	Identify staff proficient in Evidence Based Practices including but not limited to MI, YLS, Case Plan Development, structured skill- building and EPICS to conduct "full case walk-through" trainings:
	 In a facilitated small group discussion setting: a. Review the Risk-Needs-Responsivity (RNR) principles b. Take a sample case- Complete the YLS- c. Identify the criminogenic needs to target. d. Identify the skill deficits associated with these needs e. Discuss responsivity factors f. Select Interventions based on risk/needs/responsivity factors g. Conduct mock EBP/structured interview session incorporating CBI demonstrations.
	Enhanced trainings could include behavioral health screens (MAYSI ACES CTS).
	Record the training to be utilized at future booster sessions.
	Share data with staff (Outcome measures-YLS Case Closing risk level reduction)



JPO STAFF Cont.	Provide feedback to staff on their proficiency with MI-YLS-Case Planning and structured interviews/EPICS.
	Have line staff officers participate and/or hold leadership positions on EBP initiative workgroups.
	Have peer to peer support work. Hold case plan workshops for example where a team of peers work through a challenging case and support an officer in developing the case plan and selecting appropriate interventions.
	Have an open-door policy with staff.
	Incorporate EBP into creative (fun) staff activities: JJSES Jeopardy JJSES \$10,000 Pyramid
	Send out JJSES Word/Phrase of the month via email to staff.
	Recognize/Reward staff who demonstrate exceptional proficiency in delivering EBP services.
JUDGES AND	Review Risk Needs Responsivity principles with Judges/Hearing Officers.
HEARING	Conduct condensed YLS trainings.
OTTICENS	Juvenile Court Judge Participates in Juvenile Justice Advisory Board/Committee (JJAB)
	Invite Judges/Hearing Officers to take a tour of Community Based Providers.
	Juvenile Court Judge attends JCJC Conference
	Juvenile Court Judge reviews/approves JJSES polices.
	Presentations at Children's Roundtable meetings.



	Public Defender representation on JJAB
PUBLIC DEFENDERS	Have Public Defender sit in on intake interviews to show the foundation that produces the case plan recommendations.
	Present trainings demonstrating the collateral consequences of an adjudication
	Include P.D. in any potential expungement expansion meetings.
	District Attorney representation on JJAC
DISTRICT ATTORNEY(S)	Partner with DA office on implementation of Youth Aid Panels
	Include DA on Victim related/Graduated Response Policy/Protocols
	Invite DA to JCJC Conference
	Children's Roundtable meetings
	Have Juvenile Court DA observe a mock initial interview to demonstrate the foundation of the complex process that ultimately produces a case plan and dispositional recommendations.
	Provide YLS "lite" training for DA (can apply to PD as well).

	Victim Focus Groups.
	Hold Crime Victim Rights Week activities and include victim participation
	Have Crime Victims agency present at staff meetings/trainings.



JPO Chief Membership on the County Police Chief's Association.
Invite Police Association President to join Juvenile Justice Advisory Committee.
Survey Police Chiefs to determine what juvenile justice related statistics they would be interested to review.
Present EBP updates and review relevant statistics at Police Chief Meetings.
Senior JPO staff (supervisors or probation officers) serve as department liaisons for police departments. Routinely drop in to confer at police departments during field visitation days.
Collaborate with Police Chief's to have JJSES related presentations during scheduled police training events.
Collaborate with District Attorney and Police to establish Youth Aid Panels.
Participate in local "National Night Out" events.
Surveys - Post Placement/Community Based /JPO operated program – Case Closing
Parent or former JPO involved youth on JJAC
Mandate via policy, family involvement in the case planning process
Collaborate with DA/School District Administration to consider school related offense diversion programs.
Utilize School Based Probation Officers.
Participate in District/Intermediate Unit Safe School Meetings.
Have School Based Probation Officers participate on Student Assistance teams.
Have a designated Education Liaison position to coordinate with schools for post placement re-entry. (Contract position possibly funded via Needs Based Budget)
