This purchase is to upgrade/replace the second-half of the EOL switches. The first half of the switches were upgraded/replaced in FY 17/18.

Inter-Agency Charges:

- (1) Department of General Services (DGS) Procurement Services (Job 917) Estimated billing of \$146,831.50 for FY 2017-18 to reimburse DGS for procurement service costs. The billing is allocated based on PLCB usage of DGS's state-wide contracts and purchasing cards. The PLCB's portion represents slightly more than 1.5% of DGS's total billed amount of \$9.56 million to Commonwealth agencies.
- (2) **Department of Auditor General (AG)** This billing is for \$659,450.49 from the Auditor General's Office for the fourth quarter of FY 2017-18. The billing is based on the actual AG services (audit hours) for April and May/2018 and estimated hours for June/2018. This brings the total FY 2017-18 AG billings to \$2,910,908 for a \$158,474 (-5%) decrease from last years billings.

The Bureau of Financial Management and Analysis has reviewed these charges and determined that they are reasonable based on billing methodology and previous experience.
