Rescission of Conditional

Licensing Agreement

Chief Counsel Rodrigo Diaz explained that Licensee had been cited primarily for utilizing a barter system through which alcohol was provided as compensation for services. He noted that Licensee waived the right to a hearing following the issuance of a citation by the Bureau of Liquor Control Enforcement for selling alcohol on credit and furnishing alcohol as compensation. The Administrative Law Judge determined that sales of alcohol on credit had not in fact been occurring since alcohol was only made available as a form of compensation after services had been provided. The Bureau of Liquor Control Enforcement, having acknowledged an issue with the citation's verbiage, filed an appeal of the decision to partially dismiss the citation. Chief Counsel Diaz recommended sustaining the Administrative Law Judge's decision since the activity which was the basis for the citation in question had been adequately summarized in Count Two.
