### **PUBLIC MEETING - 11:00 A.M**

Board Secretary John K. Stark indicated that a quorum of the Board was present and Chairman Holden called the meeting to order.

### **NEW BUSINESS**

(1) Proposed Policy Change

On-Premises Consumption of Beer and Wine

Motion Made: Chairman Holden
Seconded: Board Member Isenhour

The question presented is whether the Board should adopt a policy that requires R licensees to sell wine and malt or brewed beverages for on-premises consumption.

Chief Counsel Rodrigo Diaz explained that the potential policy change in question arose in part as a result of cases involving Sheetz, Inc. The Pennsylvania Supreme Court ruled that eating place liquor (E) licensees that sell malt and brewed beverages for off-premises consumption must also sell malt and brewed beverages for on-premises consumption. Chief Counsel Diaz further explained that the Board has never adopted a policy that would extend to restaurant liquor (R) licensees the Supreme Court's on-premises sales requirement for E licensees. With the advent of wine expanded permits, more R licensees have inquired about requirements for on-premises consumption, which is generally conceded to be a "grey area" of the law since the specific issue is not addressed in the Liquor Code, the PLCB's Regulations or by case law. It was noted that Advisory Opinions have been issued stating that R licensees are not legally required to have on-premises consumption.

Board Member Negra stated he believes it is not within the Board's purview to demand onpremises consumption and that doing so could give rise to situations which may affect public safety. Board Member Negra also advocated for allowing market conditions to prevail in this matter. Board Member Negra made a motion to not require on-premises consumption for R license holders and indicated that he would prefer to allow licensees the ability to create their own policies. That motion was not seconded.

Chairman Holden moved to require R licensees to sell for on-premises consumption the same alcohol products that are sold for off-premises consumption. Chairman Holden stated that there have been enforcement issues related to the lack of clarity regarding this matter, which statement which was verified by Major Scott Miller of the Bureau of Liquor Control Enforcement. Major Miller noted that there have been seven adjudications in the past year against R licensees for not offering on-premises consumption.

Chief Counsel Diaz indicated that licensees could use Advisory Opinions dedicated to onpremises consumption requirements as a defense in particular situations, although this has never actually occurred. Board Member Negra referred to grey areas associated with these citations and cases involving protests, citing the need for future discussions. Chairman Holden responded by affirming the necessity of handling such matters on a case-by-case basis.

Board Member Negra asked Chief Counsel Diaz to clarify the policy and provide more detail so that expectations are clear to licensees and the Bureau of Liquor Control Enforcement. Chief Counsel Diaz confirmed that his office would draft guidance related to an updated policy as necessary. Following comments from Board Member Isenhour that Act 39 should have given more options, she stated that there should be a reasonable presumption that an entity which obtains an R license will operate as a restaurant and acknowledged the responsibilities of the Bureau of Liquor Control Enforcement, Board Member Isenhour seconded the motion made by Chairman Holden. The discussion was concluded with an acknowledgement of two affirmative votes and one negative vote having been made.
