Indicator: Evaluation for Eligibility

Indicator Type: Program Management

Item EE-1: Does the preschool Early Intervention program have procedures for screening preschool children referred to the local program to ensure efficient eligibility determinations?

Preschool EI Criteria

There is evidence, as it relates to screening procedures, the preschool Early Intervention program is effective through:

- The use of screenings for children who are suspected of having a developmental delay, and not children who meet one of the disability categories,
- Ensuring that parental consent is obtained and that other procedural safeguards are followed,
- Ensuring that the screening does not delay the evaluation,
- Utilizing screenings conducted by other Early Intervention programs, health, education or social service agencies,
- Strategies to use PELICAN and local data to review, evaluate and revise strategies as needed,
- Strategies to supervise staff who are providing screenings, and
- Strategies to ensure that screenings occur in a timely and fiscally responsible manner.

- Strategies to supervise evaluation teams and the determination of eligibility,
- Strategies to ensure that evaluators have the skills and expertise needed to administer evaluation tools and to determine eligibility,
- Strategies to use PELICAN and local data to review and evaluate eligibility determinations,
- Strategies to ensure that children who are no longer eligible are exited from the program, and
- Strategies to ensure that activities focused on the determination of eligibility occur in a fiscally responsible manner.

Infant Toddler EI Criteria (Not Applicable for Preschool)

There is evidence procedures include the following:

- Screening for children who are suspected of having a developmental delay and not for children with a previously diagnosed physical or mental condition,
- Utilizing screenings conducted by health, education or social service agencies,
- Obtaining parental consent for screening, including assurances that the parent can request an evaluation at any time,
- Administering screening tools by qualified personnel who are trained to administer the tool,
- Utilizing the Ages and Stages Questionnaire (ASQ) unless the needs of the child indicate that a different screening tool should be used,
- Providing written notice to parents notifying them of the results of the screening, and
- Timely screening procedures that do not delay timeline requirements for evaluation, assessment, initial IFSP or service delivery.
- A statement related to documenting exceptional family circumstances in the child’s record if the parent is unavailable to complete the screening, the initial evaluation, the initial assessments of the infant or toddler and family, or the initial IFSP meeting.

If the EI IT or EI PS program does not have at least 10 children who received annual evaluation or re-evaluation, review the records of all children who received an annual evaluation or re-evaluation. Infant Toddler EI Criteria (not required for preschool programs)

There is evidence of the following:

- Determination of level of care was completed for infants and toddlers who are likely to be eligible for the ITF waiver.
- Re-determination of level of care for was completed for infants and toddlers who are eligible on an annual basis.
- The level of care for all children who may be eligible for the waiver has been appropriately determined.

Directions for Finding Evidence

1. Prior to the Verification, review the records in PELICAN of 5% of the children who were found eligible for Early Intervention services, using the **standard record sample for children who were found eligible for Early Intervention**. At least 10 records should be reviewed at minimum but no more than 30 records. Look for documentation of the criteria for eligibility determinations. AND
2. During the Verification, review the records of 5% of the children who were **found ineligible** for Early Intervention services, using a **targeted record review**. At least 5 records should be reviewed at minimum but no more than 10 records. If the EI IT or EI PS program does not have at least 5 children who were found not eligible, review the records of all children. Look for documentation of how the team made the eligibility determination. If the 2 team members do not agree on whether the child was ineligible, the record should be reviewed by the entire team.

If this is for an annual or re-evaluation, we should see documentation in the evaluation report. This could be in a variety of places, the evaluation summary page, updates to the developmental domains sections, etc.

Infant Toddler Programs, independent evaluators should also be reviewing existing data for the child. If it is an annual evaluation, the above applies as well.

Preschool Programs, this item refers to re-evaluations that were waived and re-evaluations where a full evaluation was completed using tools, observations, parent and classroom reports, etc.

Infant Toddler and Preschool EI Criteria

There is evidence that the evaluation report includes the following:

- A family directed assessment that identifies the family’s current resources, priorities and concerns and the supports and services necessary to enhance the family’s capacity to meet the developmental needs of the child,
- A review of the child’s current health status and medical history.
- Documentation in each of the five developmental domains of cognitive, physical (including vision and hearing), communication, social and emotional, and adaptive on the following:
 - Strengths and needs of the child, and
 - Level of functioning of the child,
- Summary of Evaluation Results, including how the delay or disability effects the child's participation in appropriate activities,
- An accurate eligibility determination, and
- Recommendations to assist in the development of the IFSP.

At least 10 records should be reviewed at minimum but no more than 30 records. Look for evidence of the presence of all required evaluation components.

2. Conduct observation(s) of an evaluation/s according to the **Verification Observation Tool**.

Prior to the Verification, review the records in PELICAN of 5% of the children who had an initial or re-evaluation within the last 3 months using a **standard record sample**. At least 10 records should be reviewed at minimum but no more than 30 records. Look for documentation that the recommendations are related to families' resources, concerns and priorities and the child's strengths and needs in the evaluation report.

Prior to the Verification, review the records in PELICAN of 5% of the children who exited Early Intervention because they no longer met eligibility for Early Intervention using a targeted record review . At least 5 records should be reviewed at minimum but no more than 10 records. Look for documentation of the criteria in the child’s transition plan.

Infant Toddler Programs: Documentation should be on the transition plan. The transition meeting and discussion on the activities for a transition plan can be done over the phone. If the family does not want to complete the transition plan or participate in a transition meeting, documentation of conversations can be in the SC notes. The SC notes must be detailed enough to include that the family did not want a transition plan or meeting. If documentation is not found, they do not meet requirements.
