specific PLCB Fine Wine & Good Spirits stores throughout Philadelphia on a daily basis in order to have a more effective and meaningful crime deterrent environment.

Procured via PO 63019484 Option Year Three – VENDOR: **Philadelphia City** – TERM: One year for period 1/01/2023 through 12/31/2023 - **\$556,000.00**. This requested estimated amount of \$556,000.00 will be added to the carried over from the previous years' amount of \$300,000 for a total estimated cost of \$856,000 for option year three.

(3) Microsoft Enterprise Azure – Additional funds required to pay for services through the end of May 2023 due to the delay in Release 2. The plan is to reduce our use of Azure once Release 2 goes live.

(4) Hearing Examiner Services – Represent the Board in the capacity of a hearing examiner.

(5) **Display Racks** - The racks will be used by PLCB Fine Wine & Good Spirits Stores to display product packaged in 50ml containers. The popularity of smaller-sized products continues to grow with consumers. These racks will be used to growing sales by creating a convenient and accessible shopping experience for our top 50ml items.

Procured via IFB #270008 – VENDOR: One Source Industries - \$105,053.00 estimated cost.

(6) **HVAC Service Renewal** – Provide unit inspections, preventative maintenance and corrective service to heating, ventilation and air conditioning system located withing the Northwest Office Building.

Procured via PO 63021819 Option Year One – VENDOR: Enginuity LLC - TERM: One year for period 1/1/2023 through 12/31/2023 - \$52,000.00 estimated cost.

# Inter-Agency Charges:

(1) Department of Auditor General – FY 2022-23 first quarter net billing of \$925,690.04 from the Department of the Auditor General. The billing includes a "true-up" adjustment of \$3,606.23 for an under-billing on the estimated FY 2021-22 Q4 billing. The charge for FY 2022-23 Q1 services is \$922,083.81 and is \$240,200.88 (+35%) more than last year's billing, mostly due to an extra payroll in the Q1 billing this year and the contractual pay increases in August.

The Bureau of Financial Management and Analysis has reviewed these charges and determined that they are reasonable based on billing methodology and previous experience.
