<p>There is evidence, related to the provision of IFSP/IEP services, that the infant toddler or preschool Early Intervention program is effective through:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Strategies for oversight and monitoring of the delivery of services as designated on the IFSP/IEP, • Strategies for ensuring regular communication with families about their child’s participation in Early Intervention, i.e., communication logs go home daily/weekly, documentation logs of contact with families; notes/reports that document the conversation with families, etc., • Procedures for informing the family of community activities, resources, advocacy services, local support groups and family networks, • Processes for reviewing documentation of service delivery (i.e., session notes, attendance records) to ensure that documentation meets all requirements, • Processes for reviewing service coordination notes to ensure that documentation meets all requirements (Infant/Toddler Only), • The use of PELICAN and other local data to review, evaluate and revise strategies and processes on an ongoing basis, and • Strategies to ensure that activities focused on the provision of services on the IFSP/IEP occur in a fiscally responsible manner.

Interview with family members during the observation according to the <i>Family Interview Protocol</i>.

Look for evidence in service delivery documentation (e.g., session notes, service logs, etc.) that the services were embedded in child’s typical routines as specified in the IFSP/IEP, such as in the home with family present or within typical activities and routines in the early childhood setting and, in the environments, identified on the IFSP/IEP. AND 2. Conduct observation(s) of a service delivery session according to the Verification Observation Tool . AND 3. Interview family members during the observation according to the Family Interview Protocol .

Review the most current IFSP and the most current 6 months of service notes (if available) from that IFSP. If additional information is needed, look at progress monitoring information (quarterly review notes) or additional session notes, b. Adaptations being made to the environment or to materials to support the child and family, c. Outcomes as written are being addressed. 	During the Verification, review the records of 5% of children who are enrolled in the Early Intervention program using a standard record sample . <p>There is evidence of the following:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • All appropriate restraints are reported to the Bureau of Early Intervention Services (BEIS), • Restraints or intrusive strategies are used only in cases of danger to child or others, • Parental consent is obtained prior to the use of restraints or intrusive procedures, • An IEP team meeting is held within 10 program days (based on preschool Early Intervention calendar) to create or revise behavior goals or plan if restraints are used, and • When restraints are used, the program reports usage to their BEIS Advisor within 24 hours.
