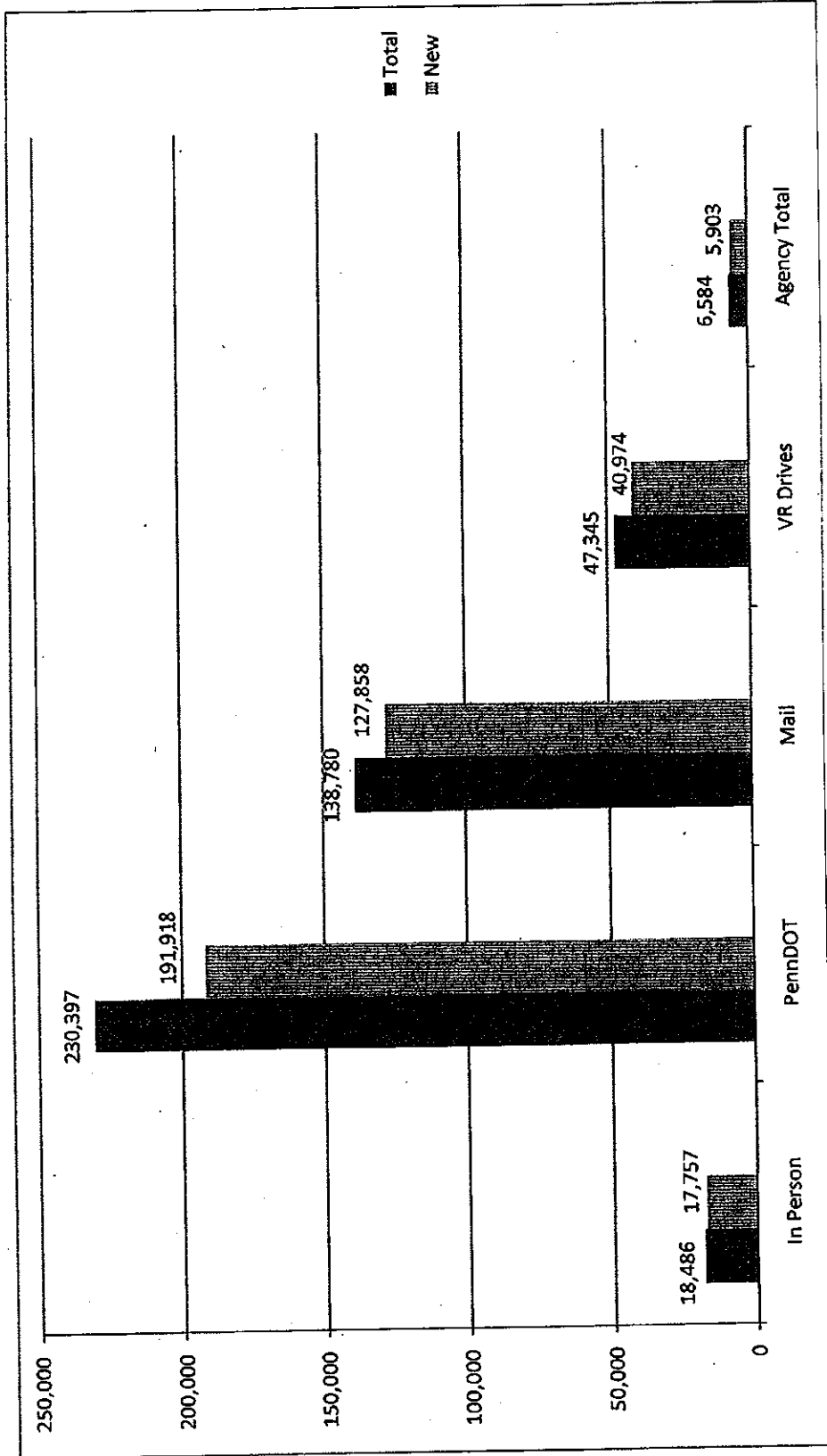

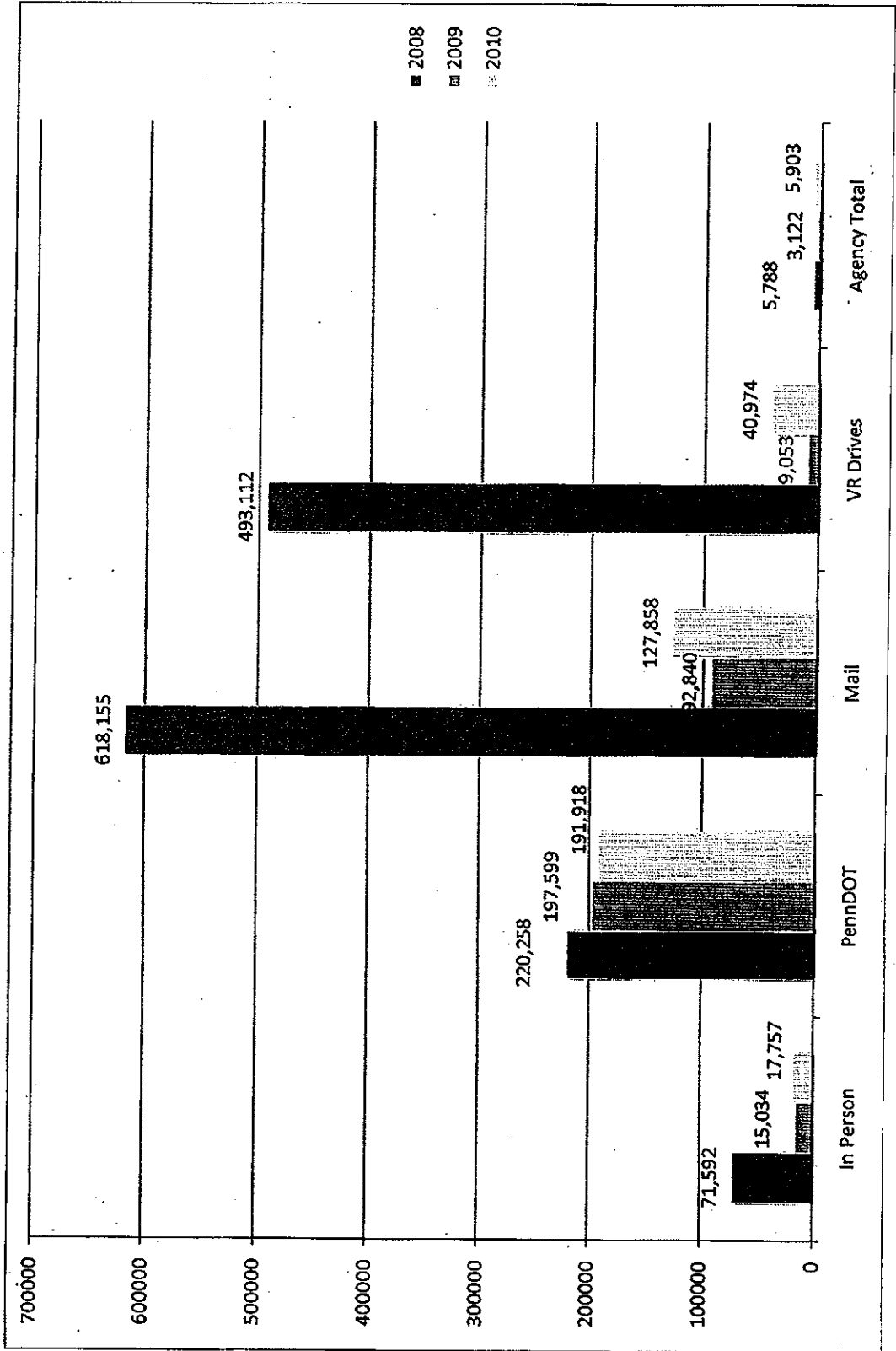
