Software is to be implemented on the new E-Commerce platform to redesign email acquisition modal including advanced email segmentation as well as the following new services: shopping cart abandonment emails; product recommendations in emails; and, Listrak exchange to integrate Listrak sign-up with social platforms and product inventory alerts. Procured via DGS Contract #44000018548 – VENDOR: CDW-G – TERM: Three years – \$356,020.74 estimated cost.
- (2) Senior Business Subject Matter Experts Staff Augmentation Provide a block of hours for Adobe subject matter expert(s) to continue with the development of the new E-Commerce site using Adobe Assets and Sites Cloud-based software. Also continue working on the development and integration of the Tierney/Genuine Marketing related deliverables into the new site. Similar functionality to the existing E-Commerce site will be developed in the new site as well. This includes but is not limited to; a more streamlined checkout process, improved search functionality, shop by store, automation of inventory for the E-Commerce fulfillment center in conjunction with our Store Inventory Management system, adding address verification, integration of our Retail Promotions, a new mobile application and other work prioritized by Marketing.

Procured via DGS Contract #4400014660 – VENDOR: **OST, Inc.** – TERM: Five months for the period 4/01/2019 through 8/31/2019 – **\$615,452.22 estimated cost.** 

(3) Trintech ReconNET Retail Reconciliation Solution – ReconNET is the retail industry's leading reconciliation solution for daily reconciliation of POS/E-Commerce sales, including workflow driven "research" functionality to track/resolve discrepancies with the store/bank/credit card processor. Dataflow services pull bank and credit card data files daily and loading these files into their cloud-based reconciliation solution. SmartAnalysis is a solution to track and monitor all bank fees being charged to the PLCB by the banks that we deal with to ensure accurate billing/no overcharges for services to take place. Allows average of 250K transactions to be processed per month and pulls from 55 banks and 4 credit card processors.

Procured via DGS Contract #4400018548 – VENDOR: **CDW-G** – TERM: 36 months – **\$570,978.00 estimated cost** (Subscription \$151,120.00 per year for three-year total of \$453,360.00 and one-time Deployment and Activation fee of \$117,618.00). Contract documents including the software licensing agreements have not yet been negotiated with Trintech. This is expected to take

Several weeks. Furthermore, once documents are fully agreed between the parties, approval must be obtained from OA/COPPAR before a Purchase Order can be routed.
