Please join us for a virtual DHS National Threat Evaluation and Reporting Program Office (NTER) Threat Evaluation & Reporting Course Overview (TERO) training on Wednesday, 12 March 2025, led by Ashley Wilson, the Regional Prevention Coordinator for the DHS Center for Prevention Programs and Partnerships, Arturo Mendez, the CISA Protective Security Advisor in Northeast Pennsylvania, and Wendy Alkinburgh, Program Manager in the Pennsylvania Office of Homeland Security. The TERO raises awareness about the risk factors, triggers and stressors, and warning behaviors that could impact a person's decision to commit an act of targeted violence. Further, it outlines the mitigating factors that could help prevent acts of targeted violence, while emphasizing the importance of community involvement in seeking help for individuals, and respecting their privacy, civil rights, and civil liberties.

This training will include four TERO modules and information from our speakers. You can expect the topics and themes to include the following:

- What is Behavioral Threat Assessment and Management?
- How Does Your Community Play a Role?
