GENERAL CRITERIA

1. Nominations must be submitted via email no later than **June 2, 2025**.
2. Nominations must be signed by the Chief Juvenile Probation Officer and Judge.
3. Nominee must be employed as a Juvenile Probation Officer at the time the nomination is submitted (*Date of submission is defined as the date the email submission is received*).
4. Winners from previous years may not be renominated in the same award category.
5. Nominations must be written so the nominee's identity cannot be discerned by reading the narrative. **The name and county of the nominee should only be written on the front page.**
6. Nominations may be withdrawn by the Chief Juvenile Probation Officer or Judge who signed the nomination form.
7. Nominations must be submitted on this nomination form, using only the space provided.
8. Only one nomination per category per county will be accepted.

Nominations which do not meet all criteria will be rejected from the judging process.
