





FUN FACTS— Muskellunge and Walleye

Muskellunge

- Muskellunge are part of the Pikes and Mudminnows family.
- The largest sportfish in Pennsylvania is the Muskellunge. The current Pennsylvania state-record Muskellunge was caught at Conneaut Lake, Crawford County, in 1924. It weighed 54 pounds, 3 ounces.
- Muskellunge are coolwater fish found in clear natural lakes and rivers.
- Most Muskellunge reach over 48 inches long.

Walleye

- Walleye are part of the Perches and Darters family.
- Walleyes and Saugers are the largest members of the Perches and Darters family.
- The current Pennsylvania state-record Walleye was caught on the Youghiogheny River, Fayette County, in 2021. It weighed 18 pounds, 1 ounce.
- Walleyes live in large lakes, big streams, and rivers in water that is cool. Summer water temperatures do not exceed 85 degrees F.
