## PENNSYLVANIA JUVENILE JUSTICE SYSTEM RECIDIVISM

One of the primary tools used to measure the success of programs and policies within the juvenile justice system is to track recidivism, or the return to crime. Since 2012, Pennsylvania has tracked the outcomes of juvenile offenders for a period of two years after juvenile closure to determine the percentage that remained law-abiding citizens. Special attention has been given to the recidivism rates of youth prior to, versus after, the implementation of the Juvenile Justice System Enhancement Strategy (JJSES).
