Michelle Fox, Executive Deputy Chief Counsel, was asked to explain this proposed action.

Ms. Fox outlined the appeal stating that the Licensee, Taphouse 23, LLC, was charged with loud music on two dates. Following a hearing the Administrative Law Judge (ALJ) sustained the charge and imposed a \$350.00 fine. Taphouse 23, LLC then filed a timely appeal.

On appeal the Licensee says the ALJ's decision was not supported by substantial evidence. The Licensee says its principal denied knowing the music was leaving the Licensee's premises and that no police complained about it.

However, the evidence showed that a Bureau of Liquor Control Enforcement (BLCE) officer went into the Licensee's premises and saw the DJ playing music thru two loudspeakers. The music could be heard 500 feet from the Licensee's property line.

Three days later, the same thing happen, only music could be heard 350 feet away from the Licensee's property line. The ALJ found Bureau witnesses to be more credible than the Licensee's witnesses.

Ms. Fox stated that the Board has no authority to overturn credibility determinations. Therefore, Chief Counsel's Office recommends affirming the ALJ's decision. The fine has been paid by the Licensee.

Appeal of Adjudication and Order of Administrative Law Judge

Michelle Fox, Executive Deputy Chief Counsel, was asked to explain this proposed action.

Ms. Fox continued with this Licensee's, Taphouse 23, LLC, citations stating that about a month later, this same Licensee was charged with more loud music violations on seven different occasions and also for noisy and disorderly operations on eight occasions. Following a hearing the Administrative Law Judge (ALJ) sustained both charges and fined the Licensee \$400 and \$500 (an aggregated fine of \$900). Licensee filed a timely appeal.

Licensee raised the same argument as before, that the ALJ's decision was not supported by substantial evidence because the Licensee did not know the music could be heard on any of the dates and no one complained.

However, evidence showed that the Bureau of Liquor Control Enforcement (BLCE) officer heard amplified music 200 feet away on one occasion and 1000 feet away on another occasion. Other witnesses heard music on other days.

Again, the ALJ found Bureau witnesses more credible than the Licensee's witnesses.

Ms. Fox stated that Chief Counsel's Office recommends affirming the ALJ's decision.

Board Member Negra asked if the music was live music or if it was being played by a DJ. Ms. Fox answered that the music that the BLCE officer heard was played by a DJ.

Michelle Fox, Executive Deputy Chief Counsel, was asked to explain this proposed action.

Ms. Fox explained that the Licensee, 4004 Spruce Street Corporation, was cited for two violations: sales to minors and allowing minors to frequent. At the hearing, the frequenting charge was dropped. The Administrative Law Judge (ALJ) sustained the sales to minors charge, and issued a three day suspension. This was the third violation in four years. Licensee filed a timely appeal, saying that the ALJ's decision was not supported by substantial evidence.

However, evidence showed that one minor bought a ticket to a catered event and took a prepared mixed drink from the bar without being questioned as to her age. The other minor drank an alcoholic drink that was served at her table. Thus, both minors clearly obtained alcohol from the Licensee.

The Licensee says it has a policy prohibiting minors from ever getting alcohol, so it did not happen. And even if it did happen, the Licensee did not furnish it since the minors snuck into the catered event.

Licensee's argument is, in essence, it is not our fault minors got alcohol because we did not know they were there. However, licensees are strictly liable whether they knew or should have known that a minor went in and obtained alcohol. It is the Licensee's responsibility.

Chief Counsel's Office recommends affirming the decision of the ALJ. The suspension has not been served by the Licensee.

Board Member Negra asked about the parents of the minors. Ms. Fox replied that she did not know. She stated that the minors were both girls, 19 and 20 years old.
