NEW BUSINESS

(1) Adoption of Advisory Notice No. 9 (14th Revision)

Amendment of Advisory Notice

Board Member Isenhour called on Chief Counsel Rodrigo Diaz to offer an explanation of the proposed changes. Mr. Diaz explained that distributors and importing distributors are prohibited from engaging in any other business unless approved by the Board. Historically, the Board has used Advisory Notice No. 9 to provide information to distributors and importing distributors regarding a list of items that are approved for sale. Usually, the Board updates this Advisory Notice when adding an item.

In this case, this adoption clarifies that products containing Delta 8 THC as a additive can be sold if the product is already on the approved list. This revision adds a new subsection, which explains that sales of a product containing Delta 8 THC which is already on the list of approved items is permitted, so long as the product is not making any health claims. Mr. Diaz explained that the Pennsylvania Department of Agriculture was consulted and agreed that products containing Delta 8 THC are permissible to sell. Chairman Holden asked if there were any concerns from the Bureau of Liquor Control Enforcement and Mr. Diaz stated there were none.

PUBLIC COMMENT

The Board has reserved 10 minutes for public comment.

Ms. Patti Smith, representing Rock the Capital, opened her remarks by reading sections of the Sunshine Act that outline the purpose of the Act and what governmental entities fall under its jurisdiction. Ms. Smith further read sections of the Frequently Asked Questions page from the Office of Open Records website, including a definition of "deliberation." Ms. Smith then opined that the Board did not engage in a single deliberation today, even when there was not a unanimous vote to approve the revision of Advisory Notice No. 9. Ms. Smith expressed her position that the court cases previously mentioned by Chief Counsel Rod Diaz referencing quasi-judicial exceptions do not apply to the Board, and shared that she called the Office of Open Records, and the Office explained to her that "quasi-judicial" is not the same as "judicial." Mr. Diaz agreed that those two terms have different meanings.

Ms. Smith then discussed the salary of Mr. Diaz, opining that he tells that Board that it is compliant with the Sunshine Act when in fact it is not, as he does not want to endanger his job or pension. Ms. Smith then listed the salaries of the Board Members and a contract that Member Isenhour was awarded as a lobbyist, asserting that while they make a comfortable living, they are taking livelihoods away from licensees in a cold, callous manner.

Ms. Smith claimed to have received multiple calls from attorneys representing licensees expressing concerns about the Liquor Control Board, but did not go into specifics. Ms. Smith referenced the March 22, 2023 meeting in which a discussion between Attorney Frank Sluzis and the Board occurred regarding license number R-5634 and the conditions placed on the license. Ms. Smith questioned why the Board would place the burden on the licensee to maintain security at this location while they do not mandate security at other licensed locations in the area.

Chairman Holden then spoke on behalf of the Board and said that they have full faith in Chief Counsel Diaz and his determination that they are compliant with the Sunshine Act. Chairman Holden then asked Mr. Diaz if he wished to make any remarks. Mr. Diaz offered that his opinion on the Sunshine Act has not changed and, at this time, he and Ms. Smith disagree. Chairman Holden then asked if either Member Isenhour or Member Vulakovich wished to speak. Member Isenhour declined.

Member Vulakovich proceeded to make remarks. He stated that his reason for voting "no" regarding the revision to Advisory Notice No. 9 earlier in the meeting was because he did not know enough about Delta 8 THC to make an informed decision, noting that he voted in favor of medical marijuana while in the Senate after doing extensive research on the topic. He also mentioned that the other Board Members have been considering this topic much longer than he has and have more experience deciding on this topic. Ms. Smith interjected that her point is that explaining his reasoning in open dialogue may have swayed the other Board Members' decision.

Member Vulakovich then asked why Ms. Smith discussed the salaries of the Board and Chief Counsel as they do not have bearing on the Sunshine Act. Ms. Smith responded that she discussed the salaries as a way of showing how "out of touch" the Board is in making decisions on licenses that affect the owners' ability to make a living. Ms. Smith continued by discussing a case from the prior board meeting in which,

in her opinion, the Board is not considering relevant facts of the case. Chairman Holden stated that the license in question was held so further discussions with the licensee could take place.

Member Vulakovich spoke generally about conditional licensing agreements, noting that the Board is trying to strike a balance between public safety and allowing a license owner the ability to operate. Ms. Smith again referenced license number R-5634 in stating "they are no longer a bar but operate just as a restaurant" and the Board is not considering their current circumstances. Chairman Holden interjected that the Board is provided recommendations and materials prior to the public meetings from the Hearing Examiner, the Director of Regulatory Affairs and the Chief Counsel's Office. The Board reviews the cases prior to the meeting in efforts to make their decision. Mr. Diaz explained that the Board does this under their quasijudicial authority. Ms. Smith again disagreed and reiterated that she believes the Board does not have quasijudicial authority.

Mr. Peter Laurenzano spoke on behalf of license number R-18821. Mr. Laurenzano stated he supports the Sunshine Act and that he does not believe the Board is transparent. Further, Mr. Laurenzano stated that he wishes he was able to address the Board at the time of his hearing rather than a Hearing Examiner. Chief Counsel Diaz offered that the Liquor Code statutorily obligates hearings to take place before a Hearing Examiner and not the Board.

Mr. Laurenzano continued speaking, beginning to address the merits of his particular case. Mr. Diaz attempted to stop Mr. Laurenzano from speaking as the matter is in active litigation, as has repeatedly been explained at prior public Board meetings. When Mr. Laurenzano continued discussing his pending case, Mr. Diaz eventually asked for Mr. Laurenzano's microphone to be turned off. Mr. Diaz informed Mr. Laurenzano that because he is represented by legal counsel, Mr. Diaz is forbidden from addressing Mr. Laurenzano. When Mr. Laurenzano attempted to waive that condition, Mr. Diaz clarified that the duty not to speak with Mr. Laurenzano about pending litigation with a represented licensee is on him as Chief Counsel for the Board. Thus, Mr. Laurenzano could not waive Mr. Diaz's professional obligation.

Mr. Laurenzano asked if he could ask general questions. Mr. Diaz stated that as long as the questions did not address his pending litigation, he could do so. Mr. Laurenzano preceded to ask several questions pertaining to safekeeping fees that Mr. Diaz answered in general terms. However, as Mr. Laurenzano continued to speak, Mr. Diaz and Chairman Holden stated that they cannot continue since this conversation is clearly discussing the pending litigation. Mr. Laurenzano expressed his desire for transparency from the Board, due process, and open deliberations during meetings, and improved communication before ending his comments.

NEXT BOARD MEETING

The next meeting of the PLCB will be a formal meeting on Wednesday, April 19, 2023 beginning at 11:00 A.M. Prior to the public meeting, there will be an Executive Session to discuss matters of personnel and to engage in non-deliberative informational discussions, some of which are regarding actions and matters which have been approved at previous public meetings.
