Resolution of Appeal Pending in the Court of Common Pleas Board Member Isenhour asked Chief Counsel Rod Diaz for background. Chief Counsel Diaz explained that the Board had refused this licensee's renewal application under the parameters of the Nuisance Bar Program. After taking an appeal to the Court of Common Pleas of Allegheny County, the licensee is now offering to resolve the matter through a Conditional Licensing Agreement under which they would transfer the license to a *bona fide* third party. Additionally, there would be conditions placed on that location should the new owner chose to use that same location, and conditions would also include required security cameras and security controls. Chief Counsel Diaz said that his office recommended that the Board accept the proposed resolution via a conditional licensing agreement.

Board Member Isenhour asked Chief Counsel Rod Diaz for explanation. Chief Counsel Diaz explained that this Citation was issued by BLCE for providing alcohol to a minor and Clean Indoor Air Act violations. BLCE had sent a decoy into the establishment, which decoy was successful in purchasing alcohol. The licensee admits that the underage sale took place as cited. The Licensee wants the Board to take into consideration some of the safeguards they have since instituted to prevent these types of sales. Chief Counsel Diaz explained to the Board that it can only consider the mitigating factor of whether the licensee was presented with a valid ID and that ID was checked. The licensee did not do that in this case. Mr. Diaz said that ALJ properly sustained the citation and his office recommended that the Board affirm the ALJ.
