2025-2026 FAFSA Form Now Available

In November, the U.S. Department of Education released the **2025-26 FAFSA form**. The online FAFSA form is available to all students and families at **FAFSA.gov**, and the US Department of Education (USDE) is processing submissions and sending them to schools. The paper form is also now available for students to submit.

The USDE has taken steps to modernize and address issues in the FAFSA system and put in place features that further enhance the user experience and improve functionality of the form. In addition, it has released and updated resources and materials to help students and families, as well as counselors and financial aid professionals, to better navigate the FAFSA form and process.

For those who need additional assistance, the USDE has made significant improvements, such as increased staffing and surge period extended hours, at the Federal Student Aid Information Center

In the coming days and weeks, the USDE will carefully monitor the 2025-26 FAFSA form, as well as the contact center, and make any needed adjustments to improve the experience for students, families, and the financial aid community. In the coming months, the USDE will further enhance the user experience and release additional functionality, including batch corrections and paper corrections, to facilitate a smoother process for students, families, and institutions.

Final Reminder: PennDot's Innovations Challenge

The Pennsylvania Department of Transportation (PennDOT) announced its eighth annual Innovations Challenge in October, which encourages students to use their problem-solving, creative and strategic-thinking abilities to solve real-world transportation challenges in a competition among their peers. The Innovations Challenge is open to all students in grades 9-12, regardless of their school's learning model.

For this year's challenge, students are asked to develop a cost-effective, innovative solution that can help PennDOT more effectively increase awareness of seatbelt safety and change behavior to improve roadway safety.

Third Judicial Circuit Hosting Essay Contest

The Courts, Community, and Rule of Law Committee of the Judicial Council of the Third Circuit announced that it is hosting an essay contest for elementary students focused on civics, citizenship, and the concept of "We the People" – which are the first three words of the Preamble to the United States Constitution. The essay prompt is: How did our Nation's Founders envision 'the People' when they drafted the Constitution, and how should we interpret their vision in our country today?

The essay may be written by either an individual student or by an entire class. If a class essay, students within a participating class should work together to write the essay. That means that only one essay is submitted on behalf of the class. Individual and class essays must be submitted on or before **Monday**. **March 31**. **2025**.

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The best individual and class essays in each district (District of Delaware, District of New Jersey, Eastern District of Pennsylvania, Middle District of Pennsylvania, Western District of Pennsylvania, and the District of the Virgin Islands) of the Third Circuit will be invited to one of the nine courthouses in the Third Circuit to present their essays during the first weeks of May, in celebration of Law Day. The individual and class essays will be judged separately based on focus, content development, organization, and style. Prizes will be awarded.
