# ANNOUNCEMENT OF EXECUTIVE SESSIONS

As explained in the printed Meeting Agenda, certain matters being presented for "official action" at today's meeting have been discussed during Executive Sessions held prior to today's meeting as permitted by the Sunshine Act.

## **PUBLIC COMMENT**

Jake Sitler from Endo Café/Endo Productions appeared before the Board to advocate for the inclusion of Delta-9 THC products in Advisory Notice No. 9 and read from a prepared statement. The full statement is available at the end of the minutes.

Chairman Holden addressed Mr. Sitler that at two prior Board meetings, he and Member Isenhour had approved the sale of products containing Delta-8 THC but after consultation with the Pennsylvania State Police, had reversed their decision.

Chief Counsel Rod Diaz further added that the State Police reached out to the PLCB and informed the Board that the sale of any cannaboid under state law is of questionable legality. Therefore, the Board's prior approvals put licensees at possible risk for criminal prosecution which is something the Board did not wish to do. Mr. Diaz recommended that Mr. Sitler discuss this matter with the State Police.

Mr. Sitler responsed that he has spoken with State Police, Bureau of Liquor Control Enforcement Deputy Chief Counsel Christopher Herrington who put the issue back on the Board. Mr. Sitler insisted that the State Police did not consider Delta-9 THC an illegal substance.

Mr. Diaz offered that the Board will reach out to the State Police to have further discussions on the matter.

Shauna Boscaccy, representating Wine PA, read from a prepared statement. The full statement is available at the end of the minutes.

Chairman Holden briefly touched on a few issues Ms. Boscaccy raised. He noted that PA Proud is a PLCB program, where PA Preferred is a program managed by the Department of Agriculture and applies to numerous products. He stated that Warehouse consolidation took place two years ago and was concerned to hear that issues are still occurring. Chairman Holden also explained that delisting follows a formula and no winery or distillery is given preferential treatment over any others.

Chairman Holden stated that the issues raised from Ms. Boscaccy's statement are numerous and that it might be best to have a direct meeting with Wine PA to discuss the issues. Chairman Holden asked Secretary Vigoda to coordinate the meeting.

FlashCore Modules (FCM) will provide adequate free storage to accommodate the necessary level of snapshots. SFP 10Gbps copper transceivers and copper CAT7 cables will enable 10Gbps replication via Fiber Channel over IP (FCIP) from the FS7200 disk array @ EDC to the FS7300

disk array @ NWOB. SFP 10Gbps fiber transceivers and various fiber cables will allow additional SAN/server connectivity as required for future server/appliance additions as well as various cable lengths for appropriate rack wiring.

## Inter-Agency Charges:

(1) **Department of Auditor General** – FY 2022-23 fourth quarter billing of \$783,065.38 from the Department of the Auditor General. The charge for FY 2022-23 Q4 services are \$12,521.25 (+1.6%) more than last year's Q4 estimated billing. The total FY 2022-23 billings are \$3.34 million or \$576 thousand (+20.9%) more than last year, primarily due to a higher audit rate (+12%) and a higher audit costs (+8%).

The Bureau of Financial Management and Analysis has reviewed these charges and determined that they are reasonable based on billing methodology and previous experience.

Chairman Holden asked Deputy Executive Director Elizabeth Brassell for an explanation as to Procurement item number 3.

Ms. Brassell offered that this item is an extension a of contract that first became effective after a competitive procurement process in 2021. Grant Thornton was selected as project manager for the ongoing enterprise resource planning project. The initial term of the contract was through September 2023. This exercises 12 months of a total 18 month option to extend the contract and funds it through August 2024. Additionally, within the past year Grant Thorton was purchased by Guidehouse Inc., hence the name change. All terms and conditions of the contract remain the same.

#### **Comments of Jake Sitler:**

Afternoon! My name is Jake Sitler and I'm the owner of endo cafe and Endo productions. Since the passing of the farm bill in 2018 we've worked on developing hemp derived products and destignatizing the plant through an approachable avenue in downtown Lancaster city. I've also worked with the department of agriculture via their hemp steering committee to act as a representative for brands/farmers trying to enter this market.

Recently I've received state funding and approval through our district attorneys office to produce hemp derived beverages containing delta 9 the at .3% per dry weight. I've spent the past two years working on a patented powder formula and am waiting to launch throughout distributors in our state. However, I've been unable to easily sell my products via distributors in this state due to the confusing rulings and indecisiveness of this Board.

Therefore the reason I'm here today is for one I'd like to set straight as to the legality of delta 9 the being the naturally forming molecule in the hemp plant. And two I'd like the PLCB to consider a quick resolution to the confusion of their advisory notices.

As you're aware the PLCB has amended the advisory notice a few times now in regards to hemp derived products. The biggest issue was when delta 8 was put on the notice. It's clear with district attorneys around the state there is confusion with delta 8 and it's legality. However that is NOT the case with hemp derived delta 9. As I mentioned earlier my district attorney approved state funding for low dose delta 9 the production.

While I understand the PLCB needs to protect the consumer and wants to make sure this product is legal. I've been made aware not enough steps have not been taken to confirm its legality. I've worked intimately with dept of ag and I know it's their stance that cbd and delta 9 the are legal molecules. Therefore I ask the PLCB to reach out to the governors office and the dept of ag for reassurance, as this market trend is critical for our commonwealth.

As a small business owner I've invested a significant amount of our life savings into growing this sector of business and am positioned to be the first craft beverage of its kind in Pennsylvania. Behind me in this movement is the weight of the beer alliance and the brewers association who all want these types of products added to advisory 9.

I would like to offer myself as a sounding board for the PLCB to help connect the avenues to assure the legality of these products. I cannot overstate how much tax revenue this product will produce and how 21 plus beer stores are the perfect avenue for regulation of these beverages.

On the back end I've also been meeting with state legislators who plan to regulate to 21 plus, provide label guidelines, and propose a specific tax, but in the meantime getting out in front of this with the PLCB will allow the potential for one of the fastest growing sectors in the beer stores in a decade. I will work with every single beer distributor in this state who will require certificate analysis and certain standards assuring legality of each products they carry before the sale.

I again ask the PLCB not to cripple this industry any longer, and prohibit a product that is legally allowed to enter interstate commerce from a federal and state perspective.

Endo Cafe / Endo Productions

#### **Comments of Shauna Boscaccy:**

Good morning. Thank you kindly for the opportunity to speak on behalf of Wine Pennsylvania, which provides legislative representation in Harrisburg for the benefit of the over 300 wineries in Pennsylvania.

In light of comments presented at the last Board Meeting about issues with inventory and the Pennsylvania Preferred Process in general, Wine PA wanted to take the time to bring a few similar issues to light.

The PA Preferred Wine Program has assisted in growing the Pennsylvania Wine industry, and we appreciate the partnership which has developed between the PLCB, the Fine Wine and Good Sprits, and Pennsylvania wineries. This benefits all levels within the three-tier system. We would also like to highlight some confusion which is currently existing with the new program – PA Proud. We would request some clarification regarding what this program is, and how it differs from PA Preferred, and whether PA Preferred is still the program in which wineries are able to list product.

One issue Pennsylvania wineries are currently facing is warehouse inventory shortages. There remains a shortage of product within the warehouses, with many product SKUs falling to 0, which has led to a shortage of product in Fine Wine and Spirits stores. The catalyst to this issue seems to have begun during the warehouse consolidation. Products were not purchased during consolidation, which led to many products not being available for sale over the important holiday season. Many products were not being purchased adequately to properly restock the warehouse, after consolidation, and this issue continued through the spring. With procurement once again shut off to switch to the new software system, local stores continue to run out of products. Due to the continuing issues the software switch, our products are not being purchased adequately to ensure shelves in local stores have product.

Wine PA is also concerned about marketing, as the stores have put notes on the shelves noting the vendor is having supply issues. This is not the case, as not enough product has been ordered to restock the shelves after the warehouse move and software change. Local stores have even called asking wineries directly

inquiring if products had been discontinued. We wanted to bring this to your attention to ensure our shared customers have the correct information regarding our product and inventory.

Most detrimental to our wineries, this significant decline in procurement and storage has had led to records showing a decline of sales, putting all of these products at the risk of delisting by the PLCB. Many wineries have received delist letters stating products are not going to be purchased due to a decline in sales. We would respectfully request the PLCB look at records of procurement, before well-selling items are delisted due to lack of product being available in the warehouse and Fine Wine and Good Spirits stores.

We wanted to take this opportunity to highlight some of the pains we have had and are still currently experiencing through not only warehouse consolidation, but also through the new software transition. We would like to work with the PLCB in any capacity to ensure wines are not delisted without a review of what actual sales would reflect without the procurement issues. We are also happy to continue to work in any capacity to ensure warehouses are stores are efficiently stocked so products are available to be sold.

We appreciate all of your time this morning as we bring to light Wine PA's current concerns and look forward to continuing to work with the Pennsylvania Liquor Control Board.
