

Celebrating Historic Investments, FAFSA Assistance, PA Green Ribbon Schools, and More this July!

This July has brought sunshine, summer fun, and exciting updates to PDE! The Shapiro Administration successfully passed a budget that invests in our classrooms and provides opportunities throughout the Commonwealth. The <u>2024-2025 budget</u> secures a \$1.11 billion total increase in K-12 public education funding, including additional increases in special education funding and student mental health services.

In alignment with these historic investments, PDE highlighted several grant recipients this month. Notably, **more than \$1 million to expand adult literacy education programs** was awarded to five school entities and over **\$1.4 million was dedicated to grow Pennsylvania's special education workforce**.

As we move closer towards a new school year, we wish everyone a safe and enjoyable remainder of the summer season.



Birth Certificate Requests for the New School Year

During the late summer and early spring, the Department of Health's vital records office often

Subscribe to our email list.

Birth certificates can be ordered through the mail with an <u>Application for a Birth Certificate</u> with a printable/fillable PDF or online through the <u>PA Vital Records' official storefront</u>. In person requests are not required, certificates can be mailed to you, and most orders are processed within two weeks.

If your child was born in another state, you will need to request their birth certificate from that state. See the **National Center for Health Statistics' website** for contact information.

The Department of Health's Bureau of Health Statistics and Registries is the official custodian of the Commonwealth's vital records. Third-party vendors may offer vital records services for an extra fee and claim they can get you a copy of your vital record much quicker. However, they generally use the information you provide to submit an order on paper or online back to the Department of Health. To avoid those extra fees and processing steps, we recommend you apply directly through the Department of Health.
